The following is a summary of our progress on the subject projects for the month of January 2008.

#### **Project Management:**

#### **General GEC**

- Prepared contract correspondence and monthly GEC progress report.
- Prepared & submitted CCRMA GEC Invoice No. 19 for work performed on Work Authorization No. 5 (FM 509)
- HNTB developed Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 12 (SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access additional services).
- HNTB attended meeting on January 9, 2008 with CCRMA and subconsultant to discuss options for CCRMA projects.
- HNTB attended meeting on January 11, 2008 with CCRMA and TxDOT to discuss CCRMA projects.
- Updated and submitted December 2007 GEC work authorization status report.

North Rail Relocation Project (Work Authorization No. 4)

North Rail Relocation Project relocates the exiting and operating freight rail lines away from incorporated and unincorporated areas of Cameron County, Texas, in particular in and around Harlingen, Texas. An effective relocation of the existing freight rail facility will not only improve freight rail operations to and from the US/Mexico border, but may aid in the enhancement of air quality for the area, improve the safety of the traveling public with regard to the freight rail/passenger interface, improve the response time of emergency vehicles, minimize if not eliminate the transport of hazardous material via freight rail through towns, improve traffic congestion, and ultimately enhance the economic development of the region.

- This work authorization has been completed. No activities to report for this month.
- Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 4 (North Rail Relocation) was resubmitted to CCRMA.
- HNTB waiting on Notice to Proceed.

FM 509 Project (Work Authorization No. 5)

The FM 509 project is a relief route around the north and east areas of the City of Harlingen that would construct FM 509, in Cameron County, from US 77 to the Intersection with FM 508. The proposed facility would consist of a four-lane roadway with directions of travel separated by a center median. Dependent upon traffic projections, an interim facility with fewer lanes may initially be constructed. Interchanges or grade separations would be constructed at major thoroughfares. As proposed, the right-of-way would be 300-feet (usual) wide and sufficient to accommodate future transportation needs; however, any future improvements would be subject to environmental review. This could include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, general purpose lanes, truck lanes, or some combination of these modes.

- Project coordination.
- HNTB delivered the "historic structures" completed draft report to TxDOT ENV on August 15<sup>th</sup> for coordination/approval. TxDOT ENV has requested that the draft FM 509 EA be reviewed by the Pharr District prior to issuing final determination on the historical resources.
- TxDOT ENV determination regarding historic structures is needed to finalize the identification of the preferred alternative prior to engaging special studies for archeology.
- HNTB addressed TxDOT Pharr District comments on FM 509 Preliminary Draft EA.
- HNTB to resubmit FM 509 Preliminary Draft EA to TxDOT Pharr District.

#### West Loop Project (Work Authorization No. 7):

The proposed West Loop Road is a new location facility and will provide a four-lane controlled access expressway with interchanges and connections at strategic locations and grade separation structures for several crossing streets in Brownsville. The majority of the project alignment falls within or in the vicinity of the existing Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way. Negotiations are underway to relocate the railroad and donate the right-of-way to the county for the project.

#### Project Management (145):

- "STOP WORK" was issued on November 16, 2007.
- HNTB was authorized to "RESTART WORK" on January 21, 2008.
- HNTB updated Project Schedule.
- HNTB submitted Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1. This Supplemental Work Authorization included Public Involvement and Environmental work.

#### West Rail Relocation Project (Work Authorization No. 8):

This Work Authorization provides appropriate subconsultant(s) for staff coordination with the Mexican agencies to monitor and determine project schedules, permit requirements, funding technical agreements and design for the West Rail Relocation around Brownsville, Texas. The project plans will require approval by Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes (SCT), Comisión Internacional de Limites Y Aguas (CILA) and Kansas City Southern Mexico (KCSM).

- HNTB submitted Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 8 to extend the West Rail Project effective January 2, 2008 to June 30, 2008.
- Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 8 was approved and executed by CCRMA on January 28, 2008.

- Arturo de las Fuentes Hernandez attended the 16<sup>th</sup> Reunion of the Technical Group on Friday, December 2007.
- Arturo de las Fuentes Hernandez attended a meeting on January 14, 2008 with Lic. Federico Gutierrez Soria, Projects Financial Director from Nacional Financiera to discuss the cost-benefit study in order to incorporate the project to the registration of the Investments Unit from the Treasury and Public Credit Secretariat.
- Arturo de las Fuentes Hernandez attended a meeting on January 15, 2008 with Joe Galvan, President of the B&M International Bridge and Consul Victor Manuel Trevino to discuss the financial information of the bridge.
- Arturo de las Fuentes Hernandez attended a meeting on January 16, 2008 with Directive Board from Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority to discuss the progress on the International Railway Project Brownsville Matamoros Western Alternative.
- Arturo de las Fuentes Hernandez attended a reunion on Monday, January 21, 2008 with C.P. Alfredo Roman Gonzalez Hernandez, Economic Development and Employment Secretary from the Government of Tamaulipas to discuss railway alignment and construction schedule.

#### South Padre Island Second Causeway (Work Authorization No. 10):

This work authorization provides for the initiation of project development by authorizing the preparation of a comprehensive Project Development Plan and the undertaking of specific actions required under Section 6002 of the Safe Accountable Flexible Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) to include a project initiation letter, project coordination plan and preliminary need and purpose statement with support documentation.

- HNTB addressed TxDOT ENV comments on the Need and Purpose and Coordination Plan.
- All tasks have been completed for this Work Authorization.

#### East Loop Pass Through Financing (Work Authorization No. 11):

The project, termed as the East Loop, is currently identified as three sections. Section I begins at the intersection of US 77 (North of Brownsville) and FM 511 in Olmito and continues east along FM 511 to SH 48 (near the Port of Brownsville). This section is currently under design through a TxDOT consultant as a four (4) lane divided section that will ultimately be frontage roads to a six (6) lane divided section for truck and passenger traffic. Section II continues from SH 48 at FM 511 east and then south to SH 4 (Boca Chica Boulevard). This section is currently a TxDOT project and is in the Environmental and Preliminary Schematic stage. Section III continues southbound from SH 4 near the southeast corner of Brownsville and ends at the entrance of the Veterans International Bridge on US 77. This section is currently in the Environmental and Preliminary Schematic stage. Sections II and III are currently identified as a four (4) lane divided section.

- HNTB received comments from TxDOT on the East Loop Pass Through Financing Application on January 11, 2008.
- HNTB met with Pete Sepulveda Jr. for next steps on East Loop.

#### South Padre Island Second Access (Work Authorization No. 12):

This work authorization provides engineering and environmental services associated with the development and advancement of the National Environmental Policy Act

(NEPA) process for the proposed South Padre Island (SPI) 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project. The tasks associated with the project will include the development of the necessary environmental documentation, corridor alternatives assessments and related public involvement activities.

#### Route and Design Studies (110):

- "STOP WORK" was issued on November 16<sup>th</sup>
- HNTB was authorized to "RESTART WORK" on January 21st.
- HNTB is assisting in expediting the RESTART of this project with TxDOT and CCRMA staff.
- HNTB prepared Cash Flow schedules and Performance Graphs for various Project Scenarios.
- HNTB continues to communicate with TxDOT officials in an attempt to expedite the project restart.
- HNTB submitted agency coordination letters for internal review.
- HNTB update project schedule.
- HNTB continued to collect existing data.

#### **Consultant Management:**

Continued ongoing coordination with all subconsultants.

#### **Agency Coordination:**

 Conducted ongoing discussions with CCRMA staff, TxDOT staff, TTA staff and subconsultants for preparation of 2<sup>nd</sup> Access, West Loop Project and West Rail Project.

V. CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL TO AUTHORIZING SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 1 TO WORK AUTHORIZATION NO. 4 EXTENDING TIME ON THE NORTH RAIL PROJECT WITH HNTB

Mr. Bobby Balli noted that the effective date would change from September 15, 2007 to July 15, 2008.

Upon motion by Director Gallegos, seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously, the supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 4 extending time on the North Rail Project with HNTB was approved, as recommended by Mr. Sepulveda.

The Agreement is as follows:

#### 4. **COMPENSATION.**

BASIS FOR COMPENSATION. The Authority agrees to pay, and the GEC agrees to accept as full and sufficient compensation and reimbursement for the performance of all services as set forth herein, such sums as are computed using (i) the actual hourly salary rates for employees in the positions/classes shown on the "Rate Schedule" attached hereto as Appendix B and made a part hereof (i.e., the hourly amounts actually paid by the GEC or its subconsultants to the indicated employees), provided that the actual hourly salary rates for employees in the positions/classes of employees shown on Appendix B may not exceed the range for such category of position/employee shown thereon, multiplied by (ii) the applicable Multiplier plus profit described in subsection 4.b. below. All eligible non-salary expenses will be reimbursed at direct cost without multiplier. The resulting amounts shall constitute full payment for all services, liaisons, products, materials, and equipment required to deliver the services including those detailed in the Scope of Services, together with overhead and, except as described in subsection 4.d below, anticipated travel and expenses. On or before September 1 of each year the GEC may present proposed adjustments in hourly rates to the Authority. No adjustments will be approved or implemented without the written consent of the Authority. No other compensation will be requested or paid. The applicable overhead factor will be adjusted up or down according to the GEC's audited FAR overhead rate only as described in subsection 4.c. below.

- b. THE MULTIPLIER. The applicable multiplier for all GEC employees providing services under this Agreement shall be 1.4879 (the "Multiplier"). Currently, it is anticipated that there will be only one multiplier used by the parties. However, in the event that the GEC employees or subconsultants work in facilities owned or leased by the Authority the multiplier for such employees or subconsultants shall be adjusted downward to reflect the Authority's burden of overhead associated with such employees or subconsultants and the corresponding relief from overhead obligations for such employees and subconsultants to the GEC. Any such adjustments will be agreed upon by the Authority and the GEC, effective as of such time as the GEC employees or subconsultants begin working in facilities owned or leased by the Authority.
- c. <u>Computation and Adjustment of the Multiplier</u>. The negotiated Multiplier for this Agreement was determined by utilizing the GEC's auditable overhead rate as allowed under the provisions of 48 C.F.R. Part 31, Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR 31). The GEC represents that at all times throughout the term of this Agreement, that the Standard Multiplier shall not exceed either (i) the GEC's auditable overhead rate determined in accordance with said Regulations, or (ii) the multiplier utilized by the GEC in its agreements with the Texas Department of Transportation. For the purposes of this Agreement, the initial Multiplier is based upon an overhead rate of 1.4879 times direct labor cost, plus fifteen percent (15%) for profit, for a Multiplier of 2.8611 times direct labor cost (computed as follows: (1+1.4879 x 1.150).

The Multiplier will be adjusted up or down according to the GEC's audited FAR overhead rate for the preceding year, with the first such adjustment occurring as of January 1, 2007 and, thereafter, as of each subsequent January 1 during the term of this Agreement. The profit factor shall not be adjusted thereafter absent written agreement of the parties, including approval of the Authority's board of directors.

EXPENSES. As indicated above, the compensation computed in d. accordance with subsections 4.a. and b. is anticipated by the Authority and the GEC to be full and sufficient compensation and reimbursement for the services, and includes all customary out-of-pocket expenses anticipated to result from the GEC's performance under the Agreement that are included in the computation of the FAR overhead rate, such as office supplies, telecommunications systems, postage, photocopying, computer hardware/software and service charges, and similar costs. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the GEC shall be entitled to reimbursement for reasonable out-of-pocket expenses actually incurred by the GEC that are necessary for the performance of its duties under this Agreement and which are not included in the FAR overhead rate, said expenses being limited to travel costs, printing costs, automobile expenses being reimbursed at the federal mileage rates for travel originating from the office of the GEC employee or subconsultant, and other expenses directly approved, in advance, by the Authority. Except for automobile expenses paid at the federal mileage rate and travel paid at state approved rates (if available), all such reimbursement shall be at one-hundred percent (100%) of the actual cost thereof paid by the GEC to

unaffiliated entities; provided, however, that all amounts in excess of \$1,500 for which the GEC intends to seek reimbursement pursuant to this subsection 4.d. must be approved in advance and in writing by the Authority, except when such advance approval is impractical due to a bona fide emergency situation. The Authority shall not reimburse the GEC for travel, lodging, and similar expenses incurred by the GEC to bring additional staff to its local office or to otherwise reassign personnel to provide basic engineering support of the GEC's performance of the services, provided, however, that the Authority shall reimburse, but only in accordance with the terms of this subsection 4.d., such costs incurred by the GEC to bring to its local office or the Authority's facilities, with advance approval by the Authority, staff with specialized skills or expertise required for the services and not customarily available from a staff providing general consulting civil engineering services of the type described in this agreement. The GEC shall take all reasonable steps to acquire all goods and services subject to reimbursement by the Authority under this Agreement on a tax-free basis pursuant to the Authority's tax-exempt status described in subsection 4 i.

e. <u>Non-compensable Time</u>. Time spent by the GEC's employees or subconsultants to perform services or functions capable of being carried out by other, subordinate personnel with a lower hourly rate shall be billed at a rate equivalent to that of the applicable qualified subordinate personnel. Time spent by the GEC's personnel or subconsultants in an administrative or supervisory capacity not related to the performance of the services shall not be compensable.

Time spent on services that is in excess of what would reasonably be considered appropriate for the performance of such services shall not be compensable.

f. INVOICES AND RECORDS. The GEC shall submit two (2) copies of its monthly invoices certifying the salaries and expenses incurred in providing the services under this Agreement during the previous month, and shall also present a reconciliation of monthly invoices and the work authorization (and related estimates) to which the services relate. The invoice shall be in a form directly acceptable to TxDOT for potential reimbursement by TxDOT to the Authority. Each invoice shall be in such detail as is required by the Authority and TxDOT, including a breakdown of services provided on a project-by-project basis and/or pursuant to specified work authorizations, together with other services requested by the Authority. Upon request of the Authority, the GEC shall also submit certified time and expense records and copies of invoices that support the invoiced salary and expense figures. All books and records relating to the GEC's or subconsultants' time, out-of-pocket expenses, materials, or other services or deliverables invoiced to the Authority under this Agreement shall be made available during the GEC's normal business hours to the Authority and its representatives for review, copying and auditing throughout the term of this Agreement and for three (3) years after the expiration thereof. No compensation shall be made for revisions to the GEC's or subconsultants' services or deliverables required due in any way to the negligent error, omission, or fault of the GEC, its employees, agents, subconsultants, or contractors.

g. <u>EFFECT OF PAYMENTS</u>. No payment by the Authority shall relieve the GEC of its obligation to deliver timely the services required under this Agreement.

h. No Adjustments to Rate Schedule and Multipliers. Except as otherwise expressly provided in subsection 4.a. above (including the adjustment to the profit factor authorized on January 1, 2008, and January 1, 2009), the Authority and the GEC shall not make adjustments to the Multiplier during the term of this Agreement. The Authority and the GEC do not anticipate that any services, work, deliverables or expenses of any nature shall be undertaken or incurred by the GEC on behalf of the Authority that constitute "Extra Work" or otherwise fall outside the terms of this Agreement. Unless the parties otherwise expressly agree in writing to the contrary, all services of any nature undertaken by the GEC or its subconsultants during the term of this Agreement on behalf of the Authority shall be conclusively presumed to have been undertaken under, and be subject to, the terms of this Agreement.

i. <u>COMMERCIAL PRICING</u>. Federal Acquisition Regulations allow for payment of direct auditable expenditures and commercial pricing of certain products. The GEC may engage in commercial pricing when legally permissible, not in contravention of federal regulations, and specifically approved by the Authority.
