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INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into between the CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY, hereinafter referred to as "CCRMA" and COUNTY OF CAMERON, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY" pursuant to V.T.C.A., Government Code, Chapter 791, cited as the Interlocal Cooperation Act

- 1. LOCATION OF PROJECT: Cameron County, Texas
- 2. PROJECT TO BE COMPLETED: To provide engineering and design services for the West Rail Relocation Project.
- 3. The funds for the above-mentioned work will be provided by Cameron County. Cameron County through TXDOT will provide funding for this scope of services. CCRMA will have its GEC perform the above-mentioned tasks.
- COUNTY will keep a current advance funding agreement with TXDOT throughout the project.
- 5. The rules, regulations and orders of CCRMA shall govern this agreement and the parties agree the CCRMA shall supervise the performance of this agreement. It is also agreed that the CCRMA has the authority to employ personnel to engage in other administrative services necessary to fulfill the terms of this agreement.
- 7. The agreement shall have no legal force or effect until such time as it is properly adopted and approved by the CCRMA and the CAMERON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT.

VI. CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF RIGHT OF ENTRY FOR THE GARCIA AND DOUGHERTY FAMILY TRACT FOR THE SAN BENITO NAVIGATION DISTRICT PORT ROAD PROJECT

PERMISSION TO ACCESS PROPERTY

This is to signify that the below signed co-tenants (hereinafter referred to as "Landowner") hereby give to Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority (CCRMA), Port Isabel – San Benito Navigation District and the City of Port Isabel and each of them individually and jointly (hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitors") and their agents and employees permission to enter upon that area of land owned by members of the Garcia and Dougherty families located in the Santa Isabel Grant, Cameron County, Texas (depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes) for the limited purpose of conducting a preliminary route study for a possible roadway. Indemnitors shall have the right to conduct a survey of the land and conduct such other studies as may be needed to determine the feasibility of the land for a contemplated roadway. Indemnitors shall have no right to excavate or otherwise disturb the surface of the land.

Where used herein, the term "Indemnified Persons" or "Released Persons" shall include the following: The Landowner (whether one or more and including all persons and entities of whatsoever nature owning an interest in the Exhibit A area whether signatories hereto or not), the Landowner's heirs, representatives, agents, employees, the respective trustees of each of the Landowners, both individually and in their capacity as partners, trustees, members of any limited liability company or other entity, their employees, invitees, contractors and agents, and their successors and assigns, including but not limited to the beneficiaries of any trust of which a trustee is a Landowner, and to the holders of any interest in the premises, by, through and under the Landowner, or interest in the mineral estate, such as grantees of easements, and Lessees under oil, gas and mineral leases.

For full and adequate consideration the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Indemnitors shall defend, indemnify, and hold the Indemnified Persons harmless for any injury, or death, to any person or damage to property or to any claim of liability for any such injury, death or damage on or about the premises arising out of the ingress to, egress from, use of, presence upon, and occupancy of the premises, INCLUDING, BUT NOT BY WAY OF LIMITATION, ANY NEGLIGENT ACT OR OMISSION OF ANY INDEMNIFIED PERSON, AND ANY ACT OR OMISSION WHICH MAY IMPOSE STRICT LIABILITY (BY STATUTE OR UNDER THE COMMON LAW) UPON ANY INDEMNIFIED PERSON, or caused by any act or omission of Indemnitors, Indemnitors' agents, servants or employees, or any other person entering upon the premises with or without permission; and Indemnitors expressly agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless any and all Indemnified Persons from any loss, expense or claim including attorney's fees (and also including attorney's fees incurred to enforce any indemnity under this agreement), arising out of, incidental to, or in anywise resulting from any such damage or injury, so caused.

INDEMNITORS' OBLIGATION TO DEFEND, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD THE INDEMNIFIED PERSONS HARMLESS SHALL APPLY WHETHER OR NOT AN

INDEMNIFIED PERSON MAY BE GUILTY OF ANY NEGLIGENT ACT OR OMISSION, OR MAY BE STRICTLY LIABLE (BY STATUTE OR UNDER THE COMMON LAW) FOR THE CONSEQUENCES OF ANY ACT OR OMISSION, WHICH RESULTED IN OR CONTRIBUTED TO THE COST, EXPENSE OR LIABILITY AGAINST WHICH INDEMNITORS ARE OBLIGATED TO INDEMNIFY THE INDEMNIFIED PERSON OR PERSONS HEREUNDER.

For full and adequate consideration the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Indemnitors release the Released Persons from liability for any damage or injury to the person or property of Indemnitors, Indemnitors' employees, agents, invitees, and licensees, which they or any of them may sustain from any and all sources or causes except where such damage or injury is exclusively caused by the willful act of such Released Persons. Indemnitors waive any consequential, punitive and exemplary damages, unless such waiver is specifically prohibited by statute. INDEMNITORS' RELEASE HEREUNDER SHALL APPLY WHETHER OR NOT THE RELEASED PERSONS MAY BE GUILTY OF ANY NEGLIGENT OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT ACT OR OMISSION, OR MAY BE STRICTLY LIABLE (BY STATUTE OR UNDER THE COMMON LAW) FOR THE CONSEQUENCE OF ANY ACT OR OMISSION, WHICH RESULTED IN OR CONTRIBUTED TO THE COST, EXPENSE OR LIABILITY OF WHICH AND FROM WHICH INDEMNITORS ARE OBLIGATED TO RELEASE THE RELEASED PERSONS HEREUNDER.

This agreement shall commence upon the execution and delivery of this Permission by Landowner and Indemnitors and shall terminate July 1, 2010; however, the indemnity and release contained herein shall survive the termination of this agreement.

If any provision of this instrument is determined to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this instrument, which shall be enforceable in accordance with its terms.

The signatories of this permission make no representation to anyone that they have the authority to act in any capacity other than for themselves individually unless stated otherwise adjacent to their signature.

The following is a summary of our progress on the subject projects for the month of March 2010.

Project Management:

General GEC

- Prepared contract correspondence and monthly GEC progress report.
- Prepared & submitted CCRMA GEC Invoice for work performed on Work Authorization Nos. 7, 8, 13,15,16,17, 21, 23, 25 and 26.
- Updated and submitted February 2010 GEC work authorization status report.
- On March 4, Richard Ridings and Eddie Garcia attended the Special Board Meeting. Mr. Ridings presented various agenda items.
- On March 30, Richard Ridings and Van Short attended a Special Board Meeting. Mr. Ridings presented various agenda items.
- On March 24, Bobby Balli and Larry Shumway conducted a tour in the Austin area with Cameron County staff Marty Pena and Franco San Miguel. Staff visited offices of Caseta, Municipal Services Bureau and TTA and were able to experience the toll integration process and witness first hand toll equipment and personnel necessary for the collection of tolls.
- On March 24, Richard Ridings conducted a financing meeting at the HNTB Austin office with Pete Sepulveda, Mike Weaver, Travis James, John Hockenyos, David Gordon, and Van Short.
- HNTB continues to attend numerous meetings and correspond with RMA staff and others to support the RMA's efforts.

FM 509 Project (Work Authorization No. 5)

The FM 509 project is a relief route around the north and east areas of the City of Harlingen that would construct an extension of FM 509, in Cameron County, from US 77 to the Intersection with FM 508. The proposed facility would consist of a four-lane roadway with directions of travel separated by a center median. Dependent upon traffic projections, an interim facility with fewer lanes may initially be constructed. Interchanges or grade separations would be constructed at major thoroughfares. As proposed, the right-of-way would be 300-feet wide (usual) and sufficient to accommodate future transportation needs; however, any future improvements would be subject to environmental review. This could include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, general purpose lanes, truck lanes, or some combination of these modes.

 TxDOT notified CCRMA this project was placed on hold due to the projected low traffic counts on the proposed 300 foot transportation corridor. TxDOT transmitted new traffic numbers. Further discussion with TxDOT is pending before continuing the environmental process for the recommended alignment of the proposed FM 509 route. HNTB is currently developing a Work Authorization for preliminary development of the Outer Parkway. This project would provide a greater economic benefit to the area and establish a corridor along similar alignment yet would continue along the North side of Cameron County to the future SPI 2nd Access. The north-south section of FM 509 would be studied once the east-west Outer Parkway is identified. FM 509 environmental studies, constraint data, Lidar survey data, and right of way information can be utilized for this endeavor.

West Parkway Project:

The proposed West Parkway is a new location facility and will provide a four-lane controlled access parkway with interchanges and connections at strategic locations and grade separation structures for several crossing streets in Brownsville. The majority of the project alignment falls within or in the vicinity of the existing Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way. Negotiations are underway to relocate the railroad and donate the right-of-way to the county for the project.

West Parkway EA/Schematic (Work Authorization No. 7):

This Work Authorization provides for the development of a Schematic and Environmental Assessment based on the project design developed by TxDOT and detailed in the value engineering report.

- Revisions to the schematic and EA due to design changes resulting from public comment and typical section changes will require additional study and design/work that is above and beyond the current scope of the approved Work Authorization.
- Detailed schematic work was on hold in March until the supplement was approved.
- SWA No. 4 to WA No. 7 was approved by the Board on March 30; thus, allowing HNTB to proceed with updates/revisions to the EA.

West Parkway Public Involvement (Work Authorization No. 18):

This Work Authorization provides community involvement services through a series of neighborhood meetings, focus group meetings, and one on one meetings to develop a two-way dialogue with the public to inform them of the need and purpose of the project and to gather their ideas on how the West Parkway can become a valuable community asset.

• This effort is complete and the contract is closed. No payment for this effort has been received.

West Rail (Work Authorization No. 16):

This Work Authorization provides additional professional services and deliverables for the West Rail Relocation project. Work includes utility coordination and evaluation, siphon extension design, DHS building site items, and surveying.

- HNTB received signed approval from USACE for the West Rail PCN (including the wetland mitigation site and plan).
- Coordination with utility owners with conflicts along the West Rail alignment is ongoing.
 HNTB has received approval from TxDOT on proof of eligibility and construction cost
 estimates for Brownsville Public Utilities Board (BPUB), AEP Transmission, and Valley
 Municipal Utility District #2 (VMUD) and have been forwarded to the County for processing.
- TransMontaigne has hired a consultant (STV) to design the adjustments along the West Rail project. A kickoff meeting with STV is scheduled for April 9th in Houston.

- Cameron County Irrigation District #6 has approved the plans for the siphons and siphon
 extension within their irrigation canal. It is anticipated that the Irrigation District will
 receive board approval in early April.
- Coordination with the Department of Homeland Security is ongoing. DHS has provided specifications for fencing and lighting along the limits of the West Rail Bridge over the Rio Grande River. HNTB is in discussions with DHS on the impacts to the railroad and bridge.

West Rail Relocation International Coordination (Work Authorization No. 8):

This Work Authorization provides appropriate subconsultant(s) for staff coordination with the Mexican agencies to monitor and determine project schedules, permit requirements, funding technical agreements and design for the West Rail Relocation around Brownsville, Texas. The project plans will require approval by Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes (SCT), Comisión Internacional de Limites Y Aguas (CILA) and Kansas City Southern Mexico (KCSM).

- After numerous meetings with the SCT, the transportation agency has approved the Rail bridge design and plans and specifications necessary for the improvements. The SCTs approval has been forwarded to the required regulatory agencies (CILA, CONAGUA, and CNA). Arturo de las Fuentes assisted the SCT in facilitating meetings with the necessary Financing agencies that are involved with the approval of the reimbursement of funds.
- Right of Way acquisition on the along the proposed Mexican alignment is reported to be 93% complete and is part of this reimbursement process.
- With the bridge design and levee relocation approved, a meeting was held with CILA, CONAGUA and CNA to discuss the necessary Right of Way acquisition for the location of the new levee alignment.
- Arturo de las Fuentes assisted in negotiation of the agreement between SCT and KCSM. The
 draft document has been reviewed by both parties and comments from both parties are
 being considered and incorporated.
- Meetings between the UPRR, KCSM and the B&M Bridge Company representatives were also held to discuss the continuation of operation and maintenance of the existing bridge and responsibilities for the new international bridge. A subsequent meeting will take place once the agreement between SCT and KCSM is signed.
- The 33rd Technical Review meeting was held on March 19th to review project advances on both sides of the border.

TxDOT Project Development Agreement for I69 CDA (Work Authorization No. 13):

This Work Authorization provides support to the Authority and its Legal and Financial Advisors in the development of a Project Development Agreement (PDA) between the Authority and TxDOT concerning the development of the SH 550. West Parkway, and US 77 Improvements projects

- The SH 550 PDA was approved by TxDOT.
- A meeting was held on March 24 with Pete Sepulveda and David Garcia to discuss financing options for the system including SH 550, West Parkway and US 77.
- The GEC continues to develop information and attend meetings as needed to support these
 discussions and to support continue implementation of SH 550, and the West Parkway
 project.

SH 550 Re-Evaluation (Work Authorization No. 15 & Supplements 1&2&3):

This Work Authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's development of the SH 550 toll project from US 77/83to State Highway 48 and the

proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work includes the preparation of an Environmental Assessment Re-evaluation focusing on the effects of tolling the project, preparation of a wetlands report, and development of a mitigation plan/Section 404 permit application. Supplements 2 & 3 included the mitigation design and re-evaluation of the EA to include the mitigation site.

- GEC continued to coordinate with Corps of Engineers, the Port of Brownsville and TxDOT to refine the mitigation plan/advance the permit application.
- On March 17, 2010, the CCRMA received the proffered SH 550 Section 404 from the USACE.
- GEC reviewed the proffered Section 404 permit and provided comments to CCRMA.
- CCRMA executed and returned the Section 404 permit to the USACE which in turn countersigned the permit. The permit is now fully executed and effective.
- All task items for this work authorization are complete. The permits require follow up items and continued coordination efforts.

SH 550 Toll Systems Integration and Design (Work Authorization No. 21 & Sup 1 & 2):

This Work Authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's tolling of the SH 550 from US 77/83 to State Highway 48 and the proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work includes the preparation of plans, specifications, and estimates for gantry, signing, conduit, and paving required for tolling of the main lanes. These will be included in the design package that TxDOT is currently completing and plans on letting using ARRA funds early in 2010. Supplement 1 to this WA includes the development of gantry and signage plans for change order into the current project under construction at the FM 1847 overpass as well as developing a plan for toll systems integration and customer service center implementation. Supplement 2 to this WA includes the development of interlocal agreements with CTRMA and TTA for the toll system implementation and TxTAG customer service.

Beginning March 16, there are now weekly Marketing & Operations and Toll System Implementation meeting that are organized and facilitated by Dan Baker. The following items are discussed, coordinated and tracked via these meetings:

Working with CTRMA, MSB and TTA, Interlocal Agreements are continuing to be developed, including:

- Toll Transaction Processing agreement was developed and approved
- Marketing and Operational Scopes of Work and Terms were developed and are being reviewed by TTA
- Maintenance scope is under development
- Dan Baker coordinated a tour of a CTRMA tolling point, The TTA Customer Service Center and MSB facility for Franco San Miguel and Marty Pena. Larry Shumway and Bobby Balli hosted the tour.

South Padre Island Second Access Phase 3A (Work Authorization No. 17):

This Work Authorization provides engineering and environmental services associated with the development and advancement of the NEPA process for the proposed South Padre Island (SPI) 2nd Access Project in Cameron County, Texas. The proposed Project will provide important congestion relief for the Queen Isabella Memorial Causeway. The proposed SPI 2nd Access Project will also serve as a critical alternative evacuation route from the island in times of disaster, hurricanes, and other emergencies. The tasks associated with the Project will include the development of the necessary environmental documentation, corridor alternatives assessments, and related public involvement activities.

This Work Authorization continues the environmental and corridor alternatives assessment tasks necessary to advance the project to a selection of a Recommended Preferred Alternative and ultimately to a Record of Decision (ROD). After the selection of a Preferred Alternative a supplement for schematic design will be required.

- Initial Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) was submitted on November 9, 2009.
- TxDOT has not yet reviewed the document. URS has been contracted to review. Once comments are received, an adjustment in the schedule will be required.
- The Biological Assessment and Archeological Surveys subcontracts were authorized. Work will begin when ROE has been obtained.
- Coordination continues with sea grass experts to evaluate possible development of a shading model to help determine possible impacts caused by the shade of the bridge.
- On March 31, 2010, GEC presented an overview of the proposed project (focusing on sea grass survey work and mitigation) to the Sea grass Working Committee in Corpus Christi.
- Refinement of the construction cost estimates and schedule has begun for the recommended preferred alternative.

• Development of the schematic phase scope and fee are underway. Anticipate to be presented to the board for approval in May.

Olmito Switchyard PS&E (Work Authorization No. 23 & Supplement No. 1):

This Work Authorization provides for the production of Plans, Specifications, and Estimates for the construction of addition rail and repair facilities in the Olmito Switchyard. Rail and grading plans were prepared to meet a March letting schedule. The repair facilities (RIP) will be included in a second set of plans for letting at a later date.

Rail and Grading Plans:

- On March 16, Richard Ridings, Van Short, Eddie Garcia, John Horney, Greg Garcia conducted a DBE workshop and a Pre-Bid Meeting for the Olmito Switchyard Expansion project. A field visit was conducted following the Pre-Bid Meeting.
- HNTB staff responded to contractors questions.
- HNTB staff posted bidding documents, and Contractors' questions and answers to www.civcastusa.com
- Bid opening will occur on April 1.
- HNTB is preparing scope for providing construction engineering and inspections (CEI) for this project. Construction is anticipated to begin in May

RIP Facility plans

- UPRR provided comments on 30% design submittal. GEC has incorporated these comments into plans and specifications
- GEC continues to develop plans to 60% submittal level for Submittal week of March 29
- Work on local permit, off-site utilities, and north access road will begin in April after Supplement 3 is approved on March 30.

SH 550 PS&E (Work Authorization No. 24):

This Work Authorization provides engineering services for the preparation of plans, specifications and estimates (PS&E) for the construction of SH 550 tolled mainlanes between existing frontage road lanes from US 77/83 to 0.5 mile north of FM 3248. The work will be performed in two phases as follows:

<u>Phase 1 – Prepare a design summary report (DSR), typical sections, design layout, and preliminary cost estimate for the proposed SH 550 tolled mainlanes.</u>

<u>Phase 2 – Prepare PS&E package for letting based on approved typical sections and design layout from Phase 1.</u>

- Completed cost estimates, design layouts, DSR, geotechnical boring layouts and typical sections.
- On March 15, Bryce Turentine and Van Short met with Norma Garza and Jody Ellington at TxDOT for a coordination meeting.
- Developed and submitted a scope to complete Phase 2 based on the design developed in phase 1.

Port Access Road (Work Authorization No. 25):

This Work Authorization provides engineering services associated with the development of plans, specifications, and estimates for the construction of a new access drive from SH 48 into the Port of Brownsville. The CCRMA will construct the new \$2.5 M entrance into the

Port of Brownsville in exchange for the donation of the SH 550 Port Spur ROW. TxDOT had initiated design of this entrance road but stopped design at an approximately 60% level of completion. The GEC has obtained TxDOT design files and will utilize them to complete a PS&E package for CCRMA letting in May

- Preparing draft contract documents for the letting and construction.
- Additional effort to coordinate utility conflicts and adjustments will begin in April after SWA#1 is approved at the March 30 Board Meeting.
- Final QA/QC of plans were conducted and cost estimates completed.
- Signatures and approvals will be obtained in April
- Advertising for a bids will begin in April, Pre-Bid meeting is scheduled for April 27 and Bids are due May 13

General Brant Road/FM 106 Extension (Work Authorization No. 26)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with the preparation of a categorical exclusion (to be reviewed by the Federal Highway Administration in anticipation of possible federal funding) and the completion of the Section 404 permitting process (including the development of a conceptual mitigation plan) for the project

- On March 18, 2010, the GEC attended a project kick-off meeting with CCRMA and TxDOT.
- Work on the draft categorical exclusion was initiated.
- GEC coordinated with TxDOT to determine the status of the draft Section 404 permit application and other activities pertaining to the Section 404 permit.
- Work began on gathering data and developing draft of the CE.

Continued coordination with subconsultants.

VIII. CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY AND RAZORBACK L.L.C. DBA DIAMONDBACK PIPELINE L.L.C. RAZORBACK FOR THE WEST RAIL PROJECT

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

AN AGREEMENT FOR COMPLETION OF THE WEST RAIL RELOCATION PROJECT IN CAMERON COUNTY, TEXAS

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MOU") made and entered into as of this the 28th day of July, 2010, by and between the CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY (the "CCRMA") and RAZORBACK L.L.C. DBA DIAMONDBACK PIPELINE L.L.C RAZORBACK ("RAZORBACK").;

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, RAZORBACK is the owner of a six-inch pipeline and an eight-inch pipeline (collectively, the "Razorback Pipeline") and P.M.I. Services North America, Inc. ("PMI") is the owner of a 10-inch pipeline (the "PMI Pipeline" and together with the Razorback Pipeline, the "Pipeline") and related easements in Cameron County, Texas, and said easements are held by RAZORBACK for the purpose of constructing, operating, maintaining, repairing, relocating, and removing said pipeline; and

WHEREAS, the Pipeline and the certain of the easements are located on real property owned or to be acquired by CCRMA (the "CCRMA Easements"); and

WHEREAS, CCRMA as fee simple owner of said real property subject to the CCRMA Easements, desires to utilize a portion of the real property over which the Pipeline may be located for the purpose of installing, operating, maintaining, and removing certain railroad improvements for the construction of the West Rail Relocation Project (the "Project"). A true and correct legal description of the real property subject to the CCRMA Easements is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit "B" (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, completing the Project may require RAZORBACK or PMI, as the case may be, and CCRMA to relocate the Pipeline in one location, and to adjust the Pipeline in four other locations; and

WHEREAS, CCRMA has agreed to pay, out of the Project, RAZORBACK's and/or PMI's actual cost of relocating and/or adjusting the Pipeline; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to memorialize their understanding as of the date of this document, to allow RAZORBACK to complete engineering plans and to provide for the orderly progress of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto have agreed and do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Engineering. Upon execution of this MOU, RAZORBACK shall be authorized to obtain any and all necessary engineering and survey services, including final design and cost estimates, for relocating and/or adjusting the Pipelines as may be necessary, in anticipation of completing the Project. CCRMA shall reimburse RAZORBACK its actual cost of engineering and survey services plus internal labor costs and out of pocket expenses incurred in completing the foregoing, in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00.
- 2. Pipeline Relocation Agreement. To the extent RAZORBACK determines it is necessary or appropriate to relocate the Pipeline based on the engineering service performed above, RAZORBACK, with respect to the Razorback Pipeline, and the CCRMA agree to act in good faith to negotiate and execute a Pipeline Relocation Agreement, which will govern RAZORBACK's relocation of its Razorback Pipeline in those areas where it is operationally unfeasible to have the pipeline occupy the same location as the Project.
- 3. **Joint Use Agreement**. To the extent **RAZORBACK** determines it is necessary or appropriate to relocate the Razorback Pipeline based on the engineering service performed above, the **CCRMA** and **RAZORBACK**, with respect to the Razorback Pipeline, agree to act in good faith to negotiate and execute a Joint Use Agreement, which will govern the adjustment of the Razorback Pipeline in those areas where the Project and the Razorback Pipeline can occupy a joint location, and will also describe the respective rights and obligations under the Project on the Property.
- 4. **PMI Agreements**. To the extent **RAZORBACK** determines it is necessary or appropriate to relocate the PMI Pipeline based on the engineering service performed above, **CCRMA** will approach PMI and attempt to negotiate, as required, a Pipeline Relocation Agreement and/or a Joint Use Agreement with PMI. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that **RAZORBACK** is not authorized to negotiate on behalf of, or bind PMI or the PMI Pipeline in any agreement related to the Project or otherwise.
- 5. **Project Schedule**. In order to complete the project in a timely manner, the parties agree to use commercially reasonable efforts to meet the following schedule:
 - a. April 7, 2010 Begin Conceptual Study;

- b. July 30, 2010 Complete Conceptual Study and receive estimates of construction costs;
- c. August 4, 2010 Submit Conceptual Study to CCRMA.
- 6. Further Documentation. While this MOU does not constitute a full and final agreement between the parties, each party recognizes that the other party intends to rely on this document in incurring expenses and making decisions in furtherance of the Project. Therefore, the parties agree to act in good faith to negotiate and execute as applicable, the Relocation Agreement, Joint Use Agreement, and other necessary documents to complete the Project as it relates to the Razorback Pipeline (excluding the PMI Pipeline. However, nothing in this MOU authorizes RAZORBACK to incur any expense for which it expects to be reimbursed by CCRMA, other than the engineering and survey services described in Paragraph 1 above, plus reasonable attorneys fees incurred in connection with the completion of the services described in Paragraph 1 above, without execution of the Joint Use or Relocation Agreements, or unless otherwise authorized in writing by CCRMA.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Memorandum of Understanding to be executed by their officer, thereunto duly authorized, as of the day and year first herein written.

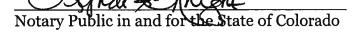

This Supplemental Work Authorization No. 5 to Work Authorization No. 16 is made pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Base Contract, effective February 16, 2006, hereinafter identified as the "Agreement", entered into by and between Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority (the "AUTHORITY"), and HNTB Corporation (the "CONSULTANT").

Part 1. The CONSULTANT will provide the following engineering services:

The responsibilities of the CONSULTANT and the schedule are further detailed in Exhibits B, and C.

Part 2. The Lump Sum amount payable for services performed under this Supplemental Work Authorization No. 5 to Work Authorization No. 16 is \$44,070.00, which increases the total amount payable from \$376,227.00 to \$420,347.00. A fee schedule used to establish the amount payable is attached hereto as Exhibit D. The CONSULTANT may alter the compensation distribution between individual phases, tasks or work assignments to be consistent with the services actually rendered, within the total lump sum amount.

The lump sum includes compensation for the services, subconsultant costs, if any, and appropriate factors for labor, overhead, profit and reimbursable expenses.

Although the CONSULTANT recognizes and accepts the ordinary risks and/or benefits of a lump sum fee structure, the parties agree to negotiate adjustment of the lump sum amount if there has been, or is to be, a material change in the: (a) scope, complexity or character of the services or the project; (b) conditions under which the services are required to be performed; or (c) duration of the services, if a change in the schedule warrants such adjustment in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

Part 3. Payment to the CONSULTANT for the services established in Supplemental Work Authorization No. 5 to Work Authorization No. 16 shall be made in accordance with the Agreement.

Part 4. This Supplemental Work Authorization No. 5 to Work Authorization No. 16 is effective as of April 13, 2010 and does not change the termination date of August 30, 2010.

Part 5. This Supplemental Work Authorization No. 5 to Work Authorization No. 16 does not waive the parties' responsibilities and obligations provided under the Agreement.

Part 6. This Supplemental Work Authorization No. 5 to Work Authorization No. 16 is hereby accepted and acknowledged below.
