#### I. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Chairman Allex acknowledged the presence of Cameron County Commissioner Garza.

Commissioner Garza informed that he was appointed to the I-69 Committee, which he described as a "diverse group." He asked that the Board let him know if there was anything he could assist them with.

Chairman Allex expressed his appreciation for Commissioner Garza's diligence in assisting the RMA.

Chairman Allex welcomed Mrs. Yolanda Villalobos as the new Director to the RMA.

# III. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES FOR APRIL 17, 2008 AND MAY 15, 2008

Upon motion by Director Gallegos, seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously, the Minutes of the April 17, 2008 and May 15, 2008 meetings were approved, inclusive of corrections to the April 17, 2008 minutes.

## IV. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Director Alvarez moved that Director Scaief be appointed Vice Chair and that Director Gallegos be appointed Secretary.

The motion was seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously.

#### V. APPROVAL OF GEC REPORT FOR MAY 2008

Mr. Eddie Garcia, HNTB, presented and highlighted the May 2008 GEC Report.

Mr. Pete Sepulveda informed that a meeting with UP and the City of Harlingen would take place to review the alternatives to relocate the switch yard from the Harlingen.

Mr. Garcia reported that over 150 public comments were received for the West Loop Project and that all would be addressed.

Director Gallegos questioned how many comments were for or against the project, and commended staff for having a public meeting with a good turnout.

Mr. Sepulveda informed that an agreement had been approved, that funding was in place and that funding for construction remains pending. He elaborated that Mexico was ready to proceed and that there may be some schedule conflicts as a result, thus the need to travel in short notice, and to obtain an MOU with Union Pacific.

Mr. Garcia reported that the public meeting held at South Padre Island had a good turnout where over one hundred comments were presented, noting that said comments were presently being addressed.

At this time, Mr. Dewey P. Cashwell Jr., South Padre Island City Manager, expressed concern with the manner in which the public meeting was held because elected officials were not allowed to speak, and with the island not being properly represented by the RMA.

Chairman Allex clarified that the Directors of the RMA were duly appointed by the Cameron County Commissioners' Court.

Director Scaief noted that the location of the second causeway would be set by commutative efforts.

Mr. Garcia reported that two technical meetings would be held at the Port Isabel City Hall, on June 18, 2008 and another on August 1, 2008.

Chairman Allex requested that the way the meeting is held be changed.

Mr. Garcia added that an Open House would take place this evening at the Juliet Garcia Middle School at 6 p.m.

Upon motion by Director Gallegos, seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously, the May 2008 GEC Report was approved.

The following is a summary of our progress on the subject projects for the month of May, 2008.

#### **Project Management:**

#### **General GEC**

Prepared contract correspondence and monthly GEC progress report.

• Prepared & submitted CCRMA GEC Invoice No. 23 for work performed on Work Authorization Nos. 4, 5, 7, 8, 11, 12, 14 and 15.

Updated and submitted May 2008 GEC work authorization status report.

North Rail Relocation Project (Work Authorization No. 4)

North Rail Relocation Project relocates the exiting and operating freight rail lines away from incorporated and unincorporated areas of Cameron County, Texas, in particular in and around Harlingen, Texas. An effective relocation of the existing freight rail facility will not only improve freight rail operations to and from the US/Mexico border, but may aid in the enhancement of air quality for the area, improve the safety of the traveling public with regard to the freight rail/passenger interface, improve the response time of emergency vehicles, minimize if not eliminate the transport of hazardous material via freight rail through towns, improve traffic congestion, and ultimately enhance the economic development of the region.

- HNTB Staff continued discussions with Union Pacific representatives.
- A draft MOU was submitted to CCRMA staff for review and comment.
- At the request of the CCRMA Coordinator, HNTB completed the development of conceptual layouts and associated estimates on a Northern Cameron County Rail Switchyard. These layouts and estimates were submitted to CCRMA staff for review and comment.

FM 509 Project (Work Authorization No. 5)

The FM 509 project is a relief route around the north and east areas of the City of Harlingen that would construct FM 509, in Cameron County, from US 77 to the Intersection with FM 508. The proposed facility would consist of a four-lane roadway with directions of travel separated by a center median. Dependent upon traffic projections, an interim facility with fewer lanes may initially be constructed. Interchanges or grade separations would be constructed at major thoroughfares. As proposed, the right-of-way would be 300-feet (usual) wide and sufficient to accommodate future transportation needs; however, any future improvements would be subject to environmental review. This could include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, general purpose lanes, truck lanes, or some combination of these modes.

Project coordination.

 TxDOT ENV determination regarding historic structures is needed to finalize the identification of the preferred alternative prior to engaging special studies for archeology.

 HNTB addressing TxDOT Pharr District comments, dated March 25, 2008, on the resubmitted FM 509 preliminary draft EA. TxDOT Pharr District submittal of revised draft EA, reflective of March 25, 2008 comments, anticipated 1st week of June.

West Loop Project (Work Authorization No. 7):

The proposed West Loop Road is a new location facility and will provide a four-lane controlled access expressway with interchanges and connections at strategic locations and grade separation structures for several crossing streets in Brownsville. The majority of the project alignment falls within or in the vicinity of the existing Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way. Negotiations are underway to relocate the railroad and donate the right-of-way to the county for the project.

- HNTB placed 10 day ads with area publications to publicize the May 29, 2008 meeting.
- HNTB finalized correspondence, resource materials and visuals for the West Loop public meeting.
- HNTB hosted and staffed a public meeting on May 29, 2008 from 6:00 PM until 8:00 PM.
- HNTB finalized resource materials and visuals for the West Loop agency coordination meeting.
- HNTB hosted and staffed an agency coordination meeting on May 29, 2008 from 10:00 AM until 12 noon.
- HNTB coordinated approvals on all correspondence and resource material with TxDOT and CCRMA staff.
- HNTB generated a draft contact list and draft timeline for small group briefings.
- HNTB booked and coordinated logistics for three small group briefings on the West Loop project during the month of May.
- HNTB hosted a small group briefing with members of St. Joseph's Church and with Father Jerry Frank about the West Loop project on Tuesday, May 20, 2008 at 6:00 PM.
- HNTB has prepared draft meeting notes based on the comments received at the May 20, 2008 briefing.
- HNTB hosted a small group briefing with key area representatives about the West Loop project on Friday, May 23, 2008 at the IBC Bank building.
- HNTB has prepared draft meeting notes of the comments received at the May 23, 2008 briefing.
- HNTB hosted a small group briefing with City of Brownsville and City of Matamoros staff about the West Loop project on Wednesday, May 28, 2008 at Brownsville City Hall.
- HNTB has prepared draft meeting notes of the comments received at the May 28, 2008 briefing.
- HNTB continued development of travel demand model and toll diverted traffic numbers.
- HNTB continued efforts on microsimulation model.
- HNTB held internal traffic meeting on Wednesday, May 14, 2008 to discuss alternatives and toll feasibility.

### West Rail Relocation Project (Work Authorization No. 8):

This Work Authorization provides appropriate subconsultant(s) for staff coordination with the Mexican agencies to monitor and determine project schedules, permit

requirements, funding technical agreements and design for the West Rail Relocation around Brownsville, Texas. The project plans will require approval by Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes (SCT), Comisión Internacional de Limites Y Aguas (CILA) and Kansas City Southern Mexico (KCSM).

Arturo coordinated the West Matamoros land use plan revisions required of Option "A".
 Architect Jose Arnoldo Carrillo de la Garza, Planning and Projects Director from Matamoros Municipality, is continuing with the authorization process.

A meeting with the Infrastructure National Fund (FONADIN) took place on May 12,

2008 to approve the funding necessary to complete the financial studies.

In regards to the railway alignment, Dr. David W. Eaton, Kansas City Southern Mexico Institutional Relations Director and Architect Vladimir Josue Robles Garza, Kansas City Southern Mexico Institutional Relations Manager accepted option "A". The agreement of the railway alignment is to be signed at the Employment and Economical Development Secretariat of the State Government of Tamaulipas. Once signed, it will be forwarded to the representative from the Communication and Transports Secretariat from Tamaulipas State located in Tampico and then to Lic. Jose Guillermo Zozaya Delano, President and Executive Representative from Kansas City Southern Mexico and finally to Carlos Cascos, Cameron County Judge.

In regards to the railway right-of-way, a meeting took place with community leaders and the Economical Development Secretariat from Matamoros Municipality on Wednesday, April 30, 2008. Lic. Ulysses Flores Rodriguez, Juridical Director from the Employment and Economical Development Secretariat from the State of Tamaulipas coordinated with

owners of the 35 pieces of land.

East Loop Pass Through Financing (Work Authorization No. 11):

The project, termed as the East Loop, is currently identified as three sections. Section I begins at the intersection of US 77 (North of Brownsville) and FM 511 in Olmito and continues east along FM 511 to SH 48 (near the Port of Brownsville). This section is currently under design through a TxDOT consultant as a four (4) lane divided section that will ultimately be frontage roads to a six (6) lane divided section for truck and passenger traffic. Section II continues from SH 48 at FM 511 east and then south to SH 4 (Boca Chica Boulevard). This section is currently a TxDOT project and is in the Environmental and Preliminary Schematic stage. Section III continues southbound from SH 4 near the southeast corner of Brownsville and ends at the entrance of the Veterans International Bridge on US 77. This section is currently in the Environmental and Preliminary Schematic stage. Sections II and III are currently identified as a four (4) lane divided section.

 HNTB met internally and with TxDOT and CCRMA staff to investigate options for developing this project into a comprehensive development agreement and subsequent toll concession.

South Padre Island Second Access (Work Authorization No. 12):

This work authorization provides engineering and environmental services associated with the development and advancement of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process for the proposed South Padre Island (SPI) 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project. The tasks associated with the project will include the development of the necessary environmental documentation, corridor alternatives assessments and related public involvement activities.

 HNTB conducted spring field surveys to identify environmental constraints within the study area.

- HNTB submitted agency coordination letters and an invitation to the agency scoping meeting to participating agencies, cooperating agencies and TxDOT.
- HNTB updated project schedule.
- HNTB received and addressed comments regarding the draft need and purpose and draft coordination plan from TxDOT ENV and FHWA.
- HNTB developed the final draft of the preliminary constraints map.
- HNTB conducted the agency scoping meeting and the public meeting on May 22, 2008.
- HNTB continued data collection and writing for the draft existing environment section of the DEIS.
- HNTB updated the environmental schedule.
- HNTB placed ads at the 10 day mark to publicize the May 22, 2008 public meeting.
- HNTB prepared and dispersed PSA notifications for the May 22, 2008 public meeting to local radio, TV and internet-based media.
- HNTB prepared and dispersed a request for advance coverage and interview notification for the May 22, 2008 public meeting to local newspaper, website, radio and TV media.
- HNTB prepared and dispersed request for day of coverage notifications for the May 22,
   2008 public meeting to local media.
- HNTB dispersed the official release to the media after the May, 22, 2008 public meeting.
- HNTB coordinated with a court reporter, security and interpreter for the May 22, 2008 public meeting.
- HNTB conducted internal QA/QC of materials for upcoming meetings and work groups.
- Finalized study area and constraints maps for PITWG and future public meetings.
- HNTB finalized a powerpoint presentation for the agency coordination meeting on May 22, 2008.
- HNTB prepared draft notes following the SPI agency coordination meeting.

Request for Statements of Interest (Work Authorization No. 14):

This work authorization provides professional technical services associated with the development of request for statements of interest (RFI) and qualifications from firms to provide strategic partnership/investor opportunities for the proposed CCRMA projects located in Cameron County, Texas; as well as, provide recommendations for the selection of projects that the CCRMA could pursue through a separate CDA procurement process.

- HNTB coordinated and submitted legal notice to local and national newspapers for publication.
- HNTB coordinated with local and national contractors interested in project.
- HNTB has been facilitating and participating in discussions with TxDOT officials in an
  effort to coordinate activities of this project and the activities of TxDOT and their
  associated concession projects.
- A Workshop has been scheduled for June 16, 2008, 1:30 PM at the Dancy Building, Commissioner's Courtroom.

SH 550 Re-Evaluation (Work Authorization No. 15):

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's development of the SH 550 (Port Spur) toll project from FM 511 at Old Port Isabel Road to State Highway 48 and the proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. The focus of the re-evaluation will be on the effects of tolling the project.

 HNTB has begun public meeting work planning, handout planning, exhibit list, talking points.

- HNTB began planning and preparation of materials and visuals for the public meeting to be held on June 12, 2008
- HNTB prepared ad in both English and Spanish for publicizing public meeting to be held on June 12, 2008.
- HNTB dispersed ad to area publications to run on both May 13, 2008 and June 2, 2008 timeframe.

#### CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

This is an agreement by and between the CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY (hereinafter called CCRMA) and MARTHA GALARZA (hereinafter called GALARZA).

In consideration of the mutual promises herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

#### PURPOSE OF REPRESENTATION

The CCRMA hereby employs GALARZA to act as Budget Coordinator. As Budget Coordinator, GALARZA agrees to do the following: (1) prepare a monthly revenue and expenditure report for the Board, (2) maintain oversight of the CCRMA fund, (3) prepare any and all reports required by State auditing agencies, (4) prepare the monthly and yearly financial statements and/or reports and (5) assist the RMA Coordinator in preparing the monthly cash flow statements.

#### COMPENSATION

In consideration of services to be rendered by GALARZA, the CCRMA hereby agrees to pay GALARZA an annual sum of \$6,000 to be paid in monthly installments of \$500.00 payable on the last day of each month. It is specifically understood and agreed that the CCRMA will not withhold any monies for purposes of taxes. All taxes due shall be paid by GALARZA as a self-employed person.

#### **TERM**

This agreement shall begin on June 1, 2008 and end on September 30, 2008 or until it is terminated by either party, upon thirty (30) days written notice. In the event that GALARZA is not employed by Cameron County as County Auditor, this agreement is immediately null and

This agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement of the parties hereto and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties respecting the within subject matter. This agreement may be modified at any time by mutual consent of the parties.
