VI. Approval of Claims

Ms. Martha Galarza presented four claims for approval, one for Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., covering security reimbursements and filing fees for Parcel 9 of the West Rail Relocation Project at \$497.00, one for JP Morgan Chase Bank for travel at \$2,974.90, one for Mr. David A. Garcia for travel to Austin, Texas at \$473.57 and one for Bank of New York Mellon Trust in the amount of \$286,104.73. There was a discussion regarding the travel claims that included travel to Dallas, Texas. Staff will look into the travel and clarify the travel destination.

Director Villalobos made a motion to approve Claims subject to reconciliation/clarification on the travel claim to Dallas, Texas. The motion was seconded by Director Esparza and carried unanimously.

VII. Consideration and Acknowledgement of GEC Report for the Month of July 2011

Mr. Van Short, with HNTB introduced the item and allowed Mr. Jimmy Berry, with HNTB to go over a power point presentation on the status of the West Rail Relocation Project. There was an exchange of questions and answers between the Board and Staff. Mr. Short provided a report on the status of the other projects including West Parkway, SPI 2nd Access, General Brandt Road, SH 32, Outer Parkway, Transportation Reinvestment Zone, U.S. 77 and SH 550 Direct Connectors. Mr. Short mentioned that the U.S. 77 Project in Willacy County had been awarded the bid by the Texas Transportation Commission and that a contract would be awarded at a future Texas Transportation Commission meeting.

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Coordinator advised the Board that on Friday, August 12th there is a West Rail Technical meeting with Mexico. Mr. Sepulveda will request a schedule from Mexico for construction completion. He also informed the Board that TransMontaigne agreed on there being no conflict on Railroad Street, thus, eliminating a need to relocate the gas line and saving \$750,000. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that a work authorization will be brought to the Board at a future meeting to do a design change that is needed. Mr. Sepulveda advised the Board that he is dealing with a Property Owner, Union Pacific and the U.S. Attorney's office/DHS on a location for a gate along the border fence.

Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that on the South Padre Island 2nd Access Draft Environmental Impact Statement we are pending comments from the National Marine Fisheries Services. FHWA has received all other comments from cooperating agencies. Comments from USFWS are substantial and very thorough. The plan moving forward is to discuss the comments internally between HNTB and Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Staff. Then discuss addressing the comments with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) District Office and ENV in Austin and FHWA. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that perhaps we can still hold a Public Hearing in February or March of 2012.

Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that work is still being done in preparing a work authorization for the East Loop Project and that perhaps one can be presented at the next Board meeting.

Mr. Sepulveda advised the Board that 9 RFQ's were received for the FM 803 Environmental Assessment and 9 RFQ's received for the Port Isabel Port Access Road Project.

Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that we are awaiting a draft Pass Through Agreement from the TxDOT District office for the SH 550 Direct Connectors.

Director Gallegos made a motion to acknowledge the GEC Report for the Month of July 2011, as presented by Staff. The motion was seconded by Director Wood and carried unanimously.

Mobility Authority and Breeden McCumber

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Coordinator introduced the item and advised the Board that he had passed out information related to this agenda item. Mr. Sepulveda began going over the spreadsheet indicating the number of crossings for the month of July 2011. He discussed the tag penetration percentage as well as the percentage of traffic for commercial vehicles and regular passenger vehicles. Mr. Sepulveda then went over the fees (payment violations) that have been collected by MSB. A total of four transfers have been made to the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority. Additionally, in the month of June, 59 payments were received locally, 58 calls were taken and 12 TxTags sold. In the month of July 286 payments were received, 129 calls were taken and 17 TxTags were sold. During August, 60 payments have been received, 22 calls have been taken and 9 TxTags sold. Mr. Sepulveda advised the Board that CTRMA has not transferred any of the fees associated with the users that have TxTags. Staff will continue to work with CTRMA Staff and monitor the situation.

Director Gallegos made a motion to acknowledge the SH 550 Traffic Report for the Month of July 2011, as presented. The motion was seconded by Director Scaief and carried unanimously.

Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Letter of Agreement between the Cameron C	County	Regional

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Coordinator introduced the item and reason for the marketing plan. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that perhaps one of the ways to market the sale of TxTags is through hiring an individual that can do the day to day marketing that is required. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that the Port of Brownsville has offered free office space that the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority can use to sell TxTags. Mr. Sepulveda also mentioned that the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority could visit all the Port's tenants and largest employers and attempt to sign up their employees for a TxTags. Mr. Sepulveda also mentioned that we could utilize the old Camperos location to set up the sale of TxTags. Vice Chairman Wood mentioned that we should target the Rio Del Sol Subdivision, Port of Brownsville, Visitors and Convention Bureau amongst other entities in trying to set up shop to sell TxTags. Chairman Allex mentioned that we should always be marketing the sale of TxTags. He mentioned that we could go before the Maquiladora Association and make a presentation.

Mr. Ben Guerrero, Breeden McCumber went over the marketing plan that had been prepared and the importance of direct mailing. Mr. Guerrero discussed how each facet of the plan dealt with the direct mailing and the overall marketing of the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority. Mr. Guerrero mentioned that the marketing also included the final configuration of SH 550 when it will have three toll gantries operating.

Additional discussion ensued between the Board, Staff and Mr. Guerrero from Breeden McCumber. Mr. Guerrero mentioned that we could move the funding around and concentrate more on activities included in the marketing plan if Staff felt we needed to concentrate on those areas.

Director Gallegos made a motion to approve the Letter of Agreement between the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority and Breeden McCumber. The motion was seconded by Director Villalobos and carried unanimously.

X. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Payment of the \$250,000 Loan to Cameron County

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Coordinator introduced the item and advised the Board that in 2005 when the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority was created, Cameron County made a \$250,000 loan to the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority. Mr. Sepulveda recommended that a letter from Chairman Allex to the County Judge be sent with a payment plan. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that we could budget the payment next fiscal year and make monthly payments to the County.

Director Scaief made a motion to approve sending a letter to the Cameron County Judge. The motion was seconded by Director Wood and carried unanimously.

XI. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Electronic Toll Collection System

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Coordinator introduced the item and advised the Board about the agenda item. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that Cameron County owns and operates three international bridges and that County Staff was looking into upgrading the toll collection system. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned this could be an opportune time to make the toll road and international bridges interoperable. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that the County's electronic toll collection system vendor had submitted a scope that could accommodate the interoperability and that Staff would be reviewing and determining if this was something that could be priced once Staff was comfortable with the scope.

Director Wood made a motion to acknowledge the report on the Electronic Toll Collection System's interoperability with the Cameron County Bridge System Electronic Toll Collection System. The motion was seconded by Director Gallegos and carried unanimously.

IV. CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY AND VERONICA AVINA

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

This is an agreement by and between the CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY (hereinafter called CCRMA) and VERONICA AVINA (hereinafter called AVINA).

In consideration of the mutual promises herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

PURPOSE OF REPRESENTATION

The CCRMA hereby employs AVINA to serve as support services for the CCRMA. In providing support services, AVINA will do the following: (1) Operate the Customer Service Operation (2) Supervise and work with Bookkeeper and CTRMA to ensure that reports are properly being generated; (3) Supervise and Coordinate efforts with the Texas Turnpike Authority (TTA) on the marketing of the transponders; (4) Collect payments, sell TxTags and take phone inquiries; (7) Be the IT Bookkeeping staff.

COMPENSATION

In consideration of services to be rendered by AVINA, the CCRMA hereby agrees to pay AVINA an annual sum of \$2,400.00 to be paid in monthly installments of \$200.00 payable on the last day of each month. It is specifically understood and agreed that the CCRMA will not withhold any monies for purposes of taxes. All taxes due shall be paid by AVINA as a self-employed person.

TERM

This agreement shall begin on August 1, 2011 and end on September 30, 2011 or until it is terminated by either party, upon thirty (30) days written notice. In the event that AVINA is not employed by Cameron County, this agreement is immediately null and void.

NOTICE

All notices to CCRMA shall be sent by certified or registered mail, addressed to: Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority, 1390 W Expressway 77, San Benito, Texas 78586, or at such other address as the CCRMA may otherwise designate. All notices to VERONICA AVINA shall be sent certified or registered mail, addressed to: VERONICA AVINA, 300 S. Expressway 77, Brownsville, Texas 78520.

LAW AND VENUE

This agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Cameron County, Texas.

PRIOR AGREEMENTS SUPERSEDED

This agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement of the parties hereto and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties respecting the within subject matter. This agreement may be modified at any time by mutual consent of the parties.

V. CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY AND THE CAMERON COUNTY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 1 FOR THE SH 550 PROJECT

LICENSE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and executed effective this 4 day of August, 2011, by and between Cameron County Drainage District No. 1 (hereafter called "District") and the Cameron County Regional Authority (hereafter called "Regional Authority"); and

WHEREAS, District owns a certain real property consisting of drainage ditches in Brownsville, Cameron County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Authority is in the process of realigning certain portions of FM 511 and building a toll road to be named FM 550 which toll road will cross certain drainage facilities owned and maintained by District;

WHEREAS, the Regional Authority had requested that District grant it a license to allow for the construction of a bridge to cross the District drainage facilities and to install box culverts and other improvements thereon (the "Improvements"), said Improvements being part of the project known as the "SH 550 Road Project"; and

WHEREAS, District has indicated that it would be willing to provide a license to Regional Authority to construct the Improvements to cross the District drainage facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises, covenants and warranties hereafter made by District and Regional Authority, the parties do hereby agree to the following:

1. <u>Granting of License</u>. Cameron County Drainage District No. 1 does hereby grant a license to Cameron County Regional Authority to erect and maintain, at Regional Authority's sole expense and liability, the Improvements over and across the area of real property owned by District as depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto (the "License Tract"). The Improvements shall

be erected in accordance with the graphic depictions attached hereto as Exhibit "B". Improvements shall not be constructed in such a manner so as to interfere with District's use of its drainage ditches and other improvements belonging to District within the License Tract (Exhibit A).

2. Term of License. The License granted herein shall be perpetual so long as Regional Authority complies with the terms of this license. In the event that the License is terminated, then Regional Authority shall remove, at its sole expense, the Improvements on or over the License Tract and shall restore the License Tract to the condition in which it existed prior to the granting of this License.

3. Regional Authority warrants:

- (a) that as a condition of the continued validity and viability of this License, Regional Authority shall not construct any improvements which will inhibit or interfere with District's use of its improvements and so that District shall have continued access to its Main Drain for all purposes deemed necessary by District.
- (b) that under no circumstances will Regional Authority permit any person employed by or for Regional Authority, any agent or any person standing in the relationship of contractors or any subcontractor or any other person or persons for whom they are legally responsible to enter on the License Tract, except for specifically authorized official business consistent with the rights granted under this License Agreement and all construction and similar work performed in connection with the Improvements shall be confined strictly to the License Tract.

- 4. Regional Authority acknowledges that District mows and maintains its real property, rights of ways, easements and drainage ditches utilizing excavators, tractors and other heavy equipment. Regional Authority agrees to release District from any and all damages caused to the Improvements which damages may be caused by the District's personnel or equipment during maintenance, construction or excavation activities.
- 5. Any failure or refusal by Regional Authority, its successors or assigns, to keep the Improvements maintained in good condition, after reasonable request and notification by District, shall terminate this License Agreement. Such termination shall be effective upon the filing of a written notice of termination and cancellation in the office of the County Clerk of Cameron County, Texas, together with notice of termination and cancellation mailed or delivered to Regional Authority.
- 6. This instrument contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this instrument shall be of no force and effect excepting a subsequent modification in writing, signed by the party to be charged.
- 7. <u>Non-Exclusiveness Of License.</u> The license, rights and privileges granted by this instrument are not exclusive. District covenants not to subsequently convey any other license or conflicting rights in the area covered by this grant which may interfere with this license.
- 8. Regional Authority shall not have the right to use either the surface or subsurface of the License Tract except as specifically detailed in Exhibit B. District retains, reserves and shall continue to enjoy the use of the surface of the License Tract.

9. Indemnity and Insurance. Regional Authority shall indemnify, as permitted by state law, and hold District, its successors, assigns and agents, harmless against any and all claims, actions, demands, damages, liabilities and costs, including attorneys fees, incurred or to be incurred by the District, which directly or indirectly results from, or arises in connection with any fault, liability, negligent act or omission or gross negligence of Regional Authority, or any of its agents, officers, directors, employees, contractors, subcontractors or any others pertaining to its activities and obligations under this Agreement, including the installation of the Improvements over the License Tract and operation of the bridge.

Without limiting the foregoing, Regional Authority shall and hereby does, as permitted by state law, indemnify and hold District, its successors, assigns and agents harmless from and against all loss, cost, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), suits, judgments, damages or injuries or death (i) to persons or properties arising out of or resulting from the acts or omissions of Regional Authority, its employees and agents, in the construction, inspection, using, operation, maintenance and/or removal of the Improvements upon the License Tract, or other extraordinary occurrences or (ii) caused by or arising out of Regional Authority's failure to comply at all times with the laws, rules, regulations and safety standards applicable to the Improvements and the operation of same.

Regional Authority further agrees to protect, indemnify and hold harmless, as permitted by state law, District, its successors, assigns and agents from and against any claims, causes, causes of action, suits, judgments, losses, damages and liability of every kind, including all expense of litigation, court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees for damages to real or personal

property or natural resources, personal injury or death claims and public or private claims or demands for direct payment or reimbursement of investigation, remediation and government oversight costs, arising out of, or in any way related to the presence or release of hazardous substances, pollutants or other contaminants which migrate or are otherwise transported by or diverted from the Improvements.

District shall be given written notice by certified mail at the address set forth below of any act or occurrence involving a liability, loss, claim, or demand with respect to which indemnification is provided by this Agreement, immediately after such occurrence shall have come to District's knowledge. In the event of a claim or demand, District and Regional Authority shall cooperate in the selection of an attorney to represent the District concerning any such claim or action.

10. Miscellaneous.

- (a) <u>Disclaimer</u>. District hereby specifically disclaims any warranty, guaranty, or representation, oral or written, past, present or future, of, as to, or concerning (i) the nature and condition of the License Tract, including but not by way of limitation, the water, soil, geology and the suitability thereof of the License Tract for all activities and uses which Regional Authority conducts thereon.
- (b) Entire Agreement and Amendment. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed, and supersedes any prior understandings, representations, memorandums or agreements regarding the license that is the subject of this Agreement. Any oral representations

or modifications concerning this instrument shall be of no force or effect. This Agreement may be amended, provided that no amendment, modification or alteration of the terms of this Agreement shall be binding unless the same is in writing and duly executed by the parties hereto.

(c) Law Governing; Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The obligations and undertakings of each of the parties to this Agreement shall be performable in Cameron County, Texas.

(d) Parties Bound. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement and their respective heirs, legal representatives, successors and assigns, as appropriate.

(e) Assignment. This Agreement may not be assigned in whole or in part by Regional Authority without the written consent of District. Any assignee will be bound by the terms of this Agreement.



The following is a summary of our progress on the subject projects for the month of July 2011.

Project Management:

General GEC

- Prepared & submitted CCRMA GEC Invoice for work performed on various Work Authorizations. Updated and submitted June 2011 GEC Work Authorization status report.
- On July 15, Richard Ridings, Van Short and Jimmy Berry attended the Special Meeting of the Board of Directors. Richard Ridings presented the June GEC Report and Jimmy Berry gave a presentation on the status of the Olmito Switch Yard and West Rail construction projects.
- On July 25, Richard Ridings, Van Short and Jimmy Berry attended the Special Meeting of the Board of Directors. Richard Ridings gave a status of the projects.
- HNTB continues to attend numerous meetings and correspond with RMA staff and others to support the RMA's efforts.

FM 509 Project (Work Authorization No. 5)

The FM 509 project is a relief route around the north and east areas of the City of Harlingen that would construct an extension of FM 509, in Cameron County, from US 77 to the Intersection with FM 508. The proposed facility would consist of a four-lane roadway with directions of travel separated by a center median. Dependent upon traffic projections, an interim facility with fewer lanes may initially be constructed. Interchanges or grade separations would be constructed at major thoroughfares. As proposed, the right-of-way would be 300-feet wide (usual) and sufficient to accommodate future transportation needs; however, any future improvements would be subject to environmental review. This could include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, general purpose lanes, truck lanes, or some combination of these modes.

HNTB is currently performing preliminary development of the Outer Parkway. This project would provide a greater economic benefit to the area and establish a corridor along similar alignment yet would continue along the North side of Cameron County to the future SPI 2nd Access. The recommended alternative alignment for the north-south section of FM 509 is being utilized as a connection to the future Outer Parkway to the existing FM 509 corridor. The eastwest section of the recommended alternative potential alignment for FM 509 is being considered as an option for the east-west Outer Parkway alignment. The HNTB team is currently utilizing

FM 509 environmental studies, constraint data, Lidar survey data, and right of way information for this endeavor.

West Parkway Project:

The proposed West Parkway is a new location facility and will provide a four-lane controlled access parkway with interchanges and connections at strategic locations and grade separation structures for several crossing streets in Brownsville. The majority of the project alignment falls within or in the vicinity of the existing Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way. Negotiations are underway to relocate the railroad and donate the right-of-way to the county for the project.

West Parkway EA/Schematic (Work Authorization No. 7):

This Work Authorization provides for the development of a Schematic and Environmental Assessment based on the project design developed by TxDOT and detailed in the value engineering report.

- To date, the Environmental Assessment has been reviewed by TxDOT-Pharr District and TxDOT-Environmental Affairs Division. All review comments have been addressed. The most recent version of the document was submitted on March 10, 2011. Since submittal, TxDOT has initiated project coordination with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). TCEQ has provided a "no comments" letter; TWPD review is pending.
- This project is on hold until CCRMA gives HNTB a notice to proceed on Supplemental Work Authorization #5 to Work Authorization #7 for Historical Site Research. The environmental document cannot move forward without this research.

West Parkway Public Involvement (Work Authorization No. 18):

This Work Authorization provided community involvement services through a series of neighborhood meetings, focus group meetings, and one on one meetings to develop a two-way dialogue with the public to inform them of the need and purpose of the project and to gather their ideas on how the West Parkway can become a valuable community asset.

This effort is complete and the contract is closed.

West Rail (Work Authorization No. 16):

This Work Authorization provides additional professional services and deliverables for the West Rail Relocation project. Work includes utility coordination and evaluation, changes to plan set for fencing, lighting and gate relocation on the bridge structure, coordination with DHS/CBP for temporary border fence removal to support construction and providing information to the contractor with regards to Request for Information (RFI's)..

- Coordination with TransMontaigne is ongoing. The County and Transmontaigne are finalizing the new pipeline agreement for the project.
- Coordination with the Department of Homeland Security is ongoing for this project. Site plans
 had been submitted to SAIC for their review and the County and SAIC will enter into a separate
 agreement for the VACIS relocation. DHS/CBP had provided a copy of their HB 1400-02B

Security Policy and Procedures Handbook after appropriate non-disclosure agreements (NDA's) had been approved. DHS comments to plan set referencing HB 1400-02B are showing some of the HB 1400 specifications are out of date/no longer manufactured (ie: exterior doors, door hardware). Door submittal has now been approved by DHS. We are working with architect and DHS for resolution on stand-by generator submittal and changes to plan set to expand the DATA (LAN) Room and provide expanded metal cladding to the non-block wall of the DATA room.

A supplemental has been forwarded for responding to additional RFI's beyond the number listed in the original agreement.

West Rail Relocation International Coordination (Work Authorization No. 8):

This Work Authorization provides appropriate subconsultant(s) for staff coordination with the Mexican agencies to monitor and determine project schedules, permit requirements, funding technical agreements and design for the West Rail Relocation around Brownsville, Texas. The project plans will require approval by Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes (SCT), Comisión Internacional de Limites Y Aguas (CILA) and Kansas City Southern Mexico (KCSM).

- Dr. de las Fuentes continues to assist with the development of a 30 year Binational Regional Plan of the Cameron County and Matamoros Municipality Zone.
- A Supplemental was approved by the CCRMA Board to extend Arturo de las Fuente's contract through December 2011.

TxDOT Project Development Agreement for I69 CDA (Work Authorization No. 13):

This Work Authorization provides support to the Authority and its Legal and Financial Advisors in the development of a Project Development Agreement (PDA) between the Authority and TxDOT concerning the development of the SH 550, West Parkway, and US 77 Improvements projects

 As a result of legislative action, CDA activity is now on hold until environmental documents are substantially complete for South Padre Second Access and Outer Parkway.

SH 550 Re-Evaluation (Work Authorization No. 15 & Supplements 1, 2 & 3):

This Work Authorization provided professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's development of the SH 550 toll project from US 77/83 to State Highway 48 and the proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work included the preparation of an Environmental Assessment Re-evaluation focusing on the effects of tolling the project, preparation of a wetlands report, and development of a mitigation plan/Section 404 permit application. Supplements 2 & 3 included the mitigation design and re-evaluation of the EA to include the mitigation site.

Construction/mitigation site monitoring and coordination with the US Army Corps of Engineers continues in accordance with the executed Section 404 permit.

This Work Authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's tolling of the SH 550 from US 77/83 to State Highway 48 and the proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work includes the preparation of plans, specifications, and estimates for gantry, signing, conduit, and paving required for tolling of the main lanes. These will be included in the design package that TxDOT is currently completing and plans on letting using ARRA funds early in 2010. Supplement 1 to this WA includes the development of gantry and signage plans for change order into the current project under construction at the FM 1847 overpass as well as developing a plan for toll systems integration and customer service center implementation. Supplements 2 and 3 to this WA include the development of interlocal agreements with CTRMA and TTA for the toll system implementation and TxTAG customer service.

• Worked via a CTRMA work authorization to provide coordination of CTRMA resources, including subcontractors to CTRMA and those that will interface with the CTRMA's systems in support of the CCRMA Toll System implementation project.

South Padre Island Second Access Phase 3A (Work Authorization No. 17):

This Work Authorization provides engineering and environmental services associated with the development and advancement of the NEPA process for the proposed South Padre Island (SPI) 2nd Access Project in Cameron County, Texas. The proposed Project will provide important congestion relief for the Queen Isabella Memorial Causeway. The proposed SPI 2nd Access Project will also serve as a critical alternative evacuation route from the island in times of disaster, hurricanes, and other emergencies. The tasks associated with the Project will include the development of the necessary environmental documentation, corridor alternatives assessments, and related public involvement activities. This Work Authorization continues the environmental and corridor alternatives assessment tasks necessary to advance the project to a selection of a Recommended Preferred Alternative and ultimately to a Record of Decision (ROD). After the selection of a Preferred Alternative a supplement for schematic design will be required.

- To date, the draft EIS has been reviewed by TxDOT (Pharr District, Environmental Affairs and General Counsel) and FHWA-Texas Division.
- The draft EIS is now being reviewed by FHWA-Legal and federal Cooperating Agencies (U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and National Marine Fisheries Service). Comments were originally requested by July 8, 2011; however, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service requested a 20-day extension (July 28, 2011).

Olmito Switchyard PS&E (Work Authorization No. 23 & Supplement No. 1):

This Work Authorization provides for the production of Plans, Specifications, and Estimates for the construction of addition rail and repair facilities in the Olmito Switchyard. Rail and grading plans were prepared. The repair facilities (RIP) will be included in a second set of construction plans for letting at a later date.

RIP Facility plans:

Project was let on July 14^{th.}. ZIWA Corporation was the low bidder.

SH 550 PS&E (Work Authorization No. 24):

This Work Authorization provides engineering services for the preparation of plans, specifications and estimates (PS&E) for the construction of SH 550 tolled main lanes between existing frontage road lanes from US 77/83 to 0.5 mile north of FM 3248. The work will be performed in two phases as follows:

<u>Phase 1 – Prepared a design summary report (DSR), typical sections, design layout, and preliminary cost estimate for the proposed SH 550 tolled main lanes.</u>

• Phase 1 work was completed in April 2010.

Phase 2 - Prepare PS&E package for letting based on approved typical sections and design layout from Phase 1.

- Utility database is being maintained, and coordination meetings for each of the identified conflicts and service locations will continue.
- Final PS&E TxDOT comments received and addressed.
- Revised signed and sealed mylar PS&E submittal submitted to TxDOT on 8/3/11.

Port Access Road (Work Authorization No. 25):

This Work Authorization provided engineering services associated with the development of plans, specifications, and estimates for the construction of a new access drive from SH 48 into the Port of Brownsville. The CCRMA is constructing the new \$2.5 M entrance into the Port of Brownsville in exchange for the donation of the SH 550 Port Spur ROW. TxDOT had initiated design of this entrance road but stopped design at an approximately 60% level of completion. The GEC obtained TxDOT design files and utilized them to complete a PS&E package.

This Work Authorization is complete. No activity.

General Brant Road/FM 106 Extension (Work Authorization No. 26)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with the preparation of a categorical exclusion (to be reviewed by the Federal Highway Administration in anticipation of possible federal funding) and the completion of the Section 404 permitting process (including the development of a conceptual mitigation plan) for the project.

- Currently coordinating responses to TxDOT Environmental Affairs Division comments on draft Categorical Exclusion and addressing document classification issues with Pharr District staff.
- Submitted Section 404 permit application to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

SH 32 East Loop Pass Through Application (Work Authorization No. 27)

This work authorization provided professional services and deliverables associated with reviewing and revising the 2009 application. The Application was submitted to TxDOT on May 11, 2010.

This effort is complete and the contract is closed.

Olmito Switch Yard Expansion Construction Inspection (Work Authorization No. 28)

This work authorization provides professional services associated with construction inspection phase work for the Olmito Switch Yard.

- The Contractor has completed 100% of the construction on the project.
- The Change Order for the North Access road has been completed by the contractor.
- Final documentation is pending approval of SWA #01.

TIGER II Grant Application (Work Authorization No. 30)

This work authorization provided professional services and deliverables associated with applying for a Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery II (TIGER II) grant.

This effort is complete and the contract is closed.

Olmito Switch Yard & Repair-In-Place Facility (Work Authorization No. 31)

This work authorization provides construction phase and engineering services throughout the construction duration of the Olmito Switch Yard and Repair-In-Place (RIP) Facility by providing responses to the contractor's Requests for Information, Shop Drawing Review and As-Built construction plans. Also, HNTB will provide a records keeping process through the use of DashPort.

• TxDOT authorized the County to proceed with bidding the project.

Port Access Road RFIs, Shop Drawing Review (Work Authorization No. 32)

This Work Authorization provides engineering services associated with construction phase services for the construction of the Port Access Road. The Port Access Road is presently under construction and the GEC will respond to Requests for Information (RFIs) from the contractor and will review shop drawings on an as needed basis.

 Bridge work on hold per contractor request for convenience, associated with McAllen's work on the adjacent TxDOT section of SH 550 Port Spur project.

West Rail Bypass, CI (Work Authorization No. 33)

This work authorization provides professional services associated with construction inspection phase work for the West Rail Bypass.

• The drilled shaft sub contractor has completed the shafts for all bents except #41. The shafts for bent #41 have been the point of discussion for some time. The contractor submitted another proposal for the placement of these drilled shafts and we have accepted that. We are expecting the bent 41 drilled shafts to restart during the week of August 8, 2011. The columns and caps have been placed at Bents 42, 52 and 53.

- The building sub contractor began building the DHS facility. The foundation was poured on April 29, 20111. We have developed an acceptable door hardware package. The door hardware is approved, and ordered the contractor began begin construction of the exterior walls during the week of the August 1st.
- The earthwork subcontractor has completed the embankment for the track construction from the North tie in to south of the old floodway crossing. The first and second lifts of Subballast have been placed over the area from the North tie in to New Carmen Road including the South Wye. They have made a lot of progress on the drainage work a few headwalls and the Siphon and culverts for CCID #6 channel are all that remains.

SH 32 East Loop Pass Through Negotiation (Work Authorization No. 34)

This work authorization provided professional services and deliverables associated with negotiating a final pass through agreement with TxDOT. CCRMA received a fully executed Pass Through Agreement from TxDOT dated January 25, 2011.

This effort is complete and the contract is closed.

Outer Parkway Study (Work Authorization No. 36)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with a study for the Outer Parkway. The study is to be performed in a three phase effort to deliver a schematic design for the Outer Parkway project. The phases are:

Phase I includes field investigations, constraints mapping and technical evaluations necessary to identify a recommended ½ mile wide corridor for the proposed Outer Parkway. Phase II will include the refinement of the corridor identified in Phase I (by narrowing the corridor down from ½ mile wide to 1,000 feet wide). During this phase, property owners in the immediate vicinity of the project will be notified and afforded an opportunity to provide feedback.

During Phase III, a specific alignment will be developed and a right-of-way footprint established. Phase III will include the development of the schematic design, environmental permitting, agency coordination, and the appropriate environmental documentation for connections to roadways on the State Highway System.

Standard Agency Letter of Agreement
