Mr. Sepulveda gave a detailed explanation on request from the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and commented that the Texas Transportation Commission might select projects to be funded during their October Commission meeting in Fort Worth. There are \$1.8 billion available in the Proposition 12 Funds. Projects to be selected will probably be either classified under Congestion Projects or Connectivity Projects, with U.S. 77 being a Connectivity Project.

Mr. Mario Jorge, TxDOT Pharr District Engineer, made several comments regarding the U.S. 77 Project. Environment Clearance is expected on November of 2010, and if work on the Design and Engineering can proceed and be ready within one (1) year and after that the project will be ready for construction conditional on Proposition 12 Funding.

Director Scale moved to approve funding for engineering/design expenditures conditional on receiving funding from Proposition 12 or other funding sources and instruct our Financial Advisor to develop a plan to fund such expenditures. Additionally, instructing Legal to produce the necessary agreements to be executed that would allow CCRMA to work outside Cameron County.

The following is a summary of our progress on the subject projects for the month of September, 2009.

#### **Project Management:**

#### **General GEC**

- Prepared contract correspondence and monthly GEC progress report.
- Prepared & submitted CCRMA GEC Invoice for work performed on Work Authorization Nos. 7, 13,14,16,17,18,19, 20, 21, and 22.
- Updated and submitted August 2009 GEC work authorization status report.
- On September 16 Richard Ridings, Bobby Balli, and Loretta Schietinger attended the Board Meeting where Mr. Ridings and Mr. Balli presented the GEC status report.
- On September 14 Loretta Schietinger and Dan Baker arranged a tour of Illinois State Toll
  Highway Authority's main office and toll collection system for David Garcia and board
  member Gallegos.
- Richard Ridings and Stacey Benningfield developed the agenda and attended weekly conference calls with TxDOT
- HNTB continues to attend numerous meetings and correspond with RMA staff and others to support the RMA's efforts.

#### FM 509 Project (Work Authorization No. 5)

The FM 509 project is a relief route around the north and east areas of the City of Harlingen that would construct FM 509, in Cameron County, from US 77 to the Intersection with FM 508. The proposed facility would consist of a four-lane roadway with directions of travel separated by a center median. Dependent upon traffic projections, an interim facility with fewer lanes may initially be constructed. Interchanges or grade separations would be constructed at major thoroughfares. As proposed, the right-of-way would be 300-feet wide (usual) and sufficient to accommodate future transportation needs; however, any future improvements would be subject to environmental review. This could include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, general purpose lanes, truck lanes, or some combination of these modes.

- HNTB received additional comments from ENV
- HNTB is working with TxDOT Pharr District in the development of responses.
- It is recommended that a supplement to start on Schematic work be issued to allow the project to stay on schedule.

#### **West Parkway Project:**

The proposed West Parkway is a new location facility and will provide a four-lane controlled access parkway with interchanges and connections at strategic locations and grade separation structures for several crossing streets in Brownsville. The majority of the project alignment falls within or in the vicinity of the existing Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way. Negotiations are underway to relocate the railroad and donate the right-of-way to the county for the project.

#### West Parkway EA/Schematic (Work Authorization No. 7):

This Work Authorization provides for the development of a Schematic and Environmental Assessment based on the project design developed during by TxDOT and detailed in the value engineering report.

- Minor changes were made to the schematic and cost estimates prepared to respond to access concerns.
- The Draft EA will be updated as information from the additional public involvement effort (WA 18) produces results.
- Detailed schematic work is on hold (with the exception of minor revisions to address comments from public meetings) until a preferred alternative is selected.
- Revisions to the schematic and EA due to design changes resulting from public comment and typical section changes will require a supplement.

#### West Parkway Public Involvement (Work Authorization No. 18):

This Work Authorization provides community involvement services through a series of neighborhood meetings, focus group meetings, and one on one meetings to develop a two-way dialogue with the public to inform them of the need and purpose of the project and to gather their ideas on how the West Parkway can become a valuable community asset.

- HNTB prepared and published notices of the October 13 public meeting.
- HNTB and Rifeline are preparing a PowerPoint presentation for use at the Public Meeting which adds information obtained from the Neighborhood meetings and Focus group meetings to the existing Power Point.
- Focus Group meetings and One-on-One meetings were documented and started to address comments from interested stakeholders with regard to the development of the West Parkway Project.

#### West Rail (Work Authorization No. 16):

This Work Authorization provides additional professional services and deliverables for the West Rail Relocation project. Work includes utility coordination and evaluation, siphon extension design, DHS building site items, and surveying.

- HNTB has coordinated with utility owners in conflict as below:
  - TransMontaigne
    - o HNTB discussed the potential design with Harrison Farrar of TransMontaigne. Although Harrison did not provide the construction estimate the week of August 31st, he stated that it would be provided by the end of September.
- HNTB submitted the siphon extensions to TxDOT, UPRR, and the Cameron County Irrigation District for review and comment.
- HNTB submitted building site items to TxDOT and UPRR for review and comment.
- A supplement has been submitted for approval for work associated with previously nonscoped tasks such as: Spanish/Metric translation of plans, access road design, and additional TxDOT coordination.

#### West Rail Relocation International Coordination (Work Authorization No. 8):

This Work Authorization provides appropriate subconsultant(s) for staff coordination with the Mexican agencies to monitor and determine project schedules, permit requirements, funding technical agreements and design for the West Rail Relocation around Brownsville, Texas. The project plans will require approval by Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes (SCT), Comisión Internacional de Limites Y Aguas (CILA) and Kansas City Southern Mexico (KCSM).

- Dr. de las Fuentes continues to facilitate discussions between the CNA (Comision Nacional de Aguas), CONAGUA and CILA as well as the SCT and the project's engineering staff on both sides of the border. All documents, plans and information have been submitted and Dr. de las Fuentes will continue to expedite CILA and CONAGUA approval through constant contact.
- Several meetings were attended by Dr. de las Fuentes including:
  - o The monthly meeting with SCT concerning the Northeast Concessionary package

#### TxDOT Project Development Agreement for I69 CDA (Work Authorization No. 13):

This Work Authorization provides support to the Authority and its Legal and Financial Advisors in the development of a Project Development Agreement (PDA) between the Authority and TxDOT concerning the development of the Port Spur, West Loop, and US 77 Improvements projects

- Richard Ridings and Mike Weaver have been following efforts by TxDOT
- There is meeting scheduled for October 1 to begin discussions with TxDOT concerning the CCRMA's projects which are included in the CDA
- The GEC is preparing information for a workshop which will detail the approach to legal, financial, and engineering requirements to continue implementation of SH 550, the West Parkway project and SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> access. This information will be presented at the October 7 board workshop.

#### SH 550 Re-Evaluation (Work Authorization No. 15):

This Work Authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's development of the SH 550 toll project from US 77/83 to State Highway 48 and the proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work includes the preparation of an Environmental Assessment Re-evaluation focusing on the effects of tolling the project, preparation of a wetlands report, and development of a mitigation plan/Section 404 permit application.

- An "Opportunity for Public Hearing" notice was published this month.
- Stacey Benningfield and Richard Ridings participate in weekly conference calls with TxDOT to discuss the status of obtaining permits.
- There have been several meetings with TxDOT, the Port of Brownsville, and the Corps of Engineers concerning wetland mitigation efforts.
- Representatives of the GEC and TxDOT met with representatives of the Corp of Engineers in the field to review wetland delineation.

#### SH 550 Signing and Gantry Design (Work Authorization No. 21):

This Work Authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's tolling of the SH 550 from US 77/83 to State Highway 48 and the proposed

entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work includes the preparation of plans, specifications, and estimates for gantry, signing, conduit, and paving required for tolling of the main lanes. These will be included in the design package that TxDOT is currently completing and plans on letting using ARRA funds early in 2010. Supplement 1 to this WA includes the development of gantry and signage plans for change order into the current project under construction at the FM 1847 overpass as well as developing a plan for toll systems integration and customer service center implementation.

- The GEC responded to comments on the design of the gantry at the port spur. These should be under construction utilizing stimulus funds early next year.
- The GEC are in the final stages of completing the plans for the change order of gantry and toll signage for the FM 1847 overpass.
- The GEC met with TxDOT representatives in the field to discuss design issues for the change order.
- Cost estimates have been prepared for use in the financial assistance agreement between CCRMA and TxDOT for incorporating gantries on FM 1847.
- The GEC has begun scheduling tours of other Texas toll agency systems for CCRMA staff and board members. A tour of the Illinois toll system was arranged.
- An approach to procurement for systems integration has been started.

#### South Padre Island Second Access Phase 3A (Work Authorization No. 17):

This Work Authorization provides engineering and environmental services associated with the development and advancement of the NEPA process for the proposed South Padre Island (SPI) 2nd Access Project in Cameron County, Texas. The proposed Project will provide important congestion relief for the Queen Isabella Memorial Causeway. The proposed SPI 2nd Access Project will also serve as a critical alternative evacuation route from the island in times of disaster, hurricanes, and other emergencies. The tasks associated with the Project will include the development of the necessary environmental documentation, corridor alternatives assessments, and related public involvement activities.

This Work Authorization continues the environmental and corridor alternatives assessment tasks necessary to advance the project to a selection of a Recommended Preferred Alternative and ultimately to a Record of Decision (ROD). After the selection of a Preferred Alternative a supplement for schematic design will be required.

Accomplished this month:

- The Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) continues to be developed with the anticipated submittal date in early November. Text and figures on all aspects of the report continue to be refined and checked. Meetings held in September include: a NEPA TWG, a meeting with Fish and Wildlife, and the Steering Committee meeting.
- Engineering and environmental data transferred to maps and plans.
- Meetings held in September include: NEPA TWG and a coordination meeting with the USFWS regarding ocelot crossings.
- Comments from the NEPA and Fish and wildlife led to additional modal Alternatives
   Analysis on Ferry, Rail, and Tunnel options and some alternative alignment shifts to avoid
   sensitive area.
- Historic Structure field reviews and report preparation ongoing. Report being revised to reflect refinements to alternatives based on NEPA TWG comments. Report will be submitted to TxDOT in October. Alternative alignments and cost estimates have been prepared and continue to be refined.

#### North Rail Relocation Project

North Rail Relocation Project relocates the existing and operating freight rail lines away from incorporated and unincorporated areas of Cameron County, Texas, in particular in and around Harlingen. Texas. An effective relocation of the existing freight rail facility will not only improve freight rail operations to and from the US/Mexico border, but may aid in the enhancement of air quality for the area, improve the safety of the traveling public with regard to the freight rail/passenger interface, improve the response time of emergency vehicles, minimize if not eliminate the transport of hazardous material via freight rail through towns, improve traffic congestion, and ultimately enhance the economic development of the region.

#### Olmito Switchyard Letter of Continuance (Work Authorization No. 20):

This Work Authorization provides for development of a Statement of Continuous Activity for the Olmito Switchyard which has received ARRA funds.

- Provided additional information to ENV TxDOT for concurrence on continuous activity.
- Awaiting comment or concurrence.

#### TIGER Grant Application (Work Authorization No. 22):

This Work Authorization provides for the preparation of one application for Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) discretionary grant for CCRMA's Railroad Relocation Projects including West Rail Relocation and North Rail switch yards.

- Work complete.
- Application was submitted on September 11.
- Selection by DOT anticipated between now and February 2010.

#### **Consultant Management:**

- Continued ongoing coordination with all subconsultants.
- Updated Progress Report Sheet that is utilized to provide project status to the CCRMA Board of Directors.

#### **Agency Coordination:**

 Conducted ongoing discussions with CCRMA staff, TxDOT staff, TTA staff and subconsultants for preparation of SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project, West Parkway Project and West Rail Project.

Description: The FM 509 project is a relief route around the north and east areas of the City of Harlingen that would construct FM 509, in Cameron County, from US 77 to the intersection with FM 508. the proposed facility would consist of a four-lane roadway with directions of travel separated by a center median. Consideration and approval of funding engineering expenses for the Texas Department of Transportation associated with the design of two segments of U.S. 77.

Last week I met with Mario Jorge, District Engineer for TXDOT to discuss several transportation issues.

During this meeting we discussed a draft project development plan for the proposed US 77 highway upgrade that he has been working on. His development plan was detailed with cost estimates of each facility that needs to be upgraded from Cameron County to Nueces County.

As it stands today there is a possibility that environmental clearance can occur for this project around November 2010 timeframe.

Given this scenario of potential environmental clearance, the necessary PS&E work for the upgrades need to be underway and complete to coincide with this late 2010 timeframe in order to let a project and go to construction.

TXDOT has available funding for several portions of the engineering design work that are in the Cameron and Willacy County areas.

They do not, however, have the funding in place to ramp up the design work in the Kenedy County area. Mr. Jorge has identified two segments in this area where he would like to request funding assistance from the CCRMA to primarily accelerate the design work. The estimate from the CCRMA for this would be approximately \$5 million.

The plan and intention is to work on finding some construction funds for the projects where design is or will be complete.

In the next few months and possibly as early as October, TXDOT will decide on how to use the monies available from the Proposition 12 funds. Mr. Jorge feels that if we show TXDOT that we are willing to spend some of our local monies on design, to get the project to construction, that TXDOT will find some funding from this Prop 12 program for segments of US 77.

These monies are reimburseable or can be recaptured if a project development agreement occurs with a private developer.

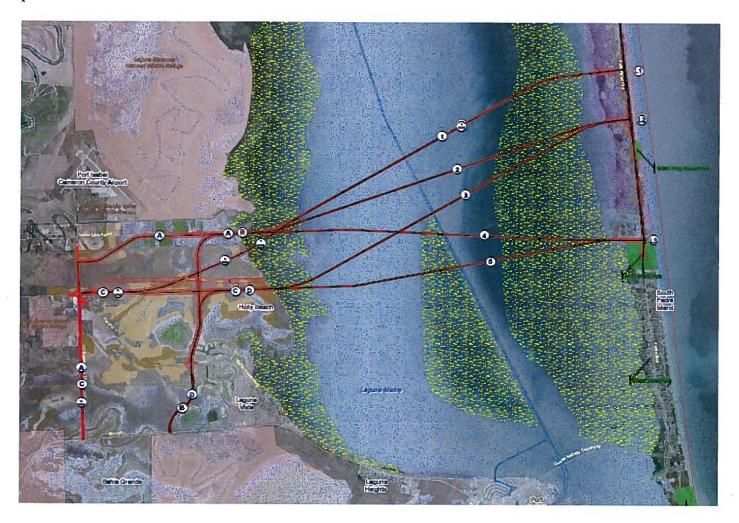
