VII. Consideration and Acknowledgement of GEC Report for the month of September 2010

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Coordinator introduced this item and Mr. Richard Ridings, with HNTB, went over in detail the status of every project the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority is working on. Mr. Jimmy Berry, with HNTB, went over a power point presentation for the Olmito Switchyard Expansion Project. Mr. Robert Macheska with L&G Engineers went over a power point presentation on the status of the Port Access Road Project.

After a brief discussion with the Board, Director Alvarez made a motion to acknowledge the GEC Report for the month of September 2010. The motion was seconded by Director Parker and carried unanimously.

The Report is as follows:		

VIII. Consideration and Approval of a Resolution authorizing the issuance of a Request for Qualifications for a Comprehensive Development Agreement for SH 550 and Pre-Development Work for Five Additional Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Projects (West Parkway, Outer Parkway, South Padre Island 2nd Access, 281 Connector and US 77 Relief Routes at Driscoll and Riviera)

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Coordinator introduced the item and gave a detailed presentation on the details of the CDA RFQ. Mr. Sepulveda stated that the CDA RFQ was seeking experienced developer teams with the proven ability to develop, design, construct, finance and potentially operate/maintain the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority's SH 550 Project and provide pre-development services for up to five additional Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Toll Road Projects. The teams chosen to participate in the second phase of this process must demonstrate a minimum capability to finance \$1 billion dollars of Toll Road Projects. The Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority anticipates providing financial partnership through Toll Road Revenue Bonds, State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) loans, loans under the Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) and/or other Federal or State funding. Additionally, the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority is working with Cameron County to establish one or more Transportation Reinvestment Zones (TRZ's) to assist in the long term financial success of these toll projects. The Program would include toll projects related to SH 550, U.S. 77 Relief Routes at Driscoll and Riviera, West Parkway, Outer Parkway, South Padre 2nd Access, and the 281 Connector with the environmentally approved, SH 550, with an approximate length of 6.5 miles being ready for construction. The Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority's intention is to be a financial partner in the process and together the Developer and the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority will determine the optimal means to ultimately accomplish the design, construction, financing, and/or operations and maintenance of the projects within the Program.

Key dates are as follows:

RFQ Release Date – October 25, 2010 Pre-QS Workshop – November 9, 2010 QS Due Date – November 29, 2010

Mr. Sepulveda went over the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority CDA Program Map and the Proposed TRZ Boundary Map. Mr. Sepulveda then went into detail on the six projects that can potentially be included in the CDA and gave a description of every project including project configuration, number of tolled lanes, approximate length in miles, anticipated environmental approval and estimated construction costs. Mr. Sepulveda made it clear that the estimated construction costs did not include design, right of way acquisition, toll collection system installation or

integration, utility adjustments, environmental mitigation, finance or operations and maintenance costs. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned that the estimates are for informational purposes only and not a substitute for the Proposer's own estimates of project costs.

Mr. Sepulveda mentioned to the Board that the CDA would be a revenue sharing concession agreement for approximately 52 years. Mr. Sepulveda went over the CDA requirements, Federal requirements, liability, insurance, bonds and letters of credit as well as Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) requirements. Mr. Sepulveda also discussed the overall process and the fact that the procurement will involve a two step process: the RFQ followed by a Request for a Detailed Proposal. The procurement schedule is as follows:

Issue RFQ – October 25, 2010

Pre QS Workshop – November 9, 2010

QS due to CCRMA – November 29, 2010

Short list of Proposers submitted to CCRMA Board for approval – December 9, 2010

Issue draft RFDP (Industry Review) – December 9, 2010

Issue RFDP – February 1, 2011

Receive RFDP responses – April 8, 2011

Present recommendation to CCRMA Board – May 12, 2011

Present negotiated contract to CCRMA Board – June 9, 2011

Secure AG approval and execute contract – August 18, 2011.

The designated project representative that will address questions and requests for clarification will be Pete Sepulveda, Jr., CCRMA Coordinator.

Mr. Sepulveda went over the evaluation process and criteria including the responsiveness and pass/fail review procedures established. Mr. Sepulveda described the qualifications evaluation criteria and weighting and that the general experience will have a 70% weighting and that conceptual project development would have a 30% weighting. Mr. Sepulveda then went over the procedures that will be utilized for evaluation and how changes in the conceptual project development plan and changes in the Proposer's organization and key personnel will be handled.

Mr. Brian Cassidy, with Locke Lord Bissell & Liddell LLP, went over the section pertaining to improper communications and contacts and went over the specific rules of contact. Mr. Cassidy stated that commencing with the issuance of the RFQ and continuing until the earliest of award and execution of the CDA, rejection of all Proposals by the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority, or cancellation of the procurement, no Proposer or representative thereof shall have any ex parte communications regarding the RFQ, RFDP, the CDA or the procurement described herein with any member of the Cameron County Commissioners Court, the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Board of Directors, or with any Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Staff, Advisors, Contractors or Consultants, involved with the procurement, except for communications expressly permitted by the RFQ or RFDP or except as approved in advance by the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Coordinator, in his sole discretion. Mr. Cassidy discussed organizational conflicts of interest as well.

Mr. Sepulveda then went over the procedures for protests, including the applicability, required early communication for certain protests, deadline for protests, content of protests, filing of protests, comments from other Proposers, burden of proof, decision of protest, payment of protest costs, rights and obligations of Proposers.

Mr. Sepulveda then stated that the RFQ does not commit the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority to enter into a contract or proceed with the procurements described herein. The Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority assumes no obligations, responsibilities, and liabilities, fiscal or otherwise, to reimburse all or part of the costs incurred or alleged to have been incurred by parties considering response to and/or responding to this RFQ, or any subsequent RFDP. All of such costs shall be borne soley by each Proposer. In no event shall the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority be bound by, or liable for, any obligations with respect to the Project until such time (if at

all) as a CDA, in form and substance satisfactory to the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority, has been executed and authorized by the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority and then only to the extent set forth herein.

A discussion ensued with the Board in regards to the RFQ. Director Gallegos moved to approve the release of the CDA RFQ contingent upon Legal (Brian Cassidy) and Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Coordinator's changes after working out organizational conflict of interest issues. Motion was seconded by Director Scaief and carried unanimously. Chairman Allex assigned Director Gallegos and Director Parker to work with Legal (Brian Cassidy) and Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Staff.

CONSIDERATION ON **APPROVAL OF** MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY AND THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (TxDOT) WHEREBY THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL **MOBILITY AUTHORITY** WILL **ADOPT** TxDOT'S **DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE)** PROGRAM AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION **AUTHORIZING THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY COORDINATOR TO EXECUTE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING THE ADOPTION OF THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S FEDERALLY-APPROVED DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM BY THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY

This Memorandum of Understanding is by and between the TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ("TxDOT"), an agency of the State of Texas; and the CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY ("CCRMA"), a political subdivision of the State of Texas.

Whereas, from time to time the CCMRA receives federal funds from the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") through TxDOT to assist the CCRMA with the construction and design of projects partially or wholly funded through FHWA; and

Whereas, the CCRMA, as a sub-recipient of federal funds, is required by 49 CFR 26, to implement a program for disadvantaged business enterprises ("DBEs"), as defined by 49 CFR 26 ("DBE Program"); and

Whereas, TxDOT has implemented a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program (DBE Program) that is approved by the FHWA pursuant to 49 CFR part 26; and

Whereas, certain aspects of the CCRMA's procurement of construction and design services are subject to review and/or concurrence by TxDOT as a condition of receiving federal funds from FHWA through TxDOT; and

Whereas, the CCRMA and TxDOT undertake substantially similar roadway construction projects and design projects and construct and design their respective projects using substantially the same pool of contractors; and

Whereas, the CCRMA desires to implement a federally compliant DBE Program by adopting the TxDOT approved program, as recommended by FHWA; and

Whereas, TxDOT and the CCRMA find it appropriate to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding to memorialize the obligations, expectations and rights each has as related to the CCRMA's adoption of the TxDOT DBE Program to meet the federal requirements;

Now, therefore, TxDOT and the CCRMA, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions made herein, agree to and acknowledge the following:

- (1) TxDOT has developed a DBE Program and annually establishes a DBE goal for Texas that is federally approved and compliant with 49 CFR 26 and other applicable laws and regulations.
- (2) The CCRMA is a sub-recipient of federal assistance for construction projects and design projects and, in accordance with 49 CFR § 26.21, must comply with a federally approved DBE Program. The CCRMA receives its federal assistance through TxDOT. As a sub-recipient, the CCRMA has the option of developing its own program or adopting and operating under TxDOT's federally approved DBE Program. The FHWA recommends that sub-recipients, such as the CCRMA, adopt the DBE program, administered through TxDOT, and the CCRMA by its prescribed protocol adopted the TxDOT DBE Program on September 30, 2010.

DBE/MOU 5/28/10

- (3) This Memorandum of Understanding evidences FHWA's and TxDOT's consent to the adoption of the TxDOT DBE Program by the CCRMA to achieve its DBE participation in federally assisted Construction and Design Projects.
- (4) The parties will work together in good faith to assure effective and efficient implementation of the DBE Program for the CCRMA and for TxDOT.
- (5) The CCRMA and TxDOT have agreed upon the following delegation of responsibilities and obligations in the administration of the DBE Program adopted by the CCRMA:
 - (a) The CCRMA will be responsible for project monitoring and data reporting to TxDOT. The CCRMA will furnish to TxDOT any required DBE contractor compliance reports, documents or other information as may be required from time to time to comply with federal regulations. TxDOT will provide the necessary and appropriate reporting forms, to the CCRMA.
 - (b) The CCRMA will recommend contract-specific DBE goals consistent with TxDOT's DBE guidelines and in consideration of the local market, project size, and nature of the good(s) or service(s) to be acquired. The CCRMA's recommendation may be that no DBE goals are set on any particular project or portion of a project or that proposed DBE goals be modified. The CCRMA and TxDOT will work together to achieve a mutually acceptable goal, however, TxDOT will retain final decision-making authority regarding DBE goals.
 - (c) TxDOT will cooperate with the CCRMA in an effort to meet the timing and other requirements of CCRMA projects.
 - (d) The CCRMA will be solely responsible for the solicitation and structuring of bids and bid documents to procure goods and services for its projects that use federal funds and will be responsible for all costs and expenses incurred in its procurements.
 - (e) The DBEs eligible to participate on TxDOT construction projects or design projects also will be eligible to participate on the CCRMA's construction projects or design projects subject to the DBE Program. The DBEs will be listed on TxDOT's website under the Texas Unified Certification Program (TUCP).
 - (f) The CCRMA will conduct reviews and provide reports with recommendations to TxDOT concerning any DBE Program compliance issues that may arise due to project specific requirements such as Good Faith Effort (GFE), Commercially Useful Function (CUF), etc. The CCRMA and TxDOT will work together to achieve a mutually acceptable goal, however, TxDOT will retain final decision-making authority on those issues and reserves the right to perform compliance reviews. The CCRMA shall provide TxDOT with a listing of sanctions that will be assessed against contractors for violation of federal DBE regulations and its procedures for investigation of violations and assessment of sanctions for documented violations. The CCRMA will require contractors for its FHWA federally assisted projects to use the attached forms as follows:
 - Attachment 1 Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program Commitment Agreement Form SMS 4901
 - Attachment 2 DBE Monthly Progress Report Form SMS 4903
 - Attachment 3 DBE Final Report Form SMS 4904

Attachment 4 - Prompt Payment Certification Form (Federal-air Projects) 2177

- (g) The CCRMA will designate a liaison officer to coordinate efforts with TxDOT's DBE Program administrators and to respond to questions from the public and private sector regarding the CCRMA's administration of the DBE Program through TxDOT.
- (h) The CCRMA will be responsible for providing TxDOT with DBE project awards and DBE Commitments, monthly DBE reports, DBE Final Reports, DBE shortfall reports, and annual and updated goal analysis and reports.
- (i) TxDOT will be responsible for maintaining a directory of firms eligible to participate in the DBE Program, and providing business development and outreach programs. The CCRMA and TxDOT will work cooperatively to provide supportive services and outreach to DBE firms in the CCRMA's area.
- (j) The CCRMA will submit DBE semi-annual progress reports to TxDOT.
- (k) The CCRMA will participate in TxDOT sponsored training classes to include topics on Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, DBE Annual Goals, DBE Goal Setting for Construction Projects and Design Projects, DBE Contract Provisions, and DBE Contract Compliance, which may include issues such as DBE Commitments, DBE Substitution, and Final DBE Clearance. TxDOT will include DBE contractors performing work on CCRMA projects in the DBE Education and Outreach Programs.
- (l) The RMA Coordinator of the CCRMA will implement all federal requirements , including those stated in Attachments A through F, which are incorporated as though fully set out herein for all purposes.
- (m) In accordance with 23 CFR 200.1, the CCRMA shall develop procedures for the collection of statistical data (race, color, religion, sex, and national origin) of participants in , and beneficiaries of Sate highway programs, i.e., relocatees, impacted citizens and affected communities; develop a program to conduct Title VI review of program areas; and conduct annual reviews of special emphasis program areas to determine the effectiveness of program area activities at all levels. TxDOT, in accordance with federal law, may conduct compliance reviews by TxDOT's OCR.
- (n) The CCRMA will comply with 49 CFR 26.29 as stated in Attachment F.
- (6) In the event there is a disagreement between TxDOT and the CCRMA about the implementation of the TxDOT DBE Program by the CCRMA the parties agree to meet within ten (10) days of receiving a written request from the other party of a desire to meet to resolve any disagreement. The parties will make good faith efforts to resolve any disagreement as efficiently as is reasonably possible in consultation with FHWA. Non-compliance by the CCRMA can result in restitution of federal funds to TxDOT and withholding of further federal funds upon consultation with FHWA.
- (7) This Memorandum of Understanding becomes effective upon execution by all parties and automatically renews each year unless a party notifies the other parties of its intent to terminate the agreement.
 - (8) If this Memorandum of Understanding is terminated for any reason, the CCRMA will be

allowed reasonable time in which to seek approval from FHWA for an alternative DBE Program, without being deemed non-compliant with49 CFR Part 26.

- (9) This Memorandum of Understanding applies only to projects for which the CCRMA is a sub-recipient of federal funds through TxDOT. The CCRMA may also implement a Minority and Women-Owned Small Business Enterprise (M/W/SBE) policy and program that applies to projects for which it is not a sub-recipient of federal funds through TxDOT and which are not subject to the TxDOT DBE Program. The CCRMA may, at its option, use some aspects of the TxDOT DBE Program and other similar programs in implementing its other policies and programs for its non-federally funded projects.

- (b) Notice by personal delivery or hand delivery shall be deemed effective immediately upon delivery, provided notice is given as required by Paragraph (a) hereof. Notice by registered or certified mail shall be deemed effective three (3) days after deposit in a U.S. mailbox or U.S. Post Office, provided notice is given as required by Paragraph (a) hereof.
- (c) Either party hereto may change its address by giving notice as provided herein.
- (12) This Memorandum of Understanding may be modified or amended only by written instrument, signed by both the CCRMA and the Texas Department of Transportation and dated subsequent to the effective date(s) of this MOU. Except as authorized by the respective parties, no official, employee, agent, or representative of the parties has any authority, either express or implied, to modify or amend this MOU.
- (13) The provisions of this MOU are severable. If any clause, sentence, provision, paragraph, or article of this MOU, or the application of this MOU to any person or circumstance is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable for any reason, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not impair, invalidate, nullify, or otherwise affect the remainder of this MOU, but the effect thereof shall be limited to the clause, sentence, provision, paragraph, or article so held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, and the application of such clause, sentence, provision, paragraph, or article to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected; provided, however, the CCRMA and TxDOT may mutually agree to terminate this Memorandum of Understanding.
 - (14) The following provisions apply in regard to construction of this MOU:
 - (a) Words of any gender in this MOU shall be construed to include the other, and words in either number shall be construed to include the other, unless the context in this MOU clearly requires otherwise.
 - (b) When any period of time is stated in this MOU, the time shall be computed to exclude the first day and include the last day of the period. If the last day of any period falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or national holiday, or state or county holiday, these days shall be omitted from the computation. All hours stated in this MOU are stated in Central Standard Time or in Central Daylight Savings Time, as applicable.
- (15) This Memorandum of Understanding shall not be construed in any way as a waiver by the parties of any immunity from suit or liability that parties may have by operation of law, and the

parties hereby retain all of their respective affirmative defenses.

The following is a summary of our progress on the subject projects for the month of September 2010.

Project Management:

General GEC

- Prepared contract correspondence and monthly GEC progress report.
- Prepared & submitted CCRMA GEC Invoice for work performed on Work Authorization Nos. 7, 8, 13, 16, 17, 21, 23, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 34 and 36.
- Updated and submitted August 2010 GEC work authorization status report.
- On September 16, Richard Ridings, Jimmy Berry and Van Short attended the Special Board Meeting. Mr. Ridings presented the August GEC Report and presented various agenda items. Jimmy Berry gave a report on the construction status of the Olmito Switch Yard.
- On September 30, Richard Ridings, Jimmy Berry, Van Short, Bobby Balli, Mike Weaver (Prime Strategies (PSI)) and Jon Hockenyos (TXP) attended the Special Board Meeting. FM 509 Project (Work Authorization No. 5)

The FM 509 project is a relief route around the north and east areas of the City of Harlingen that would construct an extension of FM 509, in Cameron County, from US 77 to the Intersection with FM 508. The proposed facility would consist of a four-lane roadway with directions of travel separated by a center median. Dependent upon traffic projections, an interim facility with fewer lanes may initially be constructed. Interchanges or grade separations would be constructed at major thoroughfares. As proposed, the right-of-way would be 300-feet wide (usual) and sufficient to accommodate future transportation needs; however, any future improvements would be subject to environmental review. This could include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, general purpose lanes, truck lanes, or some combination of these modes.

• HNTB is currently working on a Work Authorization for preliminary development of the Outer Parkway. This project would provide a greater economic benefit to the area and establish a corridor along similar alignment yet would continue along the North side of Cameron County to the future SPI 2nd Access. The recommended alternative alignment for the north-south section of FM 509 is being utilized as a connection to the the future Outer Parkway to the existing FM 509 corridor and the north-south section of the recommended alternative potential alignment for FM 509 is being considered as an option for the east-west Outer Parkway alignment. The HNTB team

is currently utilizing FM 509 environmental studies, constraint data, Lidar survey data, and right of way information for this endeavor.

West Parkway Project:

The proposed West Parkway is a new location facility and will provide a four-lane controlled access parkway with interchanges and connections at strategic locations and grade separation structures for several crossing streets in Brownsville. The majority of the project alignment falls within or in the vicinity of the existing Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way. Negotiations are underway to relocate the railroad and donate the right-of-way to the county for the project.

West Parkway EA/Schematic (Work Authorization No. 7):

This Work Authorization provides for the development of a Schematic and Environmental Assessment based on the project design developed by TxDOT and detailed in the value engineering report.

• Continued with revisions to EA, schematic and typical section revisions/updates resulting from public outreach process and input provided from the Board (per SWA No. 4 to WA No. 7.) Draft document submitted for Pharr District review on September 29.

West Parkway Public Involvement (Work Authorization No. 18):

This Work Authorization provides community involvement services through a series of neighborhood meetings, focus group meetings, and one on one meetings to develop a two-way dialogue with the public to inform them of the need and purpose of the project and to gather their ideas on how the West Parkway can become a valuable community asset.

• This effort is complete and the contract is closed.

West Rail (Work Authorization No. 16):

This Work Authorization provides additional professional services and deliverables for the West Rail Relocation project. Work includes utility coordination and evaluation, siphon extension design, DHS building site items, and surveying.

- Coordination with utility owners with conflicts along the West Rail alignment is ongoing, such as TransMontaigne, Texas Gas Services, Brownsville Public Utilities Board and AEP Distribution. Texas Gas Service expects to have plans completed and ready for review by October 8. AT&T has completed their improvements, and VMUD has been given the notice to proceed with their improvements by the County.
- Coordination with the Department of Homeland Security is ongoing. DHS has provided specifications for fencing and lighting along the limits of the West Rail Bridge over the Rio Grande River. HNTB is in discussions with DHS on the impacts to the railroad and bridge. We are reviewing plan set for the change in gate location, fencing and lighting for the bridge and will then submit to DHS/CBP for their review.
- The Commissioners' Court awarded the contract to McCarthy Building Company, Inc. on September 30, 2010.

West Rail Relocation International Coordination (Work Authorization No. 8):

This Work Authorization provides appropriate subconsultant(s) for staff coordination with the Mexican agencies to monitor and determine project schedules, permit requirements, funding technical agreements and design for the West Rail Relocation around Brownsville, Texas. The project plans will require approval by Secretaria de Comunicaciones y Transportes (SCT), Comisión Internacional de Limites Y Aguas (CILA) and Kansas City Southern Mexico (KCSM).

- The advertisement for bids was published on August 26, with a letting date in late September and an expected construction start in late October.
- At the time this report was prepared, there were 2 to 3 parcels left for acquisition and were expected to be complete in mid-October.
- The agreement between the SCT and KCSM is expected to be signed the first part of October.
- Field visits were performed by UPRR and KCSM to determine the requirements of the agreement between both parties. Several phone conversations were facilitated between both parties on the agreement.
- On August 26th, a telephone conference was held between Engineer Juan Jose Erazo Garcia Cano of SCT and Pete Sepulveda to discuss the Binational Construction Agreement.
- The 37th Technical Review meeting was held on September 24th.

TxDOT Project Development Agreement for 169 CDA (Work Authorization No. 13):

This Work Authorization provides support to the Authority and its Legal and Financial Advisors in the development of a Project Development Agreement (PDA) between the Authority and TxDOT concerning the development of the SH 550, West Parkway, and US 77 Improvements projects

• The GEC was given a Notice to Proceed to begin the procurement process for a revenue sharing concession CDA for the I-69, SPI 2nd Access, West Parkway, SH 550, US 281 and Outer Parkway projects.

SH 550 Re-Evaluation (Work Authorization No. 15 & Supplements 1, 2 & 3):

This Work Authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's development of the SH 550 toll project from US 77/83'o State Highway 48 and the proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work includes the preparation of an Environmental Assessment Re-evaluation focusing on the effects of tolling the project, preparation of a wetlands report, and development of a mitigation plan/Section 404 permit application. Supplements 2 & 3 included the mitigation design and re-evaluation of the EA to include the mitigation site.

• All task items for this work authorization are complete. The executed Section 404 permit requires follow up items and continued coordination efforts; thus, a work authorization is necessary.

SH 550 Toll Systems Integration and Design (Work Authorization No. 21 & Sup 1 & 2):

This Work Authorization provides professional services and deliverables in support of the CCRMA's tolling of the SH 550 from US 77/83 to State Highway 48 and the proposed entrance to the Port of Brownsville. Work includes the preparation of plans, specifications, and estimates for gantry, signing, conduit, and paving required for tolling of the main lanes. These will be included in the design package that TxDOT is currently completing and plans on letting using ARRA funds early in 2010. Supplement 1 to this WA includes the development of gantry and signage plans for change order into the current project under construction at the FM 1847 overpass as well as developing a plan for toll systems integration and customer service center implementation. Supplements 2 and 3 to this WA include the development of interlocal agreements with CTRMA and TTA for the toll system implementation and TxTAG customer service.

Operationa

o Provided extensive edits and comments on the draft operations agreement between CCRMA and TTA

- o Worked with TTA to finalize costs and scope of operational work (these are formalized in the Operations agreement that is controlled by Brian Cassidy)

- o General Customer Service coordination with TTA, CTRMA and MSB

• Toll System Implementation

- o Facilitated Toll System Implementation meetings and did follow-up on open issues
- o Facilitated preconstruction meetings and coordination of follow-up items
- o Assisted CCRMA/Caseta and overall project scheduling
- o Assisted Caseta with TxDOT construction coordination at the tolling point
- Worked with Texas State DIR and local ATT project manager on communications circuits. Coordination of communications installation at the tolling point
- o Reviewed invoices and method of coordinated submission of invoices to CCRMA

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South Padre Island Second Access Phase 3A (Work Authorization No. 17):

This Work Authorization provides engineering and environmental services associated with the development and advancement of the NEPA process for the proposed South Padre Island (SPI) 2nd Access Project in Cameron County, Texas. The proposed Project will provide important congestion relief for the Queen Isabella Memorial Causeway. The proposed SPI 2nd Access Project will also serve as a critical alternative evacuation route from the island in times of disaster, hurricanes, and other emergencies. The tasks associated with the Project will include the development of the necessary environmental documentation, corridor alternatives assessments, and related public involvement activities.

This Work Authorization continues the environmental and corridor alternatives assessment tasks necessary to advance the project to a selection of a Recommended Preferred Alternative and ultimately to a Record of Decision (ROD). After the selection of a Preferred Alternative a supplement for schematic design will be required.

- The EIS is currently under review by the FHWA. Review comments are scheduled to be received September 17th.
- Coordination continues with sea grass experts to contract for the development of a shading model to help determine possible impacts caused by the shade of the bridge.
- Coordinated with SWCA on the Biological Assessment.
- Continued sea level rise analysis for inclusion in the EIS.
- Refinement of the construction cost estimates and schedule continues for the recommended preferred alternative.

Olmito Switchyard PS&E (Work Authorization No. 23 & Supplement No. 1):

This Work Authorization provides for the production of Plans, Specifications, and Estimates for the construction of addition rail and repair facilities in the Olmito Switchyard. Rail and grading plans were prepared to meet a March letting schedule. The repair facilities (RIP) will be included in a second set of plans for letting at a later date.

RIP Facility plans:

- Continuing production towards the 90%.
- Received approval from CCRMA on SWA No. 4 to WA No. 23 to continue work on local permit and
 off-site utilities.

- TxDOT has approved proceeding with change orders to complete the RIP construction by: 1) awarding Byler the grading, drainage, track, and civil work; and 2) awarding McCarthy the RIP building and modular.
- Byler is in the process of obtaining a change order to construct the north access road
- Work Authorization has now been approved to proceed with the design of the off-site (water and sanitary) utility, permits, and landscape; BUT
 - o Arrangements have been made with the local utility to design and construct the water and sanitary to the south edge of the right of way along an existing county road easement; which,
 - o Would allow the County to pay for this work directly to the utility; meaning
 - o The off-site utility work just approved in the work authorization will need to be deleted but with enough funds to provide permitting and landscape work
- The RIP design needs to be completed (Austin Rail and Electrical, and Omaha Mechanical and Building) so these plans can be submitted to the Union Pacific Railroad for review, comments, and approval.

SH 550 PS&E (Work Authorization No. 24):

This Work Authorization provides engineering services for the preparation of plans, specifications and estimates (PS&E) for the construction of SH 550 tolled main lanes between existing frontage road lanes from US 77/83 to 0.5 mile north of FM 3248. The work will be performed in two phases as follows:

Phase 1 — Prepare a design summary report (DSR), typical sections, design layout, and preliminary cost estimate for the proposed SH 550 tolled main lanes.

<u>Phase 2 – Prepare PS&E package for letting based on approved typical sections and design layout from Phase 1.</u>

• NTP received for Phase 2 (Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 24) was received on September 30.

Port Access Road (Work Authorization No. 25):

This Work Authorization provides engineering services associated with the development of plans, specifications, and estimates for the construction of a new access drive from SH 48 into the Port of Brownsville. The CCRMA will construct the new \$2.5 M entrance into the Port of Brownsville in exchange for the donation of the SH 550 Port Spur ROW. TxDOT had initiated design of this entrance road but stopped design at an approximately 60% level of completion. The GEC has obtained TxDOT design files and will utilize them to complete a PS&E package for CCRMA letting in May

This Work Authorization is complete. No activity.

General Brant Road/FM 106 Extension (Work Authorization No. 26)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with the preparation of a categorical exclusion (to be reviewed by the Federal Highway Administration in anticipation of possible federal funding) and the completion of the Section 404 permitting process (including the development of a conceptual mitigation plan) for the project

• GEC has been coordinating with District on which data to use in order to complete responses to comments. GEC still waiting on response.

East Loop Pass Through Application (Work Authorization No. 27)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with reviewing and revising the 2009 application, and submitting it to TxDOT no later than May 11, 2010.

• This Work Authorization is complete. No activity.

Olmito Switch Yard Expansion Construction Inspection (Work Authorization No. 28)

This work authorization provides professional services associated with construction inspection phase work for the Olmito Switch Yard.

- The Contractor almost completed the excavation and embankment work on the project. He has started placement of Geo Grid for Subgrade stabilization and sub ballast over the Geo Grid.
- Change order number one processed through UP and County, Working with TxDOT to get their approval.
- Change order number two is being processed to incorporate the relocation of the illumination system. The work will be performed by BPUB. The contractor, the county has both agreed to the change order and it is being processed through TxDOT.
- The RIP Facility plans have been sent to the contractor to negotiate change order number three to the contract. Since the RIP facility was part of the Olmito Project and did not have a unique CSJ number, contracting for the RIP facility would require going through the MPO planning process to establish a unique CSJ number. This would delay the contracting of the RIP facility at least six months. By processing this as a change order, the construction of the RIP facility can proceeded as soon as the change order is approved. We are waiting on prices from the contractor to present to the County and TxDOT.

TIGER II Grant Application (Work Authorization No. 30)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with applying for a Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery II (TIGER II) grant.

No activity.

Port Access Road RFIs, Shop Drawing Review (Work Authorization No. 32)

This Work Authorization provides engineering services associated with construction phase services for the construction of the Port Access Road. The Port Access Road is presently under construction and the GEC will respond to Requests for Information (RFIs) from the contractor and will review shop drawings on an as needed basis.

- Coordination (phone calls, e-mails, and meetings) with L&G Engineers, McAllen Construction, and Port of Brownsville on various items.
- Attended meeting with Ariel Chavez (Port of Brownsville) on September 20.
- Attended and participated by phone in meeting with CCRMA, Port of Brownsville, and BRG RR staff on September 24.
 Responding to RFIs.

East Loop Pass Through Negotiation (Work Authorization No. 34)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with negotiating a final pass through agreement with TxDOT by July 23, 2010.

No activity.

Outer Parkway Study (Work Authorization No. 36)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with a study for the Outer Parkway. The study is to be performed in a three phase effort to deliver a schematic design for the Outer Parkway project. The phases are:

Phase I includes field investigations, constraints mapping and technical evaluations necessary to identify a recommended ½ mile wide corridor for the proposed Outer Parkway.

Phase II will include the refinement of the corridor identified in Phase I (by narrowing the corridor down from ½ mile wide to 1,000 feet wide). During this phase, property owners in the immediate vicinity of the project will be notified and afforded an opportunity to provide feedback.

During Phase III, a specific alignment will be developed and a right-of-way footprint established. Phase III will include the development of the schematic design, environmental permitting, agency coordination, and the appropriate environmental documentation for connections to roadways on the State Highway System.

- Developed environmental and development constraints map utilizing data from FM 509 constraints mapping.
- Initiated Corridor Identification Report
- Presented corridor constraints and preliminary route alternatives to RMA Board on September 30.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the CCRMA has been constituted in accordance with the Transportation Code and the RMA Rules; and

WHEREAS, the CCRMA is pursuing the development of the SH 550 Project; and

WHEREAS, the CCRMA is also working diligently to advance several other projects important to the region, including US 77 relief routes at Driscoll and Riviera, the West Parkway, the Outer Parkway, South Padre Island 2nd Access, and the 281 Connector (the "Additional Projects"); and

WHEREAS, Section 370.305 of the Texas Transportation Code authorizes a regional mobility authority to enter into a comprehensive development agreements ("CDA") with a private entity that, at a minimum, provides for the design and construction of a transportation project and may also provide for the financing, acquisition, maintenance, or operation of a transportation project; and

WHEREAS, Section 9 of the CCRMA's Policies and Procedures Governing Procurement of Goods and Services (the "CCRMA Procurement Policies") sets forth the process by which the CCRMA may solicit proposals related to a CDA through the issuance of a request for qualifications ("RFQ"); and

WHEREAS, the CCRMA Board of Directors desires to authorize the issuance of an RFQ to solicit proposals for (1) the development, design, construction, financing, and potentially the operation and maintenance of the SH 550 Project and (2) the provision of pre-development services with respect to the Additional Projects through a CDA.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the CCRMA hereby authorizes CCRMA staff and consultants to prepare and issue an RFQ for (1) the development, design, construction, financing, and potentially the operation and maintenance the SH 550 Project and (2) the provision of pre-development services with respect to the Additional Projects through a CDA; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that CCRMA staff and consultants are directed take such other actions as necessary to implement a process, consistent with Section 9.5 of the CCRMA Procurement Policies, to review the RFQ responses received, assess such responses based on the

criteria identified in the RFQ, and prepare a recommendation to the Board of Directors regarding a short-list of firms to further participate in the CDA process and to receive a request for detailed proposals ("RFDP") as set forth in Section 9.6 of the Procurement Policies; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no RFDP shall be issued without the prior approval of the CCRMA Board of Directors.

IX. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE ADOPTION OF THE CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES FOR THE 82ND TEXAS LEGISLATIVE SESSION

RMA Legislative Priorities 82nd Legislative Session

The following is a list of priorities for the 82nd Legislative Session:

- 1. <u>Primacy</u>: RMAs worked closely with Sen. Nichols last session to advance SB 17, which would have eliminated the "market valuation" process provided for in SB 792 and established an order of priority that would have given local toll project entities (LTPEs) the first option to develop toll projects within their regions. RMAs support advancing these concepts again, as it is critical to assure that local control will be maintained over toll projects and that toll revenues will remain within the areas they are generated.
- 2. Extension of CDA Authority: Concession CDA authority for RMAs expired August 31, 2009 (except for certain exempted projects) and Design/Build CDA authority will expire August 31, 2011. Design/Build CDA authority has been an important tool for delivery of RMA projects, and while the concession model has not been utilized at an RMA level to date, several areas are interested in at least retaining that option. It is noteworthy that both NTTA and county toll road authorities (including HCTRA) have CDA authority that is not subject to expiration, and there is no reason that RMAs should not have the same tools available as those other LTPEs.
- 3. **RMA Clean-up**: An RMA "clean-up" bill was filed last session (HB 2990/SB1669) which would have improved language in several sections of Chapter 370 related to project financing, added parking structures and TRZ projects to the list of authorized RMA projects, and given RMAs the same collection and enforcement tools as TxDOT, NTTA and HCTRA. RMAs will again support these improvements to its governing statute.
- 4. <u>Transportation Reinvestment Zones</u>: Transportation Reinvestment Zones (TRZs) offer an important tool for generating local funding for projects. As TxDOT's financial condition continues to deteriorate and communities struggle to find means to general local funding, the use of TRZs has become even more important. Currently TRZs are tied to the "pass-through" program, and have other statutory problems which require correction or improvement. RMAs supported HB 1810/SB 2378 last session which would have corrected many of the TRZ deficiencies; RMAs will support pursuing that legislation again.
- 5. Environmental Review Process: Increased attention has been given to the delays in project delivery (and associated costs) caused by prolonged review periods for environmental documents. RMAs supported SB 502 during the previous session which would have allowed RMAs and other LTPEs to "fund" positions at various state and federal entities to help to expedite project reviews. RMAs would support pursuing that legislation again, as well as other statutory changes which may help to establish

deadlines, formalize processes, and otherwise add efficiencies to the environmental review process.

Other issues which RMAs would like to see addressed during the 82nd Session:

- Funding: issue the remaining Prop 12 bond capacity; enhance the pass-through program, and pursue other options for additional funding.
- Improvements to toll violation, enforcement and collection procedures (and possible consolidation of statutes for different types of toll authorities).

Part 1. The CONSULTANT will provide the following engineering services:

The responsibilities of the AUTHORITY, the CONSULTANT and the schedule are further detailed in Exhibits A, B, C and D.

- Part 2. The compensation to be paid for the performance of the Services identified in Exhibit B is based upon direct salary cost times a multiplier as defined in the Agreement. Total compensation, including subconsultant costs and direct expenses, will not exceed \$116,016.00 unless mutually agreed to and authorized in writing by the Authority. A fee schedule used to establish the maximum amount payable is attached hereto as Exhibit D. HNTB may alter the compensation distribution between the phases, tasks and work assignments to be consistent with the Services actually rendered, within the total not to exceed amount.
- **Part 3.** Payment to the CONSULTANT for the services established under this Work Authorization No. 31 shall be made in accordance with the Agreement.
- **Part 4.** This Work Authorization No. 31 is effective as of September 23, 2010 and shall terminate May 31, 2011, unless extended by a Supplemental Work Authorization.
- Part 5. This Work Authorization does not waive the parties' responsibilities and obligations provided under the Agreement.
