# **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

#### 1 PUBLIC COMMENTS

Commissioner Pct. 1, Sofia C. Benavides addressed the Board and thanked Chairman Allex for his leadership the last eight years. Commissioner Benavides also thanked the Board for their role in ensuring the progress the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority has made on their comprehensive system of projects. Commissioner Benavides spoke about the SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project and expressed her support for the next phase of work that is required. Commissioner Benavides also spoke in support of the East Loop Project and the need to advance the project to the construction phase.

#### 2-A Consideration and Approval of the Minutes for:

October 25, 2013 – Special Meeting

Director Lopez moved to approve the Minutes for October 25, 2013. The motion was seconded by Director Barrera and carried unanimously.

#### 2-B Consideration and Approval of the Financials for the Month of October 2013

Directors Lopez and Barrera commented that the Financial Report was very informative and complemented Staff for providing the detailed Financial Report that will help the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority with its Budget as the Fiscal Year goes on.

Director Lopez moved to approve the Financials for the Month of October 2013. The motion was seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously.

The Report is as follows:		

# **ACTION ITEMS**

#### 3-A Approval of Claims

The attached claims were presented to the Board of Directors for approval.

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director introduced the Claims into the record.

Director Garza moved to approve the Claims. The motion was seconded by Director Barrera and carried unanimously.

The Claims are as follows:

#### 3-B Consideration and Acknowledgement of the GEC Report for October 2013

Mr. Jimmy Berry with HNTB went over a Power Point Presentation for the West Rail and Olmito Projects. Mr. Richard Ridings with HNTB went over the status of other Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Projects.

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director went over the Project Development Spreadsheet with the Board. Mr. Sepulveda also advised the Board of the Environmental Clearance on the General Brandt Road Project, the approval of further processing for FM 803 and stated that deadline for individuals to request a Public Hearing is December 3, 2013. He also mentioned that the Sarita Overpass is open to traffic while the Willacy County Overpass will be completed May 2014. Mr. Sepulveda stated that he will be meeting with the Texas Department of Transportation to develop a plan on how to fund the remaining improvements needed on U.S. 77 in Nueces and Kleberg County. Mr. Sepulveda advised the Board of a Public Hearing at the Port of Brownsville on November 20<sup>th</sup> regarding the creation of a TRZ. Mr. Sepulveda also advised the Board of the following upcoming meetings/trips: Texas Transportation Commission meeting in Tyler, meetings with resource agencies in Victoria and Corpus Christi on the 19<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> of November. Mr. Sepulveda also stated that following the Regular Meeting of December 12<sup>th</sup>, the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Attorneys will be conducting required ethics training for the Board.

Mr. Sepulveda then presented a video of top down construction method that may be utilized to construct the SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project.

Director Esparza moved to acknowledge the GEC Report for October 2013. The motion was seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously.

The Report is as follows:		

#### 3-C Consideration and Approval of Change Order No. 18 for the SH 550 Port Spur Project

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director went over Change Order No. 18 with the Board. Mr. Sepulveda referenced a memo in the Board packet. Mr. Sepulveda recommended approval of the Change Order.

Director Barrera moved to approve Change Order No. 18 for the SH 550 Port Spur Project. The motion was seconded by Director Esparza and carried unanimously.

The Change Order is as follows:

# 3-D Consideration and Approval of Proposal for Survey for the West Rail Project from Gonzalez Engineering

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director went over the need to develop a right of way map for the West Rail Project that will be utilized for the Right of Way Exchange Agreement with the Union Pacific Railroad. Mr. Sepulveda also mentioned the memo in the Board packet. Mr. Sepulveda mentioned it was a local engineering firm doing 100% of the work.

Director Garza move to approve Survey for the West Rail Project from Gonzalez Engineering. The motion was seconded by Director Esparza and carried unanimously.

The Proposal is as follows:

# 3-E Consideration and Approval of Supplemental Work Authorization No. 10 to Work Authorization No. 17 with HNTB for the SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director introduced the item and the purpose and need of this Supplemental Work Authorization. Mr. Sepulveda stated that during the last several months numerous meetings with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Environmental Division at the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT ENV) in Austin and with the TxDOT District Office were held in anticipation of preparing the Scope and Fee Schedule for the Final Environmental Impact Study (FEIS) for the SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project. Mr. Sepulveda stated that FHWA and TxDOT ENV have been a great help as we move forward in this process. Mr. Sepulveda further stated that an Independent Project Manager is assigned by TxDOT to the Project and has been providing input. The one on one meetings with the resource agencies have begun with EPA being the first meeting. We have meetings on the 19th of November in Victoria and on the 25th in Corpus Christi. FHWA, ENV and TxDOT District Office will be attending meetings along with the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority (CCRMA). Agency input from those meetings will be utilized to prepare the FEIS. The draft EIS contained 1700 pages so this is a very detailed document that is required by FHWA. It is estimated the document will be in a range of 2,500 pages before we are all done. Mr. Sepulveda stated that this is the most environmentally complex project in the nation. A Project Schedule has been developed with input from the Independent Project Manager, FHWA, ENV and the Pharr District Office. Mr. Sepulveda then went over a summary of the tasks associated with this Supplemental Work Authorization. These are scopes and tasks that the FEIS requires.

Mr. Sepulveda started discussing the Route and Design Studies – Project Administration and Coordination, Data Collection, Design Concept Conference, Geometric Layout (Schematic Plans, Value Engineering Workshop, Toll Facility Study, Financial and Project Management plan, Base and Soil Testing, Traffic Forecasting and Traffic Operations Analysis.

Social, Economic and Environmental Studies – Public involvement, Context Sensitive Solutions (CSS) and FEIS.

Field Surveying and Photogrammetry – Field surveys, low level photogrammetry and bathymetric survey (bottom of Laguna Madre survey).

Mr. Sepulveda stated that the Route and Design Studies consist of General Project Administration and Coordination for the FEIS. It includes Schematic Design Plans, Traffic Operation Analysis and Soil Testing & Drilling. In addition, the right of way footprint will be done during this Phase of the Supplemental Work Authorization. It also includes a Design Concept Conference, the Schematic Design and Development including Design Cross Sections, Traffic Control and Construction Sequencing, Hydraulic Studies, Drainage Design, the Preliminary Engineering Report and the Preliminary Bridge Layout Preparation. The submittals will be made at 30% complete, 60% complete, 90% complete and 100% complete. Submittals will be made to TxDOT Design Division and FHWA for approval. Value engineering participation is also included as well as the development of the Toll Facility Study. An Interim Financial Plan addressing the Financial Feasibility of the Project and a Project Management Plan will also be developed as part of this Supplemental Work Authorization. Mr. Sepulveda stated that comments from FHWA and TxDOT's Innovative Financing Division were received for the Financial and Project Management plan.

Mr. Sepulveda further described and stated that the Social, Economic and Environmental Studies include Public Involvement through Project Website and Newsletters that will be developed twice a year as a way of keeping the public informed of the progress of the Project and development of the FEIS. Context sensitive solutions methodology will be addressed through this Supplemental Work Authorization. The FEIS will incorporate documentation of land use and social and economic conditions, farmland, soils geology, air quality assessment, traffic noise analysis, water quality issues, waters of the U.S., including wetlands, sea grasses, water body modifications and wildlife habitat, invasive species and beneficial landscaping, essential fish habitat consultation, floodplains, vegetation communities/wildlife habitat and threatened and endangered species and consideration of pedestrian and bicycle facilities. In addition, the Project will require U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service/National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration coordination for Section 7 consultation and coordination for compliance with the Marine Mammal Protection Act, development of a Mitigation Plan, coordination with the General Land Office (Texas), preparation of Archeological Studies, Historic Resource Studies, Hazardous Material Studies, documentation of visual impacts and indirect and cumulative impacts, construction impacts and identification of Section 4F properties.

Mr. Sepulveda stated that the field surveying and photogrammetry will include field surveying, low altitude aerial mapping engineering design surveying, bathymetric survey, geotechnical bore hole surveys and staking of the proposed right of way.

Additionally, Mr. Sepulveda stated that the GEC will perform independent project oversight and coordination duties for each Task and Subtask as detailed in the Supplemental Work Authorization to ensure that the FEIS is completed in a timely manner and acceptable for presentation to the FHWA & ENV.

The Scope and Fee (number of hours by Task and Subtask for GEC and Sub Consultants) have been reviewed by CCRMA Staff, Staff at the TxDOT District Office as well as TxDOT Austin Staff. This Scope will allow us to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process and complete the environmental process and will position us to receive a record of decision (Environmental Clearance).

Eight Sub Consultants will be utilized during this Supplemental Work Authorization. 60% to 75% of the work will be done with local firms.

Mr. Sepulveda stated to the Board that Staff recommended approval of the Supplemental Work Authorization.

The Board discussed the progress that the CCRMA has made on this particular Project and the fact that this Supplemental Work Authorization would take us to the Environmental Clearance for the Project. The Board discussed the timeframe to secure the Environmental Clearance and the concurrent reviews that FHWA and TxDOT will conduct to save time on the Project schedule.

Director Garza moved to approve Supplemental Work Authorization No. 10 to Work Authorization No. 17 with HNTB for the SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access Project. The motion was seconded by Director Esparza and carried unanimously.

The Supplemental Work Authorization is as follows:

# 3-F Consideration and Approval of Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 1 for the FM 803 Realignment Project

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director went over the purpose of this Supplemental Work Authorization for the FM 803 Project. Mr. Sepulveda stated that after completing the Environmental Document it was determined that .45 acres of wetlands will be impacted and that the U.S. Corps of Engineers requires a Mitigation Plan be developed to address the mitigation of the .45 acres. Mr. Sepulveda recommended approval of the Supplemental Work Authorization. All work for this Supplemental Work Authorization will be done by a local engineering firm.

Director Garza moved to approve Supplemental Work Authorization No. 1 to Work Authorization No. 1 for the FM 803 Realignment Project. The motion was seconded by Director Lopez and carried unanimously.

# 3-G Consideration and Approval of Work Authorization No. 4 with S&B Infrastructure for the SH 550 Mitigation Coordination

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director stated that the purpose of this Work Authorization was to do the monitoring and reporting of the mitigation being done for the SH 550 Project as is required in the U.S. Corps of Engineers Permit that the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority obtained. The monitoring and reporting is for a period of five years. Mr. Sepulveda recommended approval of the Work Authorization.

Director Esparza moved to approve Work Authorization No. 4 with S&B Infrastructure for the SH 550 Mitigation Coordination. The motion was seconded by Director Barrera and carried unanimously.

The Work Authorization is as follows:

#### 3-H Discussion and Consideration on Status of the SH 550 Direct Connector Project

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director introduced the item and Mr. Phillip Pawelek and Mr. Agustin Ramirez, both with S&B Infrastructure went over a Power Point Presentation providing an update for the SH 550 Direct Connector Project.

Director Esparza moved to acknowledge Status on the SH 550 Direct Connector Project. The motion was seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously.

The Power Point Presentation is as follows:

# 3-I Consideration and Approval of Supplemental Work Authorization No. 2 to Work Authorization No. 49 with HNTB for the SH 32 (East Loop) Project

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director went over the need for this Supplemental Work Authorization. He stated that the East Loop Project has been in existence for over 30 years. Initially, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and the City of Brownsville were handling the Project. Cameron County began participating 20 years ago. When the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority (CCRMA) was created the Project was turned over to the CCRMA. This Project is also an environmentally complex project since there are issues with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) (wildlife crossings & right of way swaps), DHS (border fence relocation issues) and IBWC (levee relocation issues). The CCRMA has handled the environmental process and has made substantial progress towards receiving environmental clearance. Additionally, the CCRMA has secured funding from TxDOT's Pass Through Finance Program in the amount of \$37 million. The CCRMA was also successful in ensuring that the State Legislature designated East Loop as the overweight corridor once it is operational from the Veterans International Bridge to the Port of Brownsville. Environmental Clearance should be obtained by June 2014.

This Supplemental Work Authorization will as required by TxDOT's Environmental Division conduct an archeological investigation at the Piper Plantation. The Scope also includes the Antiquities Permit application preparation. Additional coordination with USFWS for wildlife crossing options will be completed

as well. Additional schematic work and the route design, environmental and socio economic work will be completed at the SH 4 Overpass and be made part of the environmental document.

70% of the work will be done by local firms.

Mr. Sepulveda stated that Staff recommends approval of the Supplemental Work Authorization.

Director Barrera moved to approve Supplemental Work Authorization with HNTB for the SH 32 (East Loop) Project. The motion was seconded by Director Esparza and carried unanimously.

The Supplemental Work Authorization is as follows:

#### 3-J Discussion and Presentation on Marketing Efforts

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director introduced the item and Mrs. Michelle Lopez, Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Marketing & Communications Director went over a Marketing Report for the month of October. A discussion ensued on the fact that companies are hesitant to purchase Tx Tags until the SH 550 Direct Connector Project is complete. Staff will develop a fact sheet on fuel consumption savings that can be presented to companies.

Director Esparza moved to acknowledge the Presentation on Marketing Efforts. The motion was seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously.

The Report is as follows:

#### 3-K Discussion and Possible Action regarding the Commercial Rates for the SH 550 Toll Road

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director introduced the item and there was a discussion on developing and implementing a discount or rebate policy for commercial companies that will have high usage of Tx Tags. Staff will prepare and present to the Board for consideration at a future Board meeting.

Director Esparza moved to acknowledge the Report regarding Commercial Rates for the SH 550 Toll Road. The motion was seconded by Director Garza and carried unanimously.

#### 3-L Discussion and Possible Action regarding payment of Claims

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, Jr., RMA Executive Director introduced the item and went over his recommendation on his authority to pay claims under \$15,000. Mr. Sepulveda referenced the memo in the Board packet.

Director Garza moved to approve authorizing the Executive Director to pay claims of up to \$15,000 and presenting a monthly list of claims to the Board. The motion was seconded by Director Esparza and carried unanimously.

The following is a summary of our progress on the subject projects for the month of October 2013.

#### **Project Management:**

#### General GEC

- Prepared & submitted CCRMA GEC Invoice for work performed on various Work Authorizations, Updated and submitted September 2013 GEC report.
- On October 8<sup>th</sup>, October 14<sup>th</sup> and October 25<sup>th</sup>, Richard Ridings, Bobby Balli, Greg Garcia and Jimmy Berry attended the Special Meetings of the CCRMA Board of Directors.
- Assisted CCRMA Controller on activities involving reporting and documentation of invoicing, progress reports and other accounting/billing matters.

#### West Rail Relocation International Coordination (Work Authorization No. 8):

This Work Authorization provides appropriate subconsultant(s) for staff coordination with the Mexican agencies to monitor and determine project schedules, permit requirements, funding technical agreements and design for the West Rail Relocation around Brownsville, Texas. The project plans will require approval by Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes (SCT), Comisión Internacional de Limites Y Aguas (CILA) and Kansas City Southern Mexico (KCSM).

- The Bridge project is reported to be 100% complete and the switchyard relocation project is reported to be 100% complete. Dr. de las Fuentes continues to attend meetings with SCT and project representatives to assure expedited completion of the project.
- A meeting was held with Matamoros Municipality new President, Leticia Salazar Vázquez on October 2<sup>nd</sup> in Matamoros. She agreed to continue with the Project of Las Americas Avenue. Another meeting is scheduled for November 7<sup>th</sup> with the representatives of the Highway Development General Direction with the purpose to present the Executive Project concluded by the company SCALA S.A. de C.V; as well as, elaborate a strategy for the next three years, including the 140 million pesos by Fonadin for construction and to establish a work Group for this objective.
- A conference call was held on October 7<sup>th</sup> with Lic. Marco Antonio Frías Galván, Director General Adjunto de Desarrollo Carretero and Lic. Eliseo Herrera Villalobos Director General Adjunto de Regulación Técnico Ferroviaria de la Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes to review the budget. Common Clear resources are being revised with Cameron County authorities.

A conference call was held on October 6<sup>th</sup> with the Assistant Secretary for Infrastructure, MSc.
Raúl Murrieta Cummings to request the ability to perform the opening of the railway project in
December. A card was developed and sent to him, where he scored the needs of the project and
the steps to carry out the opening as soon as possible.

#### South Padre Island Second Access Phase 3A & 3B (Work Authorization No. 17):

This Work Authorization provides engineering and environmental services associated with the development and advancement of the NEPA process for the proposed South Padre Island (SPI) 2nd Access Project in Cameron County, Texas. The proposed Project will provide an alternate route to the Queen Isabella Memorial Causeway; thus, enhancing local and regional mobility, and facilitating effective evacuation of the island in times of disaster, hurricanes, and other emergencies. This Work Authorization continues the environmental and corridor alternatives assessment tasks necessary to advance the project to a selection of a Recommended Preferred Alternative and ultimately to a Record of Decision (ROD). After the selection of a Preferred Alternative a supplement for schematic design and the FEIS will be required.

- Coordination with TxDOT Pharr District, TxDOT ENV and FHWA has been on-going regarding the revised alternatives analysis and subsequent agency coordination.
- HNTB continues to provide assistance and information to CCRMA Board and staff, members of the general public and stakeholders.
- Phase 3A & 3B are now substantially complete. Minimal work is remaining other than work anticipated in the next phase.
- Continuing effort included in supplement #11.
- A meeting was held on October 3<sup>rd</sup> to discuss the revised evaluation of the alternatives in review. The meeting was held at the TxDOT Environmental Division Headquarters and officials from FHWA were in attendance.
- TxDOT Legal and TxDOT ENV completed their review of the responses to EPA, USFWS, and NMFSS comments on the DEIS.
- A meeting was held with EPA in Dallas on October 24<sup>th</sup>. Attendees included staff from the RMA,
  TxDOT Pharr District, TxDOT ENV and FHWA. The subject of the meeting was an overview of
  the responses to the agency's comments on the DEIS and a presentation of the revised alternatives
  analysis conducted in response to EPA's comments.

#### General Brant Road/FM 106 Extension (Work Authorization No. 26)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with the preparation of a categorical exclusion (to be reviewed by the Federal Highway Administration in anticipation of possible federal funding) and the completion of the Section 404 permitting process (including the development of a conceptual mitigation plan) for the project.

- Received comments from resource agencies on the Individual Permit application.
- Coordination with TxDOT Pharr District and USFWS has been on-going regarding potential mitigation plans for wetland impacts.
- CE was approved by FHWA on 10-24-13.

#### Olmito Switch Yard & Repair-In-Place Facility (Work Authorization No. 31)

This work authorization provides engineering services throughout the construction duration of the Olmito Switch Yard and Repair-In-Place (RIP) Facility by providing responses to the contractor's Requests for Information, Shop Drawing Review and As-Built construction plans.

• HNTB is assisting with the completion and close out of this project.

#### West Rail Bypass, CI (Work Authorization No. 33)

This work authorization provides professional services associated with construction inspection phase work for the West Rail Bypass.

- The fourth trainload of ballast has been received and tamping is underway.
- We are waiting for delivery of Crossing and Guard Rail Ties. Receipt of those ties will allow completion of the track construction. The latest schedule has a completion date of November 23, 2013.
- The US Fish and Wildlife Service and Texas Parks and Wildlife personnel have requested a survey
  of the vegetative buffer north of the USFW tract. TxDOT has agreed to assist with the survey
  starting the second week of October.

#### Outer Parkway Study (Work Authorization No. 36)

This work authorization provides professional services and deliverables associated with a study for the Outer Parkway. The study is to be performed in a three phase effort to deliver a schematic design for the Outer Parkway project. The phases are:

- The Phase I study, which was completed in May 2011, included field investigations, constraints
  mapping and technical evaluations necessary to identify a recommended corridor for the
  proposed Outer Parkway.
- Now that state and federal funding sources will be considered, the previous Phase II scope and fee
  that was submitted to CCRMA yet not approved will need to be revised to include the state and
  federal environmental process. HNTB met with CCRMA staff to discuss next steps and is
  assisting in determining the next environmental steps.

#### West Rail RFIs, As-Builts (Work Authorization No. 40)

This work authorization provides construction phase services throughout the construction of the West Rail Relocation Project by providing responses to Requests for Information from the contractor and providing AsBuilt construction drawings. Also, records keeping will be provided through the use of DashPort.

• Two RFI's have been submitted on the Rail Construction.

Olmito Switch Yard Expansion Construction Inspection Phase II RIP (Work Authorization No. 47)

This work authorization provides professional services associated with construction inspection phase work for the Olmito Repair-in-Place Facility.

- We continue to work with the contractor to document time delays and the associated change order.
- We are continuing to work with BPUB to reach an agreement on their impact fees. Once water line is energized, HNTB will schedule walk-through of facility with UPRR.

SH 32 GEC (Work Authorization No. 49 - Preliminary Schematic and Environmental Approval)

This work authorization provides professional services for oversight, guidance, agency coordination, and issue resolution, necessary to expedite the preliminary development phases of these two SH 32 projects only.

The two projects, which each have logical termini and independent utility, extend from US 77/83 to FM 3068 (herein referred to as SH 32-West) and from FM 3068 to SH 4 (herein referred to SH 32-East). The proposed projects are being developed by two prime subconsultants, (S&B Infrastructure, Ltd. and Traffic Engineers, Inc.) under the oversight of HNTB (GEC).

#### SH 32 West (Consultant - Traffic Engineers, Inc., or TEI):

• GEC staff assisted with the change in Design PMs for TEI.

#### SH 32 East (Consultant - S&B Infrastructure, Ltd., or S&B):

- Meetings were held between TxDOT Pharr District Staff, the S&B design team and CCRMA
  officials to discuss implications to additional SH 4 overpass improvements.
- GEC negotiated supplement for next phase of work with CCRMA. Supplement will allow S&B and TEI to move forward with Schematic Alignment phase.

#### **Consultant Management:**

 Continued coordination with subconsultants and S&B Infrastructure as prime consultant on SH 550 Construction management including discussions with USACE officials on wetland mitigation that was performed as part of this project.

#### **Agency Coordination:**

 Conducted ongoing discussions with CCRMA staff, TxDOT staff and subconsultants for preparation of SPI 2<sup>nd</sup> Access project, SH 550, Olmito Switch Yard Repair-In-Place Facility construction project, West Rail construction project, SH 32 East Loop EAs and other miscellaneous items.

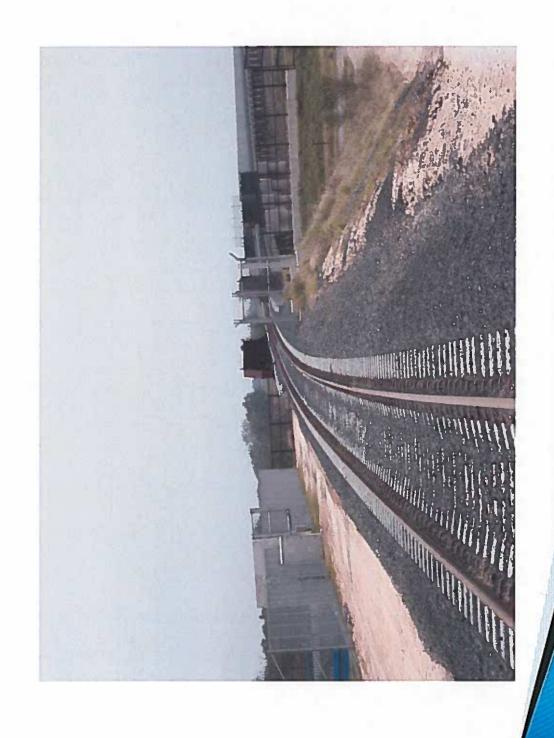

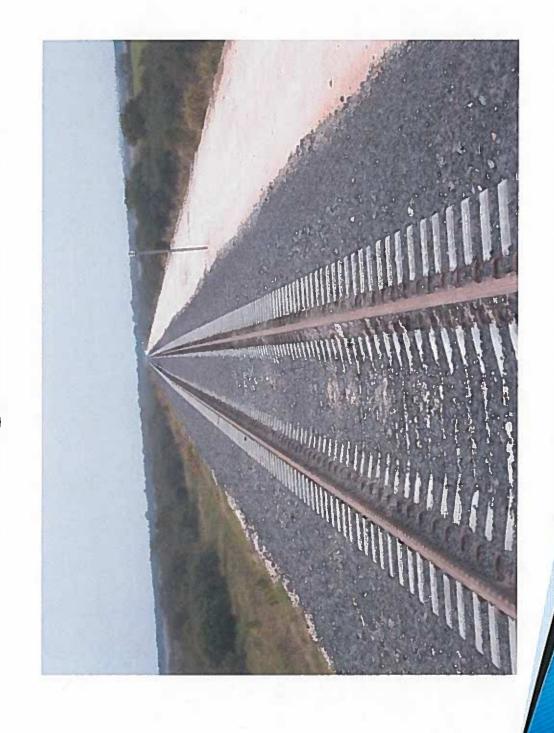

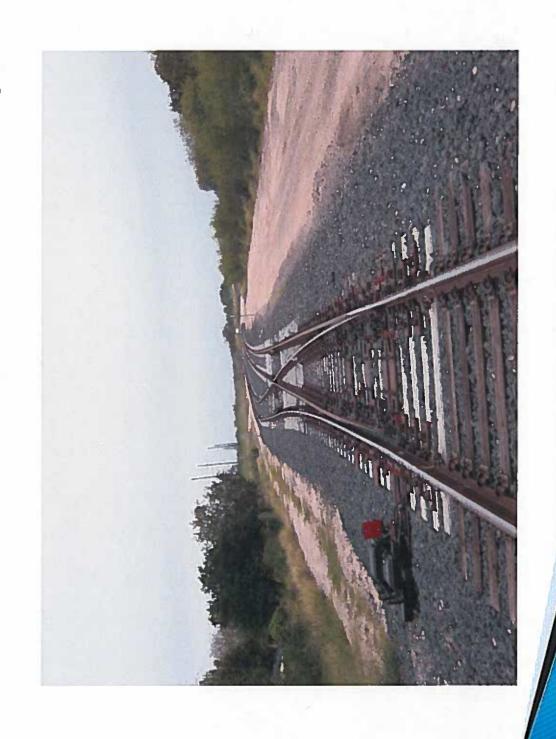

'plan view' riprap quantities vs. true slope quantities for all proposed bridge header banks. Therefore, the plans significantly under quantified Item 528. Item 432-2001 RIPRAP (CONC)(4 IN) was correctly set up to be paid in cubic yards at Palo Alto Overpass header banks. However, these riprap quantities reflect measurements on quantities shown on summary tables and Estimate & Quantity (E&Q) sheets were calculated in "cubic yards" instead of square yards. Furthermore, plans calculated 2:1 slope headers versus correct 2:1 to 3:1 transitions around both bridge headers. Moreover, Drainage District #1 (DD#1) bridge header riprap quantity was set up correctly, but was omitted from E&Q sheets. In conclusion, correct field measured riprap quantities are being introduced to the contract. No time for concrete riprap Original concrete riprap quantities at proposed bridge header banks do not reflect field measured riprap quantities due to design error calculations. Item 528-2006 COLORED TEXTURED CONC (5") was set up to be paid in "square yards" at FM 3248, Old Port Isabel Road, and SH 48 bridge header banks. However, riprap work is added by this change order.

Similarly, additional concrete riprap is being proposed TxDOT requested additional concrete riprap to be added at FM 3248, Old Port Isabel, & SH 48 overpasses due to erosion, maintenance, and safety issues. 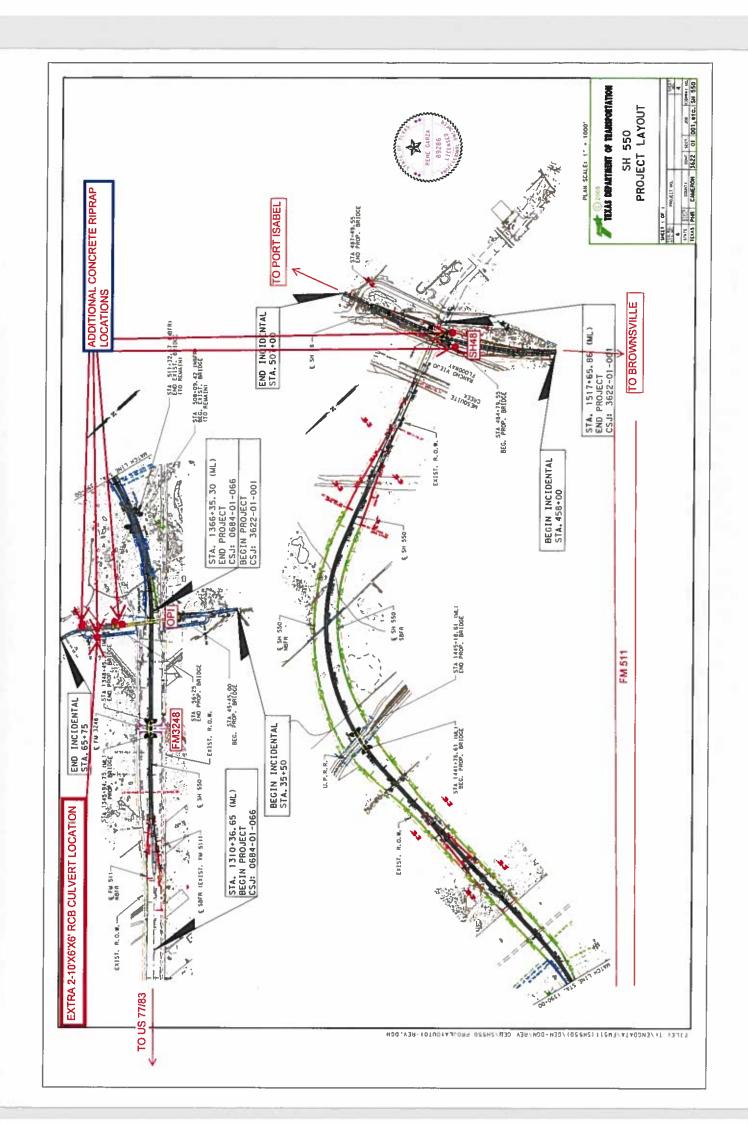

Be advised that during the last several months I have had numerous meetings with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Environmental Division at TxDOT (TxDOT ENV) in Austin and with the TxDOT District office in anticipation of preparing the Final Environmental Impact Study (FEIS) for the SPI 2nd Access Project. FHWA and TxDOT ENV have been a great help as we move forward in this process. An independent Project Manager is assigned to the project and has been providing input. We have begun the one on one meetings with the resource agencies and have already met with EPA. We have meetings on the 19th of November in Victoria and on the 25th in Corpus Christi. FHWA, ENV and TxDOT District office will be attending meetings along with the CCRMA. Agency input from those meetings will be utilized to prepare the FEIS. The draft EIS contained 1700 pages so this is a very detailed document that is required by FHWA. I estimate a document in a range of 2,500 pages before we are all done. This is the most environmentally complex project in the nation. A project schedule has been developed with input from the Independent Project Manager, FHWA, ENV and the Pharr District Office. Below is an outline of the different tasks that the FEIS will require:

Route and Design Studies – Project Administration and Coordination, Data Collection, Design Concept Conference, Geometric Layout (Schematic Plans, Value Engineering Workshop, Toll Facility Study, Financial and Project Management Plan, Base and Soil Testing, Traffic Forecasting and Traffic Operations Analysis.

Social, Economic and Environmental Studies – Public involvement, Context Sensitive Solutions (CSS) and FEIS.

Field Surveying and Photogrammetry – Field surveys, low level photogrammetry and bathymetric survey (bottom of Laguna Madre survey)

The route and design studies consist of general project administration and coordination for the FEIS. It includes schematic plans, traffic operation analysis and soil testing & drilling. In addition, the right of way footprint will be done during this phase of the Work Authorization. It also includes a design concept conference, the schematic design and development including design cross sections, traffic control and construction sequencing, hydraulic studies, drainage design, the preliminary engineering report and the preliminary

bridge layout preparation. The submittals will be made at 30% complete, 60% complete, 90% complete and 100% complete. Submittals will be made to TxDOT Design Division and FHWA for approval. Value engineering participation is also included as well as the development of the toll facility study. An interim financial plan addressing the financial feasibility of the project and a project management plan will also be developed as part of this Work Authorization.

The social, economic and environmental studies include public involvement through project website and newsletters as a way of keeping the public informed of the progress of the project and development of the FEIS. Context sensitive solutions methodology will be addressed through this Work Authorization. The FEIS will incorporate documentation of land use and social and economic conditions, farmland, soils geology, air quality assessment, traffic noise analysis, water quality issues, waters of the U.S., including wetlands, seagrasses, water body modifications and wildlife habitat, invasive species and beneficial landscaping, essential fish habitat consultation, floodplains, vegetation communities/wildlife habitat and threatened and endangered species and consideration of pedestrian and bicycle facilities. In addition, the project will require U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service/National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration coordination for Section 7 consultation and coordination for compliance with the Marine Mammal Protection Act, development of a mitigation plan, coordination with the General Land Office (Texas), preparation of archeological studies, historic resource studies, hazardous material studies, documentation of visual impacts and indirect and cumulative impacts, construction impacts and identification of Section 4F properties.

The field surveying and photogrammetry will include field surveying, low altitude aerial mapping engineering design surveying, bathymetric survey, geotechnical bore hole surveys and staking of the proposed right of way.

The GEC will perform independent project oversight and coordination duties for each task and subtask as detailed in the work authorization to ensure that the FEIS is completed in a timely manner and acceptable for presentation to the FHWA & ENV.

The scope and fee (number of hours by task and subtask for GEC and sub consultants) have been reviewed by CCRMA Staff, Staff at the TxDOT District office as well as TxDOT Austin Staff. This scope will allow us to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process and complete the environmental process and will position us to receive a record of decision (environmental clearance).

Staff recommends approval of the scope and fee.

Coordination with the U.S. Corps of Engineers, TxDOT, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and Texas Parks & Wildlife Service would take place as the mitigation plan is being developed.

A Section 404 Permit will also be required for the structures that span jurisdictional waters of the U.S.

Be advised that as part of the construction of the SH 550 Port Spur Project, the CCRMA was required to restore 26.77 acres of tidal estuarine and seagrass habitat and preserve 6.30 acres of those habitats, for a total of 33.07 acres. A mitigation plan was developed and approved by U.S. Corps of Engineers.

This Work Authorization includes project coordination, a modification to the U.S. Corps of Engineers Individual Permit to include S&B Infrastructure as the RMA's authorized agent and wetland mitigation monitoring once a year for a minimum of three years to a maximum of five years due to impacts to jurisdictional wetlands. Mitigation monitoring survey reports will be prepared and submitted to the U.S. Corps of Engineers for their consideration.

Staff recommends approval of the item.

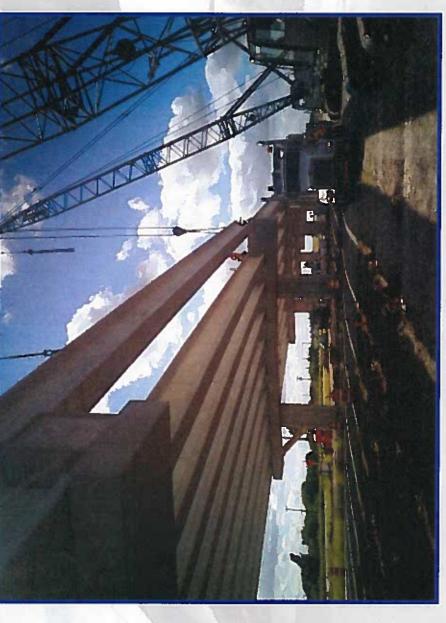

SUBJ: SH 32 (East Loop) – Item 3-I

The East Loop Project has been in existence for over 30 years. Initially, TxDOT and the City of Brownsville were handling the project. Cameron County began participating 20 years ago. When the CCRMA was created the project was turned over to the RMA. This project is also an environmentally complex project since there are issues with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (wildlife crossings & right of way swaps), DHS (border fence relocation issues) and IBWC (levee relocation issues). The RMA has handled the environmental process and has made substantial progress towards receiving environmental clearance. Additionally, the RMA has secured funding from TxDOT's Pass Through Finance Program in the amount of \$37 million. The RMA was also successful in ensuring that the State Legislature designated East Loop as the overweight corridor once it is operational. Environmental clearance should be obtained by June 2014.

This Work Authorization will, as required, by TxDOT Environmental Division conduct an archeological investigation at the Piper Plantation. The scope also includes the antiquities permit application preparation. Additional coordination with USFWS for wildlife crossing options will be completed as well. Additional schematic work at the SH 4 Overpass is necessary and will be made part of the environmental document.

Staff recommends approval of the scope and fee.
