

# Better, safer infrastructure is on the Texas ballot this November.



## In 2021, the Texas Legislature heard clearly from local leaders:

- Traffic relief and safety issues are a priority.
- Local roads and bridges are in critical need of funding.
- Counties lack the same tools as cities to improve infrastructure.
- Texas needs an additional, locally driven option to ensure we keep up with the state's fast-paced growth while helping with traffic and maintenance.

**Texas Legislators listened** and overwhelmingly supported new legislation (HJR 99) giving Texans an opportunity to empower their counties to make local infrastructure funding a priority.

**On this November's ballot**, Texans will vote on Proposition 2, which will allow counties to dedicate additional infrastructure funding and keep Texans safe on the road while reducing time spent in traffic. Proposition 2 gives counties the same ability to build much needed infrastructure that cities and towns already have.

Proposition 2 does not raise any taxes or fees and not a single penny goes to toll roads.
