AMENDED INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

THIS INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the COUNTY OF CAMERON, TEXAS, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY", and the CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY, hereinafter referred to as "CCRMA", pursuant to V.T.C.A., Government Code, and Chapter 791, whereby:

WHEREAS, the CCRMA is a regional mobility authority created pursuant to the request of Cameron County and operating pursuant to Chapter 370 of the Texas Transportation Code (the "RMA Act") and 43 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 26.1 et seq. (the "RMA Rules"); and

WHEREAS, the CCRMA, and the County, are each units of "local government" as defined in TEX. GOV'T CODE § 791.003(4); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code provides that local governments may contract with each other for the performance of governmental functions and services, administrative functions as well as the purchase of goods and services in which the contracting parties are mutually interested; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement will increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the CCRMA, the County, as contemplated by TEX. GOV'T CODE § 791.001; and

WHEREAS, Section 370.033 of the RMA Act provides that a regional mobility authority may enter into contracts or agreements with another governmental entity; and

WHEREAS, the County and the CCRMA hereby find that the services pursuant to this Interlocal Agreement are reasonably required and that this Interlocal Agreement includes an agreement between the CCRMA and the County pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code § 791.025 to the extent applicable;

WHEREAS, on December 10, 2019, the CCRMA and COUNTY had entered into an Interlocal Agreement regarding the East Loop Project and there is now a need to amend the Interlocal Agreement to increase the original amount by \$316,921.59.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, the County and the CCRMA agree to the following terms:

- 1. PURPOSE OF INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT: To authorize the CCRMA to continue with the environmental document and negotiations with IBWC and USFWS as well as other coordination with Txdot as well as surveying, mapping and other coordination required by Txdot.
- 2. PROJECT TO BE COMPLETED: To complete the environmental document and coordinate issues with Txdot.
- 3. CCRMA HEREBY AGREES TO:

- a. To coordinate with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) the necessary environmental document as well as design and engineering and coordination with any state and federal agencies, including IBWC and USFWS on any issues arising during the environmental phase, design and engineering and right of way acquisition phase.
- b. To provide monthly progress reports of activities to the COUNTY.
- c. To Coordinate with TxDOT the environmental clearance of the project.

4. COUNTY HEREBY AGREES TO:

- a. To provide funding in the amount of \$316,921.59.
- 5. It is specifically understood and agreed that in the event insufficient funds are appropriated and/or budgeted concerning the obligations under this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement on behalf of either of the Parties, then the Party with the insufficient funds shall notify the other Parties and this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement shall thereafter terminate and be null and void on the last day of the fiscal period for which appropriations were made without penalty, liability, or expense to the Party.
- 6. Any payment made by either party will be made from current revenues of the paying party. The funds for the above mentioned work will be provided by Cameron County bond proceeds. The CCRMA and COUNTY hereby find that the foregoing goods and services are reasonably required for the East Loop Project.
- 7. This Interlocal Cooperation Agreement constitutes a one-time Agreement between the Parties and does not constitute a continuing Agreement for the COUNTY and, CCRMA. The Interlocal Cooperation Agreement expires upon the first to occur of when the Projects are completed or a 30 day termination notice is given by either COUNTY and CCRMA.
- 8. The Rules, Regulations and Orders of the CCRMA shall govern this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement and the Parties agree that the CCRMA shall supervise the performance of this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement. It is also agreed that the CCRMA has the authority to employ personnel to engage in other administrative or governmental functions and services necessary to fulfill the terms of this Agreement.

I. Introduction (Statement of Purpose and Need)

This task order defines Fagan Consulting's scope of work as part of Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority's (CCRMA) Back Office System (BOS) and Customer Service Center (CSC) projects. This effort includes a review and update of CCRMA's Business Rules documents to reflect changes required to support the management of CCRMA Fuego Transponder (Tag) and customer accounts.

Project background information:

CCRMA currently operates toll facilities in Cameron County utilizing an Electronic Toll Collection System (ETCS) that employs Automatic Vehicle Identification (AVI) using transponders and a violation enforcement system with integrated cameras to capture digital images of license plates.

CCRMA utilizes an Interlocal Agreement (ILA) with the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority for access and exchange of data with the Central United States Interoperability (CUSIOP) System. The CUSIOP system allows customers with TxTag, EZ Tag, TollTag, Pikepass, and K-Tag accounts to pay for their usage of CCRMA's State Highway 550 toll facilities.

In order to better serve CCRMA's customers, CCRMA will begin distributing CCRMA Fuego Tag transponders to customers allowing them to manage their Fuego Tag account via the CCRMA back office system.

By distributing the Fuego Tag directly rather than relying solely on the CUSIOP system, CCRMA will be able to provide customers in the Rio Grande Valley a local option for transponders and also provide enhanced customer service to account holders.



Fagan Consulting's role in this project includes the following:

- Review of the current Business Rule documentation and Interface Control Documents (ICDs) with CCRMA staff and, if necessary, current back office system providers technical staff, to determine any gaps in the existing Business Rules document and provide recommendations for updates.
- The focus of these review will include updates required to support the CCRMA Fuego Tag program, and other inline comments and edits within the most recent version of CCRMA's current Business Rule document
- Based on reviews with CCRMA and recommended updates, revise CCRMA's Business Rule documentation to add information required to support the Fuego Tag program
- Submit a final approved version of the Business Rules documentation to CCRMA for their records and future reference.
- Optional: In support of CCRMA's plans for the current and future ETCS, Fagan Consulting recommends a review of the additional sections of the current Business Rules document related to the ETCS In-Lane, ETCS Host, and interoperability to CUSIOP and other systems.

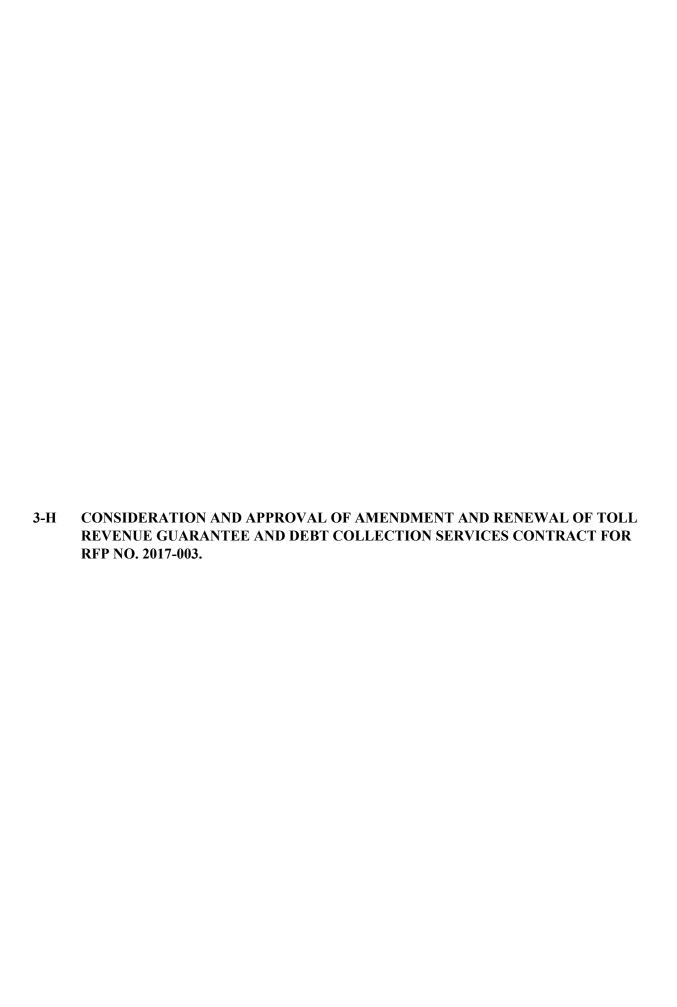


VIII. Governing Terms

Amendment and Renewal of

THIS AMENDMENT ("Amendment") to the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority Toll Revenue Guarantee and Debt Collection Services Contract for RFP No. 2017-003 ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority ("Authority") and Professional Account Management, LLC ("PAM" or "Contractor"). The Authority and PAM may be individually referred to as a Party or together referred to as the Parties. The effective date of this Amendment ("Effective Date") shall be February 23, 2021.

- 1. <u>Term Renewal:</u> The Authority hereby elects to renew the Agreement for a one (1) year renewal period at this time and reserves its right to renew the Agreement for up to an additional two (2) years in accordance with section 3.2 of the Agreement. The renewal shall begin on February 23, 2021 and end on February 23, 2022.
- 2. <u>Amendments</u>: The Parties hereby agree to add Section 8.1.8 and Section 10.6 as shown below:
 - **8.1.8 Collection Fees for Negative Balance Transponder Accounts.** For Collection Proceeds collected by Contractor for existing debt for a new Debt Type Portfolio III Negative Balance Transponder Accounts, Contractor shall retain as its compensation 23% of gross revenue collected. For the avoidance of doubt, Portfolio III Negative Balance Transponder Accounts shall not be included in the Base Toll Payment in Section 8.1 of the contract.
 - **10. 6 Programming Costs**. All programming and system development costs to implement Portfolio III Negative Balance Transponder Accounts, will be incurred by Contractor. The cost to the Authority for the technical system implementation and ongoing support of Portfolio III Negative Balance Transponder Accounts, shall be \$0.00.

3. Miscellaneous

The Agreement shall otherwise continue in full force and effect. This Amendment may be executed in one or more counterparts, and counterparts may be exchanged by electronic transmission (including by email), each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together constitute one and the same instrument.

Except as amended and/or modified by this Amendment, all other terms of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, unaltered and unchanged by this Amendment. Whether or not specifically amended by this Amendment, all of the terms and provisions of the Agreement are hereby amended to the extent necessary to give effect to the purpose and intent of this Amendment.
