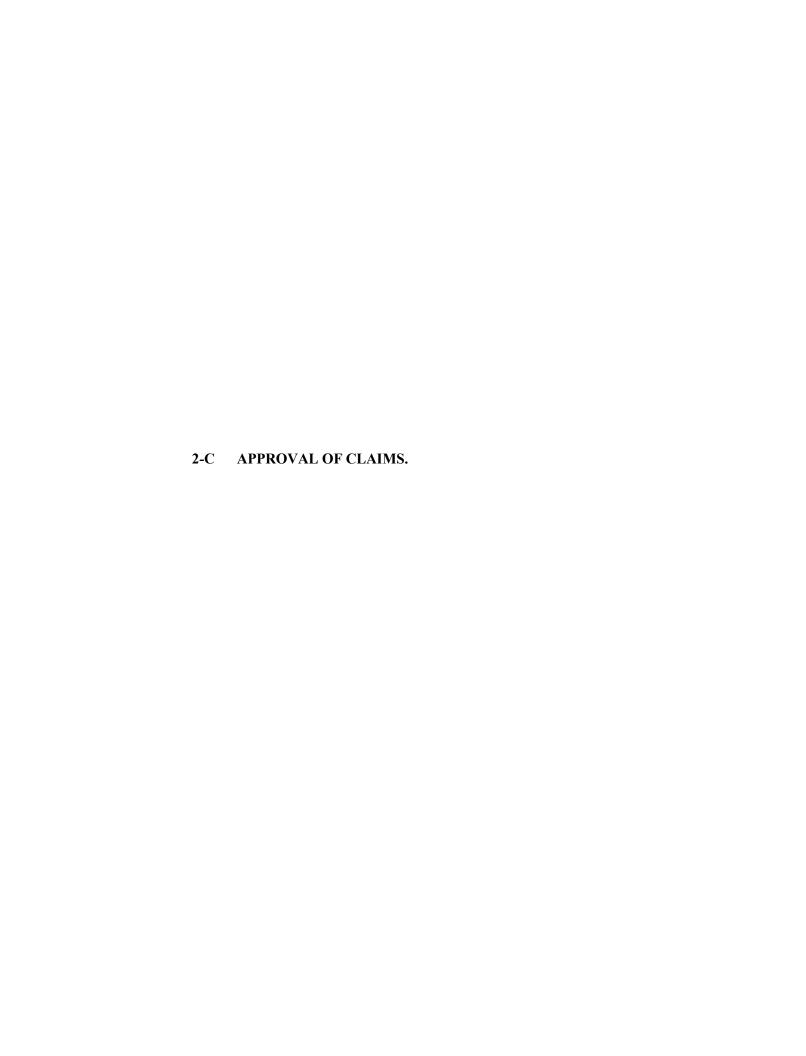

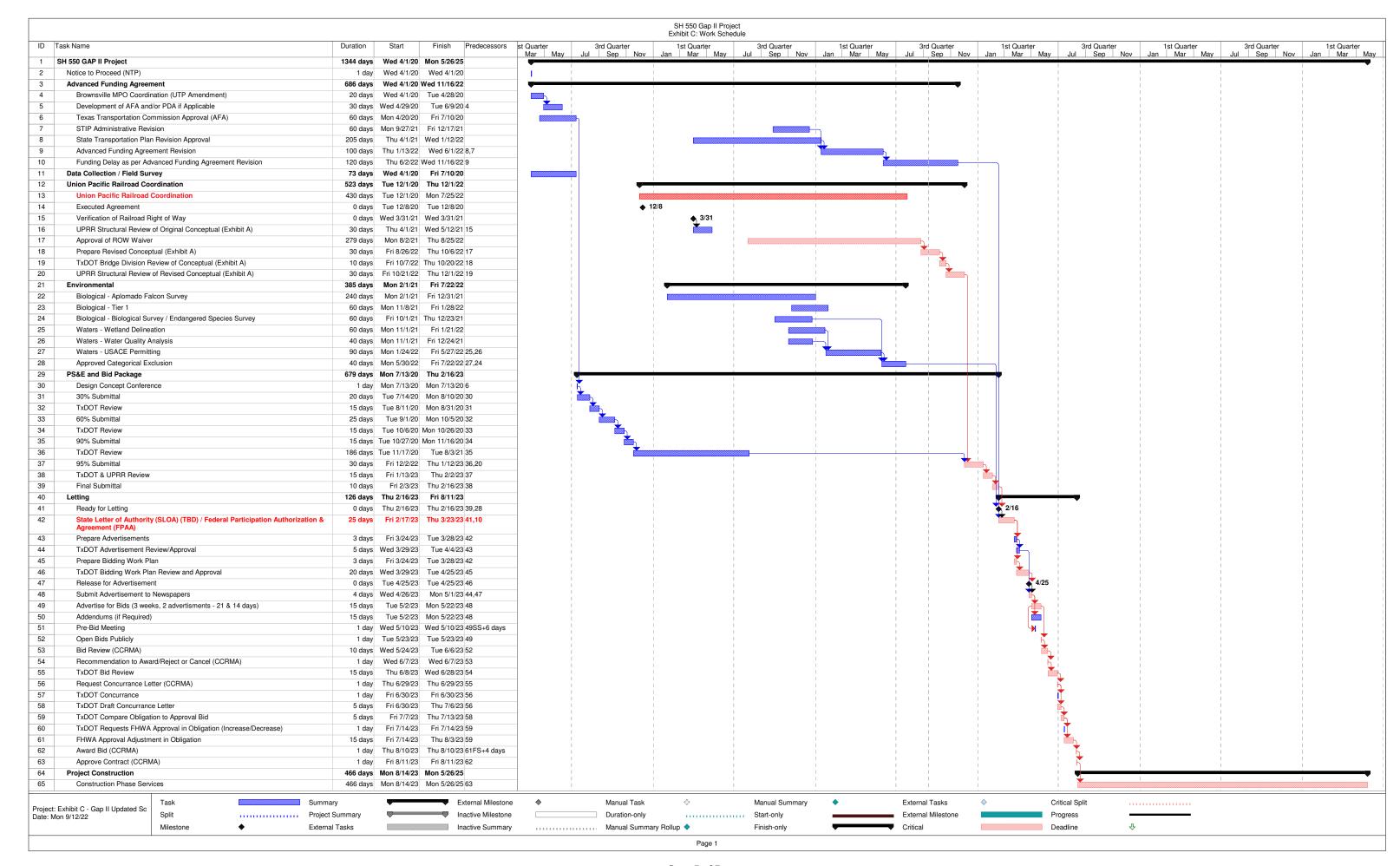

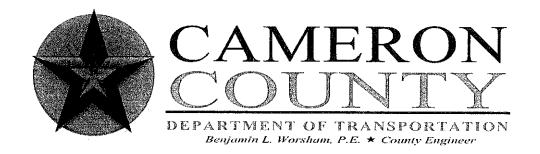

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY AND

UNITED STATES SECTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY AND WATER COMMISSION

REGARDING

RELOCATION OF THE UNITED STATES INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY WATER COMMISSION LEVEE SEGMENTS IN CAMERON COUNTY, TEXAS

This Memorandum of Agreement, hereinafter referred to as "MOA," constitutes an agreement between the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority (the "Authority") acting herein by and through the Board Of Directors, (hereinafter referred to as CCRMA) as represented by David E. Allex, Chairman, and the United States Section of the International Boundary and Water Commission, hereinafter referred to us as "USIBWC," as represented by the Commissioner of the USIBWC in El Paso, Texas, collectively referred to as the parties to this agreement.

WHEREAS, the Authority is a regional mobility authority and political subdivision of the State of Texas authorized under Chapter 370, Texas Transportation Code, responsible for developing certain mobility projects in and around Cameron County, Texas;

WHEREAS, the Authority is developing the project referred to as State Highway 32, a new roadway connecting the Veterans International Bridge in Brownsville to the Port of Brownsville with the purpose of moving goods and services to and from the Port (the "Project");

WHEREAS, the USIBWC is a federal governmental agency and the U.S component of the International Boundary and Water Commission which applies the boundary and water treaties of the United States and Mexico:

WHEREAS, the USIBWC is authorized to construct, operate and maintain any project or works projected by the United States of America within the Lower Rio Grande Flood Control Project (hereinafter referred to as "LRGFCP"), as authorized by the Act of the 74th Congress, SESS.I CH.561 [H.R.6453] approved August 19, 1935 (49 Stat.660), and codified at 22 U.S.C. section 277, 277a, 227b, 277c, and Acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto;

WHEREAS, the construction, operation and maintenance of LRGFCP works in furtherance of the provisions of Minutes 196, 212, 238, and 285 of the International Boundary and Water Commission, United States and Mexico regarding improvement of international flood control works on the lower Rio Grande;

WHEREAS, pursuant to 22 U.S.C. sections 277b and 277c the USIBWC is authorized to enter into agreements in connection with the acquisition of lands and construction, operation and maintenance of any flood control project or works on the LRGFCP with state and local political subdivisions within which such project or works may be in whole or in part situated upon;

WHEREAS, pursuant to 44 CFR Section 65.10 FEMA will only recognize in its flood hazard and risk mapping effort those levee systems that meet, and continue to meet, minimum design, operation and maintenance standards;

WHEREAS, the USIBWC has a responsibility to operate and maintain the features and works of the Lower Rio Grande Flood Control Project in order to provide flood control;

WHEREAS, the Project will cross the jurisdiction of the USIBWC, including relocating USIBWC owned levees, and is subject to written approval from the USIBWC, either in the form of a permit or license;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I: PURPOSE/OBJECTIVE OF PROJECT

The overall purpose/objective of the project is to construct a roadway that would ultimately provide for a controlled access facility within a variable right-of-way along the ten mile stretch. The proposed project is approximately 10.5 miles with improvements beginning on I 69 and running east to State Highway 4.

ARTICLE II: RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. The Authority will commit to the following:
 - (1) The Authority shall provide design documents, including the relevant plans and specifications (the "Plans and Specifications") design report, and geotechnical report for the Project to the USIBWC for review and comment at every phase of design (60%, 90%, Final). Submission of all these documents shall henceforth be referred to as design deliverables The USIBWC will provide comments to the design deliverables within twenty-one (21) calendar days from receipt of the same.
 - (2) The Authority shall design the relocated USIBWC levee segment(s) in accordance with USIBWC requirements. For the modified levee portions, the design shall include standards, including maintaining existing levee freeboard for the design flood that will permit levee accreditation by the U.S. Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).
 - (3) The Authority will ensure that there is at least sixteen (16) feet of clearance between the highway or other structures that are constructed above the levee and the highest point of the levee that is under the highway. The clearance is necessary to ensure that there is sufficient space for levee maintenance on the top of the levee, including compacting the levee and other rehabilitation and maintenance activities.
 - (4) The Authority shall complete and submit the following to the USIBWC:
 - Letter of Application;
 - Maps of the Project, including location map, vicinity map and project map;

- c. Drainage Report with digital copies of hydraulic models and calculations;
- d. Design Report in hard copy and electronic format at each design phase;
- Geotechnical Reports in a hard copy and electronic format at each design phase;
- f. Certificate of Substantial Completion, signed by both the Authority and Contractor shall be provided to the USIBWC within 30 calendar days of Substantial Completion;
- g. Final As-Built drawings in electronic format (both pdf and AutoCAD); the top of the levee shall be designed as a minimum 16-foot wide maintenance road consisting of a 6-inch layer of flex-base material (caliche based) directly placed on the finished embankment material. The Contractor shall design the levee-raising fill on both projects with side slope of 3:1 (H:V) on the riverside and 3:1 or steeper on the landside if existing ROW is insufficient. However, in no case will the side slope on the landside be steeper than 2.5:1 (H:V), unless special measures are taken whereby the slope would not require mowing.
- Final as-built levee survey data in electronic tabular format at completion of construction at a minimum stationing that corresponds to stationing in designed cross sections. Data shall include bench excavation, embankment fill, roadway surfacing, topsoil, and slope information;
- Any required letters from state and federal agencies concurring with the proposed work;
- j. Letter certifying that the project has been designed and was constructed to meet the requirements of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers document EM 1110-2-1913 Design and Construction of Levees and 44 Code of Federal Regulations 65.10 FEMA Levee Certification Requirements.
- k. Plans and Specifications of the Project in hard copy and electronic format. Electronic format of plans to be both in pdf and AutoCAD;
- Final National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) documents for the project;
- (5) The Authority shall construct the portion of the project associated with the USIBWC levees in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by the USIBWC. No deviations shall be implemented during construction without written approval by the USIBWC.
- (6) The Authority shall assure that the newly reconstructed USIBWC levee is in place and Substantially Complete (as agreed to by USIBWC), prior to removal of the existing USIBWC levee.
- (7) All transferred properties shall be owned by the USIBWC with no encumbrances with duly approved documents with metes and bounds properly executed and filed with the County Court House having jurisdiction.
- (8) The Authority shall update Licenses and permits for utilities crossing new relocated levee(s). Licenses shall conform to the internal processing of USIBWC's licenses, leases, and permits program for activities within the USIBWC Right-of-Way or USIBWC maintained floodways.
- (9) The Authority shall identify Licenses or permits on the existing levee system that are to be abandoned, or if necessary amended to conform to the levee(s) to be relocated. Amended

licenses or permits shall conform to USIBWC's licenses, leased, and permits program for activities within USIBWC Right-of-Way or USIBWC maintained floodways.

- (10) The Authority shall be responsible for acquiring and transferring all rights of way for construction and maintenance for the new USIBWC levee at no cost to the USIBWC.
- (11) The Authority shall provide a highly qualified construction inspector to provide Quality Assurance during the construction of the Project. The construction inspector shall meet USIBWC minimum requirements.
- (12) The Authority shall provide a solicitation schedule for the proposed solicitation of all phases of the project.
- (13) The Authority shall be responsible for coordination with any regulatory agencies, such as U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). In addition, the Authority shall be responsible for any required mitigation for this project along with any effects on wetlands/fish & wildlife of the moved levees.
- (14) The Authority will be responsible for maintenance, repair, and rehabilitation of the replacement levee segments for the first year after substantial completion of the replacement levee segments to ensure that the levee segments were adequately constructed to withstand the forces of nature, settling, and other factors which adversely affect the levee and occur within the first year after construction. The Authority agrees to bear all costs associated with the maintenance, repair, and rehabilitation of the replacement levee segments which are identified by the USIBWC representative, who serves as a liaison during construction of the Project, during this one-year period after the levee construction is determined to be substantially complete.
- (15) The Authority failure to comply with the terms of this agreement set forth herein, will result on the USIBWC request of the Authority immediately ceasing of its activity until both parties have resolved the Authority's failure to comply with the terms of this agreement.
- (16) The Authority will be required to provide the USIBWC a certificate of substantial completion and completed forms.

B. The USIBWC will commit to the following:

- (1) Once the requirements of the USIBWC are satisfied, USIBWC shall issue a permit or license for the Project. The Authority shall not be subject to any permit or license fee.
- (2) The USIBWC shall provide written comments to the Authority on all design deliverables within twenty-one (21) calendar days of receipt.
- (3) The USIBWC shall provide a representative that will serve as a liaison during construction of the Project. This representative shall be available to attend construction meetings and shall attend all formal inspections of the Project. The USIBWC also reserves the right to perform random inspections of the site to assure construction of the levees relocated is being

- performed in conformance with the approved Plans and Specifications and if the performance does so conform.
- (4) The USIBWC shall provide responses to all questions and concerns, to include Requests for Information (RFI) during construction within five (5) calendar days. Any question, concern, or RFI received after 2:00 pm Central Time, shall be considered to be received the following business day.
- (5) The USIBWC shall provide Final Acceptance of the Project based on written confirmation from the Authority that the project was constructed in accordance with the USIBWC approved plans and specifications and based upon findings of the local USIBWC representative.
- (6) Maintenance, repair, and rehabilitation of the newly constructed levee segments will be the responsibility of the USIBWC beginning one year after substantial completion of the replacement levee segments.

ARTICLE III: INTERAGENCY COMMUNICATIONS

- A. To provide for consistent and effective communication between both parties, each agency will immediately designate representatives to serve as the points of contact on all matters relating to this MOA. Each agency will advise the other agency in writing of the names and telephone numbers of the representatives designated.
- B. The designated representatives of the Authority and USIBWC will participate in monthly meetings, on mutually acceptable times, to discuss progress of ongoing construction activities.
- C. The Authority shall be responsible for keeping the USIBWC abreast of significant issues that may or will result in changes, delays, or may affect the USIBWC's mission to convey the design flood control within its levee system.
- D. The Authority shall provide USIBWC with monthly updates regarding materials testing data, Contractors schedules and survey data for all levee relocation work.
- E. The Authority shall provide USIBWC the 90% set of Record Drawings once each levee project is completed and will be allowed to provide corrective action comments to the Authority within twentyone (21) calendar days of receipt.
- F. The USIBWC shall participate in the pre-final and final inspection of the project and will be allowed to provide corrective action comments to the Authority within fourteen (14) calendar days.
- G. The Authority shall allow USIBWC Operations and Maintenance Mercedes (O&M) inspection rights of all relocated gate well structures. The USIBWC shall provide corrective action comments to the Authority within twenty one (21) calendar days of receipt.
- H. The Authority will assure the sluice gate mechanisms that are approved for use on the project are first vetted and approved through O&M.

ARTICLE IV: AMENDMENTS

This MOA may be modified at any time by written agreement of both parties. Either party may request a review of the contents of this agreement, at any time, to provide recommendations for amendments.

ARTICLE V- RESOLUTION OR DISSAGREEMENTS

The parties shall attempt in good faith to promptly resolve any dispute arising out of or relating to this MOA by negotiation between those executives who have direct responsibility for administration of this MOA. Any dispute arising under this MOA, which is not disposed of by agreement of executives of the Parties, shall be submitted jointly to the organizational heads of the Parties: the Commissioner of the USIBWC and the Board of Directors of CCRMA. A joint decision of the organizational heads of the Parties shall be the disposition of such dispute. If the dispute has not been resolved by a joint decision of the organizational heads of the Parties, the Parties shall endeavor to settle the dispute by mediation. Pending the resolution of any dispute or claim pursuant to this article, the Parties agree that performance of all obligations contained in this MOA shall be diligently pursued.

ARTICLE VI: EFFECT AND DURATION

This MOA is effective on the date signed by both parties and remains in effect until one year after construction Substantial Completion of this project is achieved. All activities carried out pursuant to this MOA are subject to the treaties, laws, and regulations applicable to each party.

ARTICLE VII: COST AND FUNDING

The Authority will fund the entire cost of the project to include all engineering, design, construction, and acquisition of real property and/or easements in order to accomplish this project. The USIBWC's will not have any financial obligations under this MOA. As noted in ARTICLE II: Responsibilities Section (13), the Authority also agrees to fund any post-construction maintenance and repair of modified levees.

ALTICLE VIII: TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this agreement 30 days or more prior to the initiation of any construction activities related to this agreement. If this Agreement is terminated the parties shall agree to the terms of the termination and the disposition of awarded and pending actions.

ARTICLE IX: MICELANEOUS

- A. Severability. Should any provision of this MOA be determined to be inconsistent with federal law, such provision shall be severed without impact to the other parts of this MOA.
- B. Third Party Rights. This document is an agreement between the Parties and does not create or confer any rights, privileges, or benefits upon any person, party, or entity, This MOA is not and shall not be construed as a rule or regulation.

C. Non-interference with Statutory Duties. Nothing in this MOA shall be construed as affecting the authority or jurisdiction of either Party in carrying out its responsibilities under existing statutes or treaties.

2.0 BACKGROUND

This Agreement funds the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority ("CCRMA" or "Grantee") to complete pre-construction activities, such as preliminary engineering design and an environmental review that is compliant with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and related federal laws, for various improvements at certain highway-rail grade crossings (crossings), which is proposed to include certain closures, configuration changes through the construction of new tracks, and realignment of track [the "Harlingen Rail Improvements Project – Phase I (PE/NEPA)" or "Project", formerly titled "North Rail Relocation Project, Cameron County, TX" as shown in Conference Report, H.R. 3288, as further described herein].

CCMRA is partnering with Union Pacific Railroad (UP) and the City of Harlingen (City) to complete the Project, which is located within the City's limits. The Project is the Phase 1 of the final phase of a series of projects with the UP started in 2003 in order to relocate their railroad switching operation in Harlingen to the new Olmito switchyard in order to improve regional safety and to increase operational efficiency, resilience, and expandability.

The Project will allow CCMRA and UP to proceed with phase II which include final design and construction activities, to be funded with other federal financial assistance.

3.0 GENERAL OBJECTIVE

The objective of the Project is to complete pre-construction work for crossings improvements and related track work. If built, the CCMRA will be able to eliminate degrading track, enhance railroad switching operations from the UP Harlingen Switchyard to UP's Olmito Switchyard in Brownsville to the south, and to reduce congestion by reducing the number of at grade crossings located within the Harlingen urban area.

4.0 PROJECT LOCATION

The crossings and tracks that are the subject of the Project are located in the City of Harlingen, TX, in Cameron County, TX.

5.0 DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Task 1: Project Administration

Project Administration includes work that is necessary for the Grantee to manage this Project, including grant administration and UP legal support.

1a. Detailed Project Work Plan

For this initial task, the Grantee will prepare a Detailed Project Work Plan, Budget, and Schedule for the following tasks, which may result in amendments to this Agreement. The Detailed Project Work Plan will describe, in detail, the activities and steps necessary to complete the tasks outlined in the Statement of Work, and it will be reviewed and approved by the FRA. The Detailed Project Work Plan will also include the following information (not an exhaustive list):

- Project schedule (with Grantee and agency review durations), and it will be consistent with the Approved Project Budget but will provide a greater level of detail.
- Project management approach (including team organization, team decision-making, roles and responsibilities and interaction with FRA.)
- Quality assurance and quality control procedures.
- CCMRA UP Project Agreement that outlines roles and responsibilities

The Grantee acknowledges that work on subsequent tasks will not commence until the Detailed Project Work Plan has been completed, submitted to FRA, and the Grantee has received approval in writing from FRA, unless such work is permitted by pre-award authority provided by FRA. The FRA will not reimburse the Grantee for costs incurred in contravention of this requirement unless otherwise notified by FRA.

1b. Reporting and Closeout

The Grantee will perform the close-out process for the Project. This process includes making the final checks on the contractor's work, collecting and checking final documentation, and making final payment. The Grantee will submit a Final Performance Report, along with other final closeout-related reports as required under this Agreement, to the FRA within 120 days of the Project Performance Period end date. The Final Performance Report should describe the cumulative activities of the project, including a complete description of the Grantee's achievements with respect to the project objectives and milestones, overall budget/financial status, benefits obtained from the grant, and service outcomes.

This task also includes the completion of reports as required in Attachment 1.

Task 2: Environmental Review

The Grantee will complete, and submit to FRA for approval, the documentation FRA determines is necessary to comply with the NEPA and related environmental laws (collectively, "environmental documentation"). Upon request from FRA, the Grantee will submit a Project description, appropriate Project maps, or any other relevant background information, which will later be incorporated into the NEPA documentation. This information may be submitted with the Detailed Project Work Plan described in Task 1 above. FRA will use this documentation to provide the Grantee with additional direction regarding the required environmental documentation. FRA will take the Grantee's information and make a class of action determination (likely to be a Categorical Exclusion (CE)).

Task 2 Deliverables:

- Draft NEPA documentation
- Final NEPA documentation
- Environmental Permits, if applicable

Task 3: Engineering Design

The Grantee will prepare or cause to be prepared a Preliminary Engineering (PE) Package showing, as applicable, design plans, specifications and estimates necessary to demonstrate the effectiveness, feasibility, and readiness of the Project. The PE Package must include an engineer's preliminary schedule and construction estimate and documentation showing approval of the plan by all stakeholders impacted by the proposed Project, as appropriate. The Grantee will submit the PE Package to FRA for approval.

6.0 ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE

FRA has evaluated the actions covered in this grant in accordance with NEPA (NEPA; 42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.), other environmental statutes, related regulatory requirements, and FRA's NEPA implementing regulations (23 CFR part 771, Environmental Impact and Related Procedures). FRA

has determined that the actions funded under this grant for the preliminary engineering and compliance with NEPA and related laws and regulations are categorically excluded from detailed environmental review pursuant to 23 CFR 771.116 (c) (1), (3), (4), and (8). Categorical exclusions (CEs) are actions identified in an agency's NEPA implementing procedures that do not normally have a significant impact on the environment and therefore do not require either an environmental assessment (EA) or environmental impact statement (EIS). See 40 CFR 1508.4.

In analyzing the applicability of a CE, FRA also considered whether unusual circumstances are present that would warrant a more detailed environmental review through the preparation of an EA or EIS. In accordance with 23 CFR 771.116 (a) and (b), FRA has further concluded that no unusual circumstances exist with respect to development of preliminary engineering/NEPA documentation funded under this grant that might trigger the need for a more detailed environmental review.

7.0 PROJECT COORDINATION

The Grantee will perform all tasks required for the Project through a coordinated process, which will involve affected railroad owners, operators, state government agencies, and funding partners, including:

- UP
- City of Harlingen, TX
- FRA

8.0 PROJECT MANAGEMENT

The Grantee is responsible for facilitating the coordination of all activities necessary for implementation of the Project. Upon award of the Project, the Grantee will monitor and evaluate the Project's progress through regular progress meetings scheduled throughout the Project's duration. The Grantee will:

- Participate in a project kickoff meeting with FRA
- Complete necessary steps to hire a qualified consultant/contractor to perform required Project work
- Hold regularly scheduled Project meetings with FRA, as appropriate
- Inspect and approve work as it is completed
- Review and approve invoices as appropriate for completed work
- Perform Project close-out audit to ensure contractual compliance and issue close-out report
- Submit to FRA all required Project deliverables and documentation on-time and according to schedule, including periodic receipts and invoices
- Comply with all FRA Project reporting requirements, including, but not limited to:
 - a. Status of project by task breakdown and percent complete
 - b. Changes and reason for changes in updated Detailed Project Work Plan, Budget, and/or Schedule
 - c. Description of unanticipated problems and any resolution since the immediately preceding progress report
 - d. Summary of work scheduled for the next reporting period
- Read and understand the Terms and Conditions of this Agreement

AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

THIS AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (CONTRACT NO. 2019C07223) (the "Amendment") is made and entered into effective as of the ___ day of November 2022, by and between the CAMERON COUNTY REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY (the "CCRMA"), a political subdivision of the State of Texas, and CAMERON COUNTY, TEXAS (the "County"), (collectively, the "Parties").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that certain Interlocal Agreement (Contract No. 2019C07223) dated June 10, 2019 (the "Interlocal Agreement") in order for the County to utilize an electronic toll collection system that employs transponder devices to collect the tolls ("ETC Systems") similar to those deployed by the CCRMA; and,

WHEREAS, the CCRMA, independently and by and through the services provided by vendors and consultants (referred to herein, collectively, as the "Tolling Consultants"), has the expertise and back office resources required to provide toll collection software and equipment, toll collection processing, toll systems implementation services, and toll systems maintenance services in connection with toll projects; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to utilize The Revenue Markets, Inc. to serve as the Tolling Consultant in connection with the acquisition and installation of toll collection software and equipment, the provision of toll systems implementation and maintenance services, and toll collection processing services related to operations of the Cameron County International Toll Bridge System and the Cameron County Parks User Fee System, *i.e.*, governmental functions and services and administrative functions as those terms are defined in Tex. Gov't Code § 791.003 and the purchase of goods and services under Tex. Gov't Code § 791.025; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties agree that the Agreement and the Amendment authorizes the purchase of goods and services reasonably required for the installation, operation, or maintenance of the goods required under the Agreement, and the Amendment, and that any purchase of goods and services under this Agreement and the Amendment satisfies the requirement of the local government to seek formal procurement for such purchase in accordance with Tex. Gov't Code § 791.025; and,

WHEREAS, the County properly and legally procured these services from The Revenue Markets, Inc., and both Parties agree to comply with applicable purchasing statutes and procedures to the extent applicable given the Parties' agreement under Tex. Gov't Code § 791.025;

NOW, **THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree, as follows:

Recitals. The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein for all purposes and are found by the Parties to be true and correct. It is further found and determined that the Parties have authorized and approved the Agreement by resolution or order adopted by the CCRMA's Board of Directors and the County's Commissioners Court, and that this Amendment will be in full force and effect when approved by each party.

II.

Designation of Tolling Consultant. The Parties hereby agree that The Revenue Markets, Inc. shall serve as the Tolling Consultant for the Cameron County International Toll Bridge System and the Cameron County Parks User Fee System.

III.

All other terms of the Agreement shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.
