The \$5M professional liability insurance is a requirement for the prime. If the subs carry less, that is up to the prime, but the prime is responsible for indemnifying the CCRMA for any negligence by the prime's subs so it's in the prime's interest to require as much as possible from their subs.

Typically, a GEC provides oversight of PS&E rather than preparing PS&E. a. Are GEC projects where we provided PS&E OVERSIGHT (rather than design) acceptable? b. If not, can we include PS&E projects, which were NOT performed as a GEC?	a. Yes
3	RFQ 2024-002 Main Document	5.0 Eligibility Requirements- Certification of Eligibility		Yes, all team members should have a Unique Entity ID (SAM.GOV) number. As per the RFQ, the prime and subconsultant must complete the certification attached as Appendix D and certify that they are not currently suspended, debarred, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participating in covered transactions by any Federal department or agency, including TxDOT as the State agency. CCRMA will further confirm through the Federal Government system of award management (SAM) and the Texas Comptroller the representations made on certifications are accurate. A Unique Entity ID is required under Appendix D to verify on SAM.GOV and the Taxpayer/EIN is required to verify with the Texas Comptroller.
